LSU gymnasts outscore Arkansas

BATON ROUGE – In front of the eighth-largest crowd in school history, the fifth-ranked LSU gymnastics team totaled another strong score of 197.125 to defeat No. 14 Arkansas, Friday night inside the Maravich Center.

More than 12,000 fans packed the PMAC to watch the Fighting Tigers improve to 11-2 and 5-2 in the Southeastern Conference. LSU responded to a new lineup on four every apparatus as the squad dealt with illness and injury.

"The reshuffling of the lineup impacted us a little bit tonight," D-D Breaux said. "There was still a lot of polish and some good landings tonight. We had a lot of career highs tonight, which shows that we're progressing in the right direction."

LSU will compete two more times in the regular season. The team will take on TWU in Fort Worth at 7 p.m. CT Friday then return

to the Maravich Center for one final meet on Friday, March 13.

LSU struggled to find its landings in the opening rotation but still scored a 49.100 to take an early lead.

Freshman Maddie Rau scored a 9.80 and junior Sami Dumate earned a 9.775 as both matched their career highs. Senior Ruby Harrold claimed her fourth vault title with the score of 9.875. Freshman Kiya Johnson and senior Kennedy Edney scored a 9.825 to complete the first rotation.

Career Highs for the Tigers on Bars

The bars lineup settled in and scored a season high 49.525 to extend the lead at the halfway point. Johnson captured her second career bars title in the opening spot with a career high for a 9.95. Junior Bridget Dean followed in the second spot with a 9.90 to also match her career high. Freshman Alyona

Schennikova scored a 9.825 in the third spot and Durante followed with a 9.875. Edney put up a 9.925 to set a season high and Harrold ended the rotation with a 9.875.

Junior Christina Desiderio started off the third rotation strong with a 9.80 and she was followed by Dean who earned a 9.85. Shchennikova made her debut on the event and earned a 9.825.

Edney scored a 9.875 in the fifth spot and junior Reagan Campbell tied her career high with a 9.975 in the anchor spot for the title.

Tech's Hasler signs with Arizona

RUSTON – Louisiana Tech alum Kent Hasler has been signed by his hometown team, the Arizona Diamondbacks, ahead of the 2020 baseball season.

Hasler, a former Bulldog closer who graduated in 2018, most recently pitched for the Lake Erie Crushers of the Frontier League. The Arizona-native posted a 2.01 ERA in 38 appearances out of the bullpen. He struck out 89 batters in 67 innings pitched for a K/9 of 11.96.

"We are so proud of Kent," said LA Tech head coach Lane Burroughs. "He epitomizes what it means to be a Bulldog. That young man has absolutely worked his tail off for this opportunity. He has busted it every day as our graduate manager and the last two summers in Independent ball. If anyone deserves this chance, it's Kent Hasler."

Hasler posted a career ERA of 3.63 while at Louisiana Tech and earned 11 saves after moving to the bullpen midway through his junior year. He struck out 82 bat-

ters across 84.1 innings of work and finished with a career record of 8-5. Hasler was a two-time member of the C-USA All-Academic Team.

"Ever since I first played for Tech, the coaching staff and players have always had my back and supported me every step of the way," said Hasler. "When I shared the news of signing with the Diamondbacks, the coaches were ecstatic. They have seen first-hand the effort I have put in, and they are excited to see the hard work pay off. I am grateful for my time at Tech and that I have been able to give back to such a strong program."

Before coming to Tech, Hasler was an NJCAA all-American at Mesa CC. He posted a 9-1 record and 1.93 ERA in 102.1 innings as a sophomore.

Hasler registered a 106/29 strikeout-to-walk ratio, striking out over a batter an inning for the Thunderbirds.

Hasler had been serving as a graduate manager for the 2020 Bulldogs prior to signing with the

Williams top freshman

Cobe Williams' near double-double performance this past Thursday earned him Conference USA Freshman of the Week honors, the league announced on Monday.

The freshman provided quality minutes in the matchup at WKU, shooting 5-of-8 from the field for 63 percent, including two three-pointers, in route to a career-high 13 points.

The 5-foot-11 guard also recorded a career-high nine rebounds (eight defensive) which was one short of a game high.

Williams has increased his playing time as the season has gone on. Over the last three

games, he is averaging 23.7 minutes while shooting 53 percent from the field and 63 percent from beyond the arc.

This is the first C-USA weekly honor for Williams and the first for any Bulldog this season.

LA Tech has its final two games of the regular season this week at home, starting on Wednesday, March 4 against FIU. Tipoff is set for 6:30 p.m.

Said special election will be held at each and every polling place in the Concordia Parish, which polls will open at seven o'clock (7:00) a.m. and close at eight o'clock (8:00) p.m., in accordance with the provisions of La. R.S. 18:541.

The polling places at the precincts in the Parish are hereby designated as the polling places at which to hold the said election and the Commissioners-in-Charge and Commissioners, respectively shall be those persons designated according to law.

The estimated cost of this election as determined by the Secretary of State based upon the provisions of Chapter 8-A of Title 18 and actual costs of similar elections is \$28,000.

The said special election will be held in accordance with the applicable provisions of Chapter 5 Chapter 6-A and Chapter 6-B of Title 18 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, as amended, and other constitutional and statutory authority, and the officers appointed to hold the said election, as provided in this Notice of Special Election, or such substitutes therefor as may be selected and designated in accordance with La. The Police Jury of Concordia Parish met this day in regular session convened. There were present the following members:

1) The Pledge, Invocation, and Roll Call were conducted. A quorum was present.

2) A motion was made by Mr. Adams seconded by Ms. Allen to approve the January 27, 2020 minutes as mailed. Motion carried unanimously.

3) A motion was made by Mr. Probst seconded by Mr. Yearby to approve the February 4, 2020 special meeting minutes as mailed. Motion carried unanimously.

4) A motion was made by Mr. Probst seconded by Mr. Adams to ratify the purchase orders and bank statements. Motion carried unanimously.

5) Under Committee Discussion:

a. A motion was made by Mr. Probst seconded by Mr. Adams to approve the minutes of the Finance Committee meeting held January 24, 2020. Motion carried unanimously.

b. A motion was made by Ms. Allen seconded by Mr. Yearby to approve the Boards Committee meeting held January 29, 2020. Motion carried unanimously.

6) Projects of the Parish were next discussed.

Brushy Bayou – Much progress has been made to continue to complete Phase I. Additional soil borings are needed for the borrow pit area, tip elevations for the DOTD for the bridge location, and right of ways and easement from the respective land owner adjacent to the project. USACE is continue to work toward completing the necessary steps for the 404 and 408 permits. The next meeting is scheduled for February 19th at 9 am.

Courtroom Renovations – The bench seating is scheduled to be installed the first week of March. Audiovisual components are being installed during February. The tentative completion date is the second week of March.

Washington Heights – The project is moving forward despite weather conditions. Two out of three ponds have been dug, all pipes have been laid and manholes placed. The lift station will begin installation in the next week or so depending on weather conditions. A follow up discussion with Denmon stated they needed three good weeks of working conditions to complete the project.

Vidalia Canal – Work needed was discussed. Opportunities for grant funding to help with drainage are being sought.

Several payments and change orders were in need of approval for several ongoing projects.

I. A motion was made by Mr. Yearby seconded by Mr. Whittington to approve Change Order #2 for Wilmar Construction in the amount of \$2,145. Motion carried unanimously.

II. A motion was made by Mr. Probst seconded by Mr. Neal to approve Payment Application #4 to Wilmar Construction in the amount of \$19,917.00. Motion carried unanimously.

III. No action was needed on the Archeological Survey as the scope of work has changed.

IV. A motion was made by Mr. Neal seconded by Mr. Yearby to approve the payment for Task Order #1 to Rostan Solutions for DR4622 in the amount of \$18,687.77. Motion carried unanimously.

7) Ordinance violations of the Parish were next discussed. Each Juror was asked to bring forward any issues in their district. Mr. Whittington has several issues with home owners on Stephens Road. These issues include culverts being too small, lots need mowing and cleaning, and issues with parking on the shoulder. Mr. Whittington would provide the owners and addresses to Ms. Burley to send the proper notices. A motion was made by Mr. Whittington seconded by Mr. Probst to approve sending notices to the violators. Motion carried unanimously.

8) Under the Secretary / Treasurer's Report, Ms. Burley reviewed all of the upcoming meetings for attendance. Ms. Burley also informed the Jurors that the parish office and barn would be closed Monday, February 17th for President's day. She also addressed the Jurors with the oversight of Mardi Gras Tuesday being declared a state holiday but not recognized by the parish. A motion was made by Ms. Allen seconded by Mr. Yearby to amend the holiday schedule to include February 25th as a paid holiday to the parish staff. Motion carried unanimously.

9) A motion was made by Mr. Yearby seconded by Ms. Allen to approve the following occupational licenses:

Mr. Parker stated he could speak with his Juror to review these or request from the parish office. Also explained were the procedures in which the Juror must ratify the minutes as correct in which to publish to the public. Mr. Curry also asked if he could burn leaves piled in the ditches in Concordia Park. Mr. Guillory will work to get these cleaned out. Mr. Curry asked about obtaining copies of the minutes and agendas from boards that are submitted to the Jurors for review. These are obtained from the respective boards after ratifying at their own meetings and ultimately published in the paper.

Mr. Dunbar addressed the Jurors stating that repairs were made by Concordia Water District to a broken waterline on Westside area toward Leroy Williams. He further stated that Concordia Water District needed to be contacted to repair the road. Ms. Catherine Cartwright was present and serves on the Concordia Water Board. She stated that she was present during the broken waterline and would make the board aware of the repairs needed at their next meeting. There being no further discussion, a motion was made by Ms. Allen seconded by Mr. Adams to adjourn. Motion carried unanimously.
