To allow for the relief of the waterways, a portion of the banks of both Young's Bayou and the Oliver Road Canal will be removed to allow water to flow into the proposed retention area.

Residents interested in temporarily housing a healthy dog or puppy can sign up using an online application found on the Ouachita Parish Animal Shelter's Facebook page.


Adoptable animals are listed on the shelter's Petango. Additional updates and information are available through the shelter's social media accounts.
