NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION

Pursuant to the provisions of a resolution adopted by the Police Jury of the Parish of Franklin, State of Louisiana (the "Governing Authority"), acting as the governing authority of the Parish of Franklin, State of Louisiana (the "Parish"), on February 10, 2022, NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that a special election will be held within the Parish on SATURDAY, APRIL 30, 2022, and that at the said election there will be submitted to all registered voters in the Parish qualified and entitled to vote at the said election under the Constitution and Laws of the State of Louisiana and the Constitution of the United States, the following propositions, to-wit:

PROPOSITION NO. 1 OF 2 (SALES AND USE TAX RENEWAL)

Shall the Parish of Franklin, State of Louisiana (the "Parish"), under the provisions of law, be authorized to continue to levy and collect, a tax of one-half of one percent (1/2%) (the "Tax") (an estimated \$1,497,000 reasonably expected at this time to be collected from the levy of the tax for an entire year) upon the sale at retail, the use, the lease or rental, the consumption, and the storage for use or consumption, of tangible personal property and on sales of services in the Parish, all as defined by law, for an additional period of 5 years from and after December 1, 2023, with the proceeds of the Tax (after paying the reasonable and necessary expenses of collecting and administering the Tax), to be dedicated and used for the purpose of solid waste collection and disposal, with four percent (4%) of the annual proceeds of the Tax (and the proceeds of the 1/2% sales and use tax currently being levied) to be available to the Franklin Police Jury for its costs of administering the Tax, commencing the date this proposition is approved by the voters?

PROPOSITION NO. 2 OF 2 (MILLAGE CONTINUATION)

Shall the Parish of Franklin, State of Louisiana (the "Parish"), be authorized to continue to levy a four and twenty-seven hundredths (4.27) mills tax on all property subject to taxation in the Parish (an estimated \$475,300 reasonably expected at this time to be collected from the levy of the tax for an entire year), for a period of five (5) years, beginning with the year 2024 and ending with the year 2028, for the purpose of the purchasing, operating and maintaining of road equipment and for the purpose of salary adjustments for employees of the Parish, said millage to represent a one hundredths of a mill (.01) increase (due to reappraisal) over the 4.26 mills tax authorized to be levied through the year 2023 pursuant to an election held December 10, 2016?

Said special election will be held at each and every polling place in the Parish of Franklin, which polls will open at seven o'clock (7:00) a.m. and close at eight o'clock (8:00) p.m., in accordance with the provisions of La. R.S. 18:541.

The polling places at the precincts in the Parish are hereby designated as the polling places at which to hold the said election, and the Commissioners-in-Charge and Commissioners, respectively, shall be those persons designated according to law.

The estimated cost of this election as determined by the Secretary of State based upon the provisions of Chapter 8-A of Title 18 and actual costs of similar elections is \$22,000.

Notice is further given that a portion of the monies collected from the taxes described in the Propositions shall be remitted to certain state and statewide retirement systems in the manner required by law.

The said special election will be held in accordance with the applicable provisions of Chapter 5 and Chapter 6-A of Title 18 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, as amended, and other constitutional and statutory authority, and the officers appointed to hold the said election, as provided in this Notice of Special Election, or such substitutes therefor as may be selected and designated in accordance with La. R.S. 18:1287, will make due returns thereof to said Governing Authority, and NOTICE IS HEREBY FURTHER GIVEN that the Governing Authority will meet at its regular meeting place, the Police Jury Room of the Courthouse, 6558 Main Street, Winnsboro, Louisiana, on THURSDAY, MAY 12, 2022, at FIVE O'CLOCK (5:00) P.M., and shall then and there in open and public session proceed to examine and canvass the returns and declare the results of the said special election. The Franklin Parish Police Jury met in Regular Session on Thursday, February 10, 2022 at 5:00 P.M. in the Police Jury Meeting Room, Courthouse Building, located at 6558 Main Street, Winnsboro, LA 71295 with the following present: President James Harris, Chaplain Gary Peters, Juror Keiona Wesby (5:03 p.m.), Juror Howie Robinson, Juror Ricky Campbell, and Juror David DeBlieux. Vice President Leodis Norman was unable to attend.

President Harris called the meeting to order, followed by roll call. Juror Peters led the assembly in prayer and the pledge of allegiance. Campbell offered the motion to approve the agenda with corrections on items 15 and 16. 15 stating rescind culvert bid awards for 2022. Item 16 stating award culvert bids to the lowest responsible bidder as included in the jury packages. Peters seconded the motion. The agenda was approved.

President Harris opened the public hearing for the consideration of reducing the footage of Earl Fletcher Rd. to 1,365 ft.

President Harris asked for any public comments. The jury was informed that support to reduce the footage had been received by Judge James M. Stephens and Mr. Scott Fletcher.

Peters offered the motion to close the public hearing. Robinson seconded with all voting in agreement.

Campbell offered the motion to approve reducing the footage of Earl Fletcher Rd. to 1,365 ft. Peters seconded with all voting in agreement.

The motion to approve the minutes of the January 10, 2022 special meeting and the January 13, 2022 regular meeting was offered by Peters, seconded by Campbell and was passed.

Ms. Kelly Lafferty, Parish 4-H Agent, presented the monthly LSU Ag Center Update, which included information about the recent District Livestock Show and upcoming art contest and LEGO building competition. The jurors were given a copy of the Franklin 4-H Newsletter for January/February 2022.

The motion to approve the jury's continued support of the LSU Ag Center in the amount of \$2,500 per month was offered by Peters, seconded by Robinson and was unanimously passed.

Ms. Cinnamon Gooding provided the jury with the monthly update of the projects McManus Service Group/Engineering are currently working on. The jury was informed the 5 FEMA crews scheduled to come and look at the roads with the freeze damage will be postponed until the first week of March. Once their assessments are complete and they have all the parish's documentation FEMA will make a determination. Once the determination is given the jury can then decide if they would like to go out for bids for contractors to do some of the work and/or parish do some of the work. Reimbursements will go on from there.

Mr. Joey Ferrington was in attendance to discuss an ongoing drainage issue at the corner of Jackson Ln. and Willie Hill Rd. that is causing flooding which may inundate a home. The issue is caused by a canal that has not been dug out in years. Jury agreed to place this request on the schedule to have that canal dug out.

Peters offered the motion to adopt the amendment to Resolution 757 – Tax Renewal for Road Equipment/Salary Adj. and Sales Tax for Garbage Collection. Proposition 3 was removed (tax renewal for Parish Equipment). Campbell seconded the motion. The motion was passed.

The motion to approve the adoption of Resolution 758 – In support of the Main Street Economic Committee's DOTD Permit request for the replacement of the "Welcome to Franklin Parish" highway signs, was offered by Peters, seconded by Wesby and was unanimously passed.

Campbell offered the motion to approve placing the Parish Equipment Tax Renewal on the November 2022 election ballot. Peters seconded with all voting in agreement.

Peters offered the motion to approve the signing of the Louisiana State-Local Government Opioid Litigation Memorandum of Understanding. DeBlieux seconded. The motion passed.

The motion to approve the bid awards for the advertised parish surplus equipment as follows was offered by Peters, seconded by Campbell and was passed.

Robinson offered the motion to not surplus unit 89 (6 ft. disc) and keep it in the parish equipment inventory. DeBlieux seconded. The motion passed.

The motion to approve spreading the limestone for the Activity Center in the fall if equipment and manpower is available was offered by Peters, seconded by Robinson and was passed.

Campbell offered the motion to deny a request for the pairs to abandon parish property located in the Horace White Subdivision off of Patterson St. Robinson seconded the motion with all voting in agreement.

The jury discussed the request for a hardship culvert purchase and installation. Peters offered the motion to table a decision until more information can be obtained. DeBlieux seconded. The agenda item was tabled.

Peters offered the motion to approve Attorney, Mike Kramer, to begin the legal process for the non-compliant nuisance property, 124 Georgia Street Winnsboro, LA 71295. Wesby seconded with all voting in agreement.

The motion to approve the appointments of Beth Edwards, Lauren McFarland, Josh Armstrong, Roy Eley and Greg Ferrington to the Fire District 4 Board was offered by Campbell, seconded by DeBlieux and was passed.

The jury discussed repairs that were to have been made to a FD4 fire truck as an agreement between the parish and FD 4 for a water truck. Peters offered the motion to table a vote until more information concerning the repairs needed can be determined. Robinson seconded with all voting in agreement.

Campbell offered the motion to approve the appointment of Mr. Duce Madden to fill the vacant seat, left by the passing of Mr. Joe Erwin, on the Fire District 2 Board. Robinson seconded with all voting in agreement.

Peters offered the motion to approve the Blue Cross Bule Shield health insurance monthly premium for the April 2022 renewal quote in the amount of \$34,711.70. The jury will increase the employee portion for health insurance to an even \$30.00 per pay check. The jury will pay the remaining premium increase of \$41.28. Robinson seconded the motion with all voting in agreement.

A discussion was had about some issues that were brought to the jury's attention concerning the upkeep/maintenance of the Turkey Creek Recreation and RV Park. Wesby offered the motion for a verbal warning be issued to the supervisor advising of the apparent violations to the Turkey Creek Park Lease/Rental Agreement that is to be completed by every person who rents/leases a camp site, and to amend the Turkey Creek Park Lease/Rental Agreement to include that individuals can lease/rent camp sites for no more than 14 consecutive days at a time, with the exception of those who are utilizing camp sites as a temporary home base as required by employment (pipelines, utilities, etc.) and camp sites designated as long term. Campbell seconded the motion with all voting in agreement.

The motion to approve advertising for park mowing quotes was offered by Campbell, seconded by Robinson and was passed.

Jury reviewed the quote obtained by Juror Norman from Home Depot in the amount of \$11,110.51 for a fence to replace the storm damaged fence at the Nolan Norman Memorial Park. Juror Norman was to speak with the sheriff about the possibility of using inmate labor for the installation of the fence. However, Juror Norman was unable to attend. Therefore, the motion to submit the Home Depot quote to the insurance company was offered by Peters, seconded by Robinson and was passed. The fence was damaged February 2, 2021 due to the ice storm. Insurance company must have the fence quote and the reason for the delay in reporting prior to processing the payment.
