Demons post win in opener

After months of squaring off with one another, the newcomer-laden Northwestern State men’s basketball team was only too happy to see someone else as an opponent.

Playing the first game of the Rick Cabrera era, the Demons unleashed a stifling defense that turned into efficient offense as they rolled past visiting Dallas Christian, 101-54, inside Prather Coliseum.

“One thing I’ll say about having 14 new guys, these young men like each other,” Cabrera said. “They have their moments of adversity in practice and games, but they like each other.

That was a concern of mine, because they’re new. It’s my job to keep them liking each other and continuing to do that between the lines.”

The Demons’ chemistry Monday night was matched only by their depth.

Cabrera played 13 players, all of whom were on the floor for at least nine minutes. Northwestern State (1-0) saw 12 of those players – all newcomers – score, including four in double figures.

Jimel Lane led Northwestern State with 19 points while freshman Ryan Forrest (17), Duane Posey (12) and Chase

Forte (11) also reached double figures.

Lane connected on all seven of his shots from the field, including a trio of first-half 3-pointers as NSU built a 43-point lead at the break en route to its highest-scoring season opener since beating Centenary 102-62 in 2018.

“It was fun,” said Lane, who added a game-high three blocks and had three of NSU’s 17 steals. “We practice against each other every day and make each other better. It was just good to play against someone else and be able to beat up on someone else.”

LSU opens with win at home

Will Baker recorded a career-high 29 points in the 106-60 victory over Mississippi Valley State Monday night at the Pete Maravich Assembly Center. The win marks the tenth consecutive season-opening victory for LSU and the first 100-point scoring game since 2021.

LSU (1-0) will host their second game this week at 7 p.m. on Friday, Nov. 10 versus Nicholls. Tickets are available at [LSUtix.net](https://lsutix.net).

Will Baker finished the game shooting 10-of-11 from the floor, added a pair of 3-point field goals, and was 7-of-8 at the free-throw line in the 2023-24 season debut.

Baker, who scored 21 points in the first half, also pulled down five rebounds and had one assist and one block.

Jordan Wright knocked in 12 points and had a game-high four steals, while Daimion Collins and Tyrell Ward each contributed 11 points.

Rayquan Brown led Mississippi Valley State (0-1) with 17 points, and Arecko Gipson and Donovan Sanders followed with 15 and 13 points, respectively.

Overall, LSU shot 57.6 percent from the floor (34-of-59) and 53.6 percent from 3-point range (14-of-26). The Tigers held the Delta Devils to a 38.2 field goal percentage and forced 22 turnovers that they converted into 35 points. LSU had 12 steals in the game and outscored Mississippi Valley State 20-9 in fastbreak points.

LSU got off to a fast start as they led Mississippi Valley State 9-2 behind a 6-0 run and increased its margin to 26-9 with 11:12 on the clock in the first half. The Delta Devils trimmed the Tigers lead down to 10 at 28-18, highlighted by a 7-0 run, but LSU elevated its intensity and went into the half with a 56-29 lead. Monday marked 93 consecutive wins for LSU when leading by 20 or more points at halftime since 1966-67.

The Tigers’ defense held Mississippi Valley State to 1-of-5 shooting to open the second half and kept its offensive pace by making six of their first 10 attempts to balloon the score to 72-34 at the 15:25 mark. The Tigers grew their lead to as many as 53 points as they cruised to the 106-60 victory.

Mango collects five tackles

Southwest Oklahoma State was held scoreless on Senior Day in a 56-0 loss to Henderson State. The Reddies entered the day receiving votes in the

AFCA Division II National Poll.

Delta Charter alum Freddie Mango totaled five tackles.

The Reddie defense limited

the Bulldogs to just 117 yards of total offense in the game and had the Bulldogs playing from their side of the 50-yard line nearly the entire way.

LSU’s 2023 baseball team will receive its National Championship rings on Saturday in a special ceremony to be held at 4:30 p.m. CT in the Pete Maravich Assembly Center prior to the LSU-Florida football game.

Beginning at 4 p.m. CT, the 2023 National Champions will walk down Victory Hill, onto

North Stadium Drive and into the Maravich Center, and the Ring Ceremony will begin at 4:30 p.m. CT.

All fans are invited to attend the National Champions Ring Ceremony in the Maravich Center free of charge.

Directed by 2023 National Coach of the Year Jay Johnson, LSU won its seventh NCAA

National Championship on June 26 with a resounding 18-4 victory over Florida in Game 3 of the College World Series Finals in Omaha, Neb.

LSU was the nation’s consensus No. 1 team for the first 12 weeks of the regular season, and the Tigers finished the year at the pinnacle of college baseball.

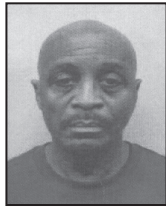
