The Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town of Vidalia, Louisiana, met, in regular session, in the Town Hall Meeting Room on Tuesday, February 8, 2022,

There were also present: Piara Wilson, Municipal Clerk; Debra Moak, Municipal Accountant; George C. Murray, Jr., Municipal Attorney; Jay LaSyone, Municipal Manager; and members of the press.

The meeting was opened by the Mayor and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited by those present, followed by the invocation given by Alderwoman Demby.

A quorum being present, the Mayor declared the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town of Vidalia, Louisiana, to be duly convened, in regular session, as the governing authority of said municipality, and opened the meeting for the conduct

After being reviewed, the typed minutes of the regular meeting of January 11, 2022, were approved with no changes. The motion for approval of the minutes was made by Alderman Gardner, seconded by Alderwoman Demby, and unanimously carried.

The Mayor then opened the floor for public comments on current agenda items. There being no comments, the Mayor, noting that fact, closed the floor for public comments on current agenda items.

Agenda Item No. 1 was the presentation of the financial statement for December, 2021. The Mayor called on the Municipal Accountant, Debra Moak, CPA, who presented the financial statement. As customary, she began by explaining the various fund balances, which summaries included a comparison of actual expenses to budget expenses. The summary sheets, previously given to the Aldermen, were reviewed in detail, and she reported on the various positive and negative fund balances and indicated the net changes in the various funds through December 31, 2021. As usual, she reminded the Aldermen that those statements were provided to them in their meeting packet. Mrs. Moak then advised that the Town will begin working on the budget for fiscal year 2022-2023 beginning in March and would encourage the Aldermen to attend meetings so that they may understand the process and participate in the discussion. There being no further questions or comments, the Mayor thanked Mrs. Moak for her usual thorough presentation.

Agenda Item No. 2 was Board discussion and vote on approval of occupational license applications. The first application was by Condoleezzia Jones for "JEW-ELRY AVENUE STUDIO, LLC", at 1202 Palm Street. It was noted that it was a home business for handmade jewelry and accessories. There being no comments or requirements, on motion for approval by Alderman Gardner, seconded by Alderwoman Demby, and unanimously carried, the application was approved. The second application was by Warren Lane Merriett, Jr., for "VISIBLE CHANGES HAIR SALON" at 1507 Carter Street. There being no comments or questions, on motion for approval by Alderman Betts, seconded by Alderman Probst, and unanimously carried, the application was approved.

Agenda Item No. 3 was Board discussion and vote on approval of sign applications. The Mayor advised the Board that there were no applications this month.

Agenda Item No. 4 was presentation of Financial Audit for Town of Vidalia for fiscal year 2020-2021. The Mayor then recognized Debra and the Town staff for all of the very good work they did in helping the Auditors to compile the audit. He then turned the floor over to Mr. Scott Adams, CPA with Silas Simmons, LLP, to present the audit. Mr. Adams also thanked Debra and the Town staff for their help in compiling the audit and proceeded to go over the outline of the audit in some detail. He explained the audit procedure to the Board and outlined the responsibilities of his office. He ended by telling the Board that the audit was a very good audit which had no findings, indicating that there no problems with the audit. He complimented the Town and their staff for having such a good audit this year. There were no questions or comments following the presentation and the Mayor again thanked Mr. Adams and his staff for their fine work.

Agenda Item No. 5 was discussion regarding Mardi Gras parade. The Mayor introduced Mrs. Cassandra Lynch who spoke to the Board about the upcoming Mardi Gras Parade which will be February 26, beginning at 3:00 P.M. starting from the Upper Elementary School. The krewe sponsoring the parade is the Krewe of Vidal which goes back a number of years. She also gave a brief summary of the beginnings of the Krewe. She also thanked Mr. Tance Hughes and Mr. Jack McLemore, Jr. for their prior work in the formation of the krewe. At the end of her presentation, Mrs. Lynch reminded those present and the Town in general that the Town's participation is needed to make it a great parade. The Mayor then thanked Mrs. Lynch for her presentation and urged the entire community to assist in the parade.

Agenda Item No. 6 was Miss-Lou Fireworks. The Mayor then recognized Sabrina Dore' who spoke to the Board about the work that Miss-Lou Fireworks has done in the past with providing for the 4th of July and New Year's Eve Fireworks display. She stated that in the past, the Town of Vidalia and Natchez, each gave \$5,000.00 for the staging of those displays. She indicated that due to inflation and the current problems with the cost rising that it now costs a minimum of \$20,000.00 to put on those displays. She asked that the Town contribute \$10,000.00 to insure that the displays can be made. She then thanked the Mayor for allowing her to make her presentation

Agenda Item No.7 was Board approval to enter executive session to discuss personnel matter of Vidalia Police Department. The Mayor advised the Board of the need to enter into Executive Session to discuss personnel matter with the Vidalia Police Department and a motion to enter into Executive Session was made by Alderman Gardner, seconded by Alderwoman Demby, and unanimously carried. Mr. O'Neal introduced Mr. Bryant Young with Jordan, Kaiser & Sessions. Mr. Young is the engineer who is handling our paving projects. Mr. O'Neal presented the board with a proposed Town of Ferriday Cooperative Endeavor Agreement, which addresses the issue of repairs to the shoulders of Bateman Drive, the road in front of Ferriday Lower Elementary School. The Cooperative Endeavor Agreement states that the school board will make the repairs to the road, but the City of Ferriday will be responsible for maintaining the road. It was moved by Dr. Riley, seconded by Mrs. Forman and unanimously carried to approve the Cooperative Endeavor Agreement with the City of Ferriday.

Abstain

Mr. O'Neal reported on the appointment of professional personnel for ESSER facilities projects. From the Request for Proposal that was advertised in December, there was one construction management firm which submitted a proposal, Volkert, LLC, and there were two architectural design firms, Waycaster and Associates and M3A Architecture. Mr. O'Neal informed the board that the ESSER committee is recommending hiring both architectural firms because of the shortage of time for the project to be completed. It was moved by Mr. Carson, seconded by Mr. Raven and unanimously carried to hire both architectural firms along with Volkert, LLC, in order to do an assessment and come back to the ESSER com-

Dr. Riley asked Mr. O'Neal about the Vidalia High School project. Mr. O'Neal stated there was a change order needed at the Vidalia High School campus because when the project was put together we did not intend to pave the area just behind the cafeteria. Also, at some point we need to extend the parking by a few feet at CEC so our people will have a place to park. There is going to be a real problem with drainage there that we're going to have to address. It was moved by Mr. Raven, seconded by Mr. Carson and carried unanimously to approve the

There were no questions regarding the ESSER Academic Plan. It was moved by Mr. Pere, seconded by Mrs. Forman and unanimously carried to approve the

Superintendent Watson explained the Star Academy Pilot Program and the Cooperative Endeavor Agreement with the Governor's Office. This program targets at-risk students that we will incorporate with our Freshman Academy at Ferriday High School. There will be no cost to the school district or the high school. The Star Academy will help with hiring staff, providing instructional materials, desks, etc. In Louisiana, there are only five of these programs in existence. Our attorney is looking over the contract, and Supt. Watson asked for the board's approval pending the attorney's review. It was moved by Mr. Raven, seconded by Mrs. Forman and unanimously carried that upon legal review the Star Academy Cooperative Endeavor Agreement is approved.

There was discussion on getting bids for portable air filters for all schools with grades 6-12. This matter has been taken care of for grades Pre-K-5. We will use ESSER funds for the permanent filters, but we need to do something in the meantime since the permanent filters won't be in place until the next school year. It was moved by Mrs. Forman, seconded by Mr. Carson, and carried unanimously that Mr. O'Neal is to seek bids for the portable air filters. Bids will provide for a 10-15 day delivery period.

The following announcements were made by Superintendent Watson:

Just want to highlight some good news in Concordia Parish because we only seem to hear about bad news. Last year we started auditing our current courses in high school because we've been teaching the same courses for years. We,

some teachers, every counselor in Concordia Parish and I, had the opportunity to go Walker High School and talk with them. Today some administrators and counselors went back to talk with them about different courses we can offer the next school year. Mrs. Caviness will be sharing a pitch to all high school administrators about incorporating EA Gaming, which is creating games, into our entrepreneurship and marketing courses. We're not recreating a class, but enhancing a class that has something that is actually marketable.

On Feb 23, if you have a few minutes, come by CPA where we'll be having a version of "Shark Tank." In our version, the teachers will be presenting their ideas of things they would like for their school. I guess that makes me the shark, but instead of me making a plan for their school, the school will make a plan for me.

We met with all the lower elementary teachers a few months ago. One of the

things they said was "we never go anywhere to learn. We keep hearing you talk

about literacy, but we're only talking about it to each other." So if you notice a lot of lower elementary teachers out, they are having their opportunity to go talk with others about literacy. They also asked why they couldn't have tutoring for their little people, and now they are doing that across the district. Tomorrow morning at 9:30 we are having an academic kick-off rally at Ferriday High School. They have a theme this year, "Trojan Take Over." The kids say,

"It's a whole lot of Winning over here." The students acknowledge they have some problems at their school but they want to focus on change and overcoming those problems. This year started with 56 seniors not meeting the requirements to graduate. Right now we're at 27, and by the end of the month we hope to be Ms. Watson went to Monterey High School where Mrs. Hale showed her to the

"Old Ag Room." This is where students learned welding and carpentry skills. Right now Central Louisiana Community Technical College in Ferriday teaches classes in welding and the majority of their students are from Monterey. So I think we should make the welding classes available to the students again at the school. Ms. Watson was asked about the COVID numbers. She reported that the num-

bers are declining in Concordia Parish as well as surrounding parishes. We are at 33.3% as of Feb 7, 2022, but that is a decline.

It was moved by Mr. Carson, seconded by Mrs. Forman, and unanimously carried to adjourn at 7:10 p.m.
