back Alvin Kamara, had arguably the best team in Hutchinson football history posted the highest final national ranking in team history.

The 2019 Blue Dragons finished the season 10-2 after a Salt City Bowl victory over Monroe College and finished No. 3 in Monday's final NJCAA Rankings.

The No. 3 finish was one slot

higher than the 2014 Blue Dragons finish at No. 4 after an 11-1 Jayhawk Conference championship season.

The 2019 Blue Dragons lost two games by a total of three points in playing the toughest schedule in school history. That schedule featured seven ranked opponents. Hutchinson went 5-2 in those games and defeated the No. 2 team in the nation twice.

Former Hutchinson head coach Rion Rhoades accepted the line-backing coaching job at Arkansas under new Razorback head coach Sam Pittman, who served as head coach at Hutchinson in 1992 and '93.

Illinois lost to California 35-20 in the Redbox Bowl last year to finish 6-7 on the season. It was the Illini's first bowl game since 2014.

"I'm excited about getting back into major college football," said Davis, who played and coached at Arkansas. "The Big 10 is going to be different than the SEC, but I'm looking forward to it. I've got some friends who now coach at Michigan. Illinois has great players and a great coaching staff. This is a big-time move for me and I am going to make the best of it."

On a night when Northwestern State survived 28 turnovers, avoiding No. 29 led to the game-winning play Wednesday in Stopher Gymnasium.

Freshman Nikos Chougkaz recovered a lost ball near the top of the key, tossing the ball to junior Chudier Bile as Bile buried a 3-pointer at the buzzer to lift NSU to a 73-72 win at Nicholls.

Bile raced across midcourt,

arms outstretched, followed by a host of Demons as NSU (7-9, 4-3 Southland Conference) knocked off the SLC-leading Colonels (11-7, 5-2 SLC) for the first time in five tries.

"I saw Nikos push the ball, and my man went to help. I spotted up, he passed me the ball and it went in," said Bile, who had made just 3-of-12 before the buzzer-beater and had eight

turnovers with five assists. "This gives us a lot of confidence coming in here and beating the number one team at home, and now we're 4-3 in conference."

The game featured wild swings of momentum that had NSU rushing out to a 16-point lead in the first half. Nicholls erased an NSU 13-point lead and led by five early in the second half.

"This is the toughest and hard-

est that we've played in several years," said NSU coach Mike McConathy, whose Demons snapped a four-game Nicholls winning streak in the series. "We made a lot of mistakes, but we competed and outrebounded them (by 28).

"We continued to fight through it. We were up 16, we were down by five, up by 10, then we were down. But we came back."

The LDEQ, Office of Environmental Services, is accepting written comments on a draft Louisiana Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (LPDES) permit prepared for the Town of Clayton, Town of Clayton Wastewater Treatment Plant, P. O. Box 277, Clayton, LA 71326. The facility is located on the southern end of Loomis Street within the limits of the Town of Clayton, Concordia Parish. Upon the effective date of the final permit, the LPDES permit shall replace the previously issued LPDES permit.

The principal discharge from this existing source is made into a parish drainage ditch, thence into Kimball Bayou, waters of the state classified for primary contact recreation, secondary contact recreation, and propagation of fish and wildlife. Under the SIC Code 4952, the applicant proposes to discharge treated sanitary wastewater from a publicly owned treatment works serving the Town of Clayton.

During the preparation of this permit, it has been determined that the discharge will have no adverse impact on the existing uses of the receiving waterbody. As with any discharge, however, some change in existing water quality may occur.

Louisiana Tech overcame foul trouble and uncharacteristic turnovers to be up by one with four seconds to go, but North Texas hit a running floater at the buzzer to take the 51-50 victory on Saturday inside the Thomas Assembly Center on Karl Malone Court.

LA Tech (13-5, 4-2 C-USA) dug itself a big hole, committing 12 turnovers in the first half which put the Bulldogs down nine at the break.

However, they locked down North Texas (11-8, 5-1 C-USA) in the second half and ended up having a 50-49 lead after a driving layup by Amorie Archibald with five seconds remaining.

After the missed free throw on the and-one opportunity, the Bulldogs still had two fouls to give and were able to run some time off the clock by using them. Then Javion Hamlet received the in-bounds pass with four seconds remaining and ended up making just his second field goal of the game.

Despite it taking several minutes for the referees to review the play, they ultimately decided that the basket was good before the clock expired.

"We got off to a poor start," said head coach Eric Konkol. "We scratched and clawed and did everything we could to dig ourselves out of a hole."

The Village Of Ridgecrest Water System is currently in violation of the maximum contaminant level (MCL) for total trihalomethanes as set forth by the State [PartXII] of the Louisiana State Sanitary Code (LAC 51:XII)] and the Federal Primary Drinking Water Regulations (40 CFR P art 141).

The United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the Louisiana Department of Health and Hospitals (LDHH) set drinking water standards and requires the disinfection of drinking water. Where disinfection is used in the treatment of drinking water, disinfectants combine with naturally occurring organic and inorganic matter present matter present in water to form chemicals called disinfection by-products (DBPs). EPA and LDHH set standards for controlling the levels of disinfectants and DBPs in drinking water, including trihalomethanes (THMs) and haloacetic acid (HAAs). Some people who drink water containing THMs in excess of the MCL over many years may experience problems with their liver, kidneys, or central nervous system, and may have an increased risk of getting cancer.

In December 1998, EPA set enforceable drinking water standards for TTHMs at 80

parts per billion (PPB) and for HAA5 AT 60 parts per billion (ppb) to reduce the risk of cancer or other adverse health effects. Compliance with the TTHMs and HAA5 standard for public water systems serving less than 10,000 individuals initially became effective and enforceable January 1, 2004. Compliance with the TTHMs standard is determined by calculating a locational running annual average (LRAA) of quarterly TTHMs sample results. Compliance calculations performed for the fourth quarter of 2019 show that the system's current TTHMs LRAA is 81 ppb at DBP02-119 Cottonwood Drive and 94 ppb at DBP03 – 800 Ferriday Drive; thus, the system is currently in violation of the TTHMs standard.

Please share this information with all the other people who drink this water, especially those who may not have received this notice directly (for example, people in apartments, nursing homes, schools and businesses). You can do this by posting this notice in a public place or distributing copies by hand or mail.

This is not an emergency. If it had been, you would have been notified immediately. EPA and LDHH do not consider this violation to have any serious adverse health effects on human health as a result of short-term exposure; however, continued long-term exposure to TTHMs and HAA5 levels above the standard (e.g., 20 years of exposure) has the potential to have serious adverse effects on human health.

"District"), levy a tax of six and ninety-four hundredths (6.94)mills on all of the property subject to taxation in the District (an estimated \$603,780 reasonably expected at this time to be collected from the levy of the tax for an entire year), for a period of ten (10) years, beginning with the year 2021 and ending with the year 2030, for the purpose of acquiring, constructing, improving, maintaining and or operating fire protection facilities and equipment in and for the District, including the payment of all related personnel costs and the costs of obtaining water for fire protection purposes?

There was found by said count and canvass that there was a total of **1,487** votes cast **IN FAVOR OF** the Proposition and a total of **988** votes cast **AGAINST** the Proposition, as hereinabove set forth, and it was further found and determined that there was a majority of **499** votes cast **IN FAVOR OF** the Proposition as hereinabove set forth.

Therefore, the Governing Authority did declare and proclaim and does hereby declare and proclaim in open and public session that the Proposition as hereinabove set forth was duly **CARRIED** by a majority of the votes cast by the qualified electors voting at the said special election held in the District on Saturday, November 16, 2019.
