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DECLARATION OF ELECTION RESULTS

Be it known and declared that the governing authority of the Parish of Franklin, State of Louisiana (the “Parish”), did meet in open and public session to examine the official certified tabulations of votes cast at the special election held in the Parish on Tuesday, November 3, 2020, and did examine and canvass the returns of the said election, there having been submitted at said election the following prop-ositions, to wit:

PROPOSITION NO. 1 OF 3
(MILLAGE RENEWAL)

Shall the Parish of Franklin, State of Louisiana (the “Parish”), levy a four and seven hundredths (4.07) mills tax on all property subject to taxation in the Parish (an estimated \$436,000 reasonably expected at this time to be collected from the levy of the tax for an entire year), for a period of five (5) years, beginning with the year 2023 and ending with the year 2027, for the purpose of operation and main-tenance of the Parish Courthouse?

PROPOSITION NO. 2 OF 3
(MILLAGE RENEWAL)

Shall the Parish of Franklin, State of Louisiana (the “Parish”), levy an eleven and seventeen hundredths (11.17) mills tax on all property subject to taxation in the Parish (an estimated \$1,196,589 reasonably expected at this time to be collect-ed from the levy of the tax for an entire year), for a period of five (5) years, beginning with the year 2023 and ending with the year 2027, for the purpose of construction, maintenance and operation of, and the purchase of equipment for, the drainage sys-tem in the Parish?

PROPOSITION NO. 3 OF 3
(MILLAGE RENEWAL)

Shall the Parish of Franklin, State of Louisiana (the “Parish”), levy an eight and twelve hundredths (8.12) mills tax on all property subject to taxation in the Parish (an estimated \$869,857 reasonably expected at this time to be collected from the levy of the tax for an entire year), for a period of five (5) years, beginning with the year 2023 and ending with the year 2027, for the purpose of maintaining, operating and purchasing Parish equipment?

There was found by said count and canvass that (i) there was a total of 4,243 votes cast IN FAVOR OF Proposition No. 1 and a total of 4,449 votes cast AGAINST Proposition No. 1, as hereinabove set forth, and that there was a majority of 206 votes cast AGAINST Proposition No. 1 as hereinabove set forth, (ii) there was a total of 4,434 votes cast IN FAVOR OF Proposition No. 2 and a total of 4,225 votes cast AGAINST Proposition No. 2, as hereinabove set forth, and that there was a majority of 209 votes cast IN FAVOR OF Proposition No. 2 as hereinabove set forth and (iii) there was a total of 4,197 votes cast IN FAVOR OF Proposition No. 3 and a total of 4,496 votes cast AGAINST Proposition No. 3, as hereinabove set forth, and that there was a majority of 299 votes cast AGAINST Proposition No. 3 as hereinabove set forth.

Therefore, it has been declared by the governing authority of the Parish that Proposition No. 1 as hereinabove set forth was duly DEFEATED by a majority of the votes cast by the qualified electors voting at the said special election, Propo-sition No. 2 as hereinabove set forth was duly CARRIED by a majority of the votes cast by the qualified electors voting at the said special election and Proposition No. 3 as hereinabove set forth was duly DEFEATED by a majority of the votes cast by the qualified electors voting at the said special election held in the Parish on Tuesday, November 3, 2020. Results by precinct are available from the Secretary-Treasurer of the governing authority of the Parish during regular business hours or via the Louisiana Secretary of State’s website (voterportal.sos.la.gov). The actual cost of the election as determined by the Louisiana Secretary of State in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 8-A of Title 18 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, as amended, is \$4,143.04.
