WHEREAS, during times when the water level of Bayou Bartholomew Cut-Off Loop ("Lake Bartholomew") is above flood stage, the wakes generated by vessels operating on said lake can cause extensive damage to the piers, docks, boathouses and other structures of lakeside WHEREAS, the establishment of a temporary speed limit and "no wake zone" on

portions of Lake Bartholomew when the water level of said lake is above flood stage will reduce the risk of damage to inundated lakeside properties and that the benefits thereof justify the minimum burden placed on the boating public during such times; WHEREAS, Flood Stage on Lake Bartholomew is 73.0' NAVD-88 and said Lake is

HOLIDAYS

The Ouachita Parish Police Jury will provide six (6) paid Holidays to a temporary worker paid for through a Staffing Agency. These Holidays will be New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, and Christmas Day. To qualify for these paid holidays, a temporary worker shall work an average minimum of 35 hours each week, or 1820 hours per year. Paid Holidays and Paid Time Off taken during a week will be included for the calculation of the 35 hours worked for qualification of paid holidays.

A temporary worker, paid by OPPJ, will become eligible for Paid Time Off (PTO) hours after working one (1) year, and working an average minimum of 35 hours per week, or 1820 hours per year. Upon attainment of the one year worked, a pro-rata PTO hours will be credited to the temporary worker according to the following schedule based on the one year anniversary date:

January 1 - March 31 - forty (40) hours of PTO April 1 – June 30 – thirty-two (32) hours of PTO July 1 - September 30 - twenty-four (24) hours of PTO

October 1 – December 31 – sixteen (16) hours of PTO

Each year thereafter, the temporary worker will be credited with forty (40) hours of PTO. PTO hours must be used by December 31^{st} of each year or the PTO will be forfeited. To continue to qualify for PTO hours, a temporary worker shall work an average minimum of 35 hours each week, or 1820 hours per year. Paid Holidays and Paid Time Off taken during a week will be included for the calculation of the 35 hours worked for qualification of PTO. Should a temporary worker discontinue being paid for by OPPJ, any unused PTO hours will be forfeited

at termination. Should the temporary worker be rehired by the Staffing Agency, and paid for by OPPJ, the one year working requirement for PTO restarts.

PTO can be used for personal days and for sick days. PTO must be approved in advance by the OPPJ Supervisor responsible for supervising the temporary worker. A request for Paid Time Off leave slip must be completed by the temporary worker and approved by the OPPJ Supervisor. The completed PTO leave slip must be attached to the temporary worker's timesheet for the

In an effort to provide support for critical systems, the Ouachita Parish Police Jury has implemented the following policy for after-hours support for critical systems. The Director of Information Systems will determine which positions require on-call responsibilities.

I. DEFINITIONS

After-Hours – Defined as 6:00pm – 7:00am Monday-Friday, and 12:00am – 11:59pm holidays and weekends.

Normal Business Hours - In general, this means 7:00 am - 6:00 pm Monday - Friday. Information Systems Director may reach alternative agreements with individual employees.

On-Call – Available after hours with a response time within 15 minutes of the initial notification

and staying within a 45-mile driving distance of Ouachita Parish in case on-site support is required. This includes work done while connected remotely from home or other locations, travel

time to parish, and work done on-site. The employee is not required to restrict their activities while on-call but the employee must remain free of the influence of alcohol or illegal drugs. In addition, the employee should not take any prescription drug that adversely affects their ability to safely and effectively perform their job duties. If an employee has a medical condition and has concerns about complying with this requirement, the employee should consult with the Human

Incident - Defined as the failure of a critical system, network device, application, database, hardware device, etc. which negatively impacts the stability, security or availability of an

Critical System - Any system that provides IT Services to a Public Safety entity.

Critical Agencies - Agencies with an after-hours need for information systems support services and agree to direct cost allocation for such services.

II. PROCEDURE

On-call Coverage On-call support will be on a weekly rotation basis. This allows for a fair balance of on-call duties, and continuity for outage coordination during the week.

Holiday Coverage

The on-call employee will provide on-call support on Ouachita Parish Police Jury approved Holidays.

Alerts and Incidents

On-call personnel will be alerted to outages requiring their attention by designated Critical Agencies. This notification can be a phone call, text message, or help desk ticket.

The on-call person has 15 minutes to respond to the initial notification. Failure to respond within 30 minutes on three separate occasions will result in disciplinary action

Employee Responsibilities

The on-call person is responsible for resolution or coordination of effort of the precipitating

event. To do so they will be required to have immediate access to a laptop, mobile phone and Internet connection (provided by OPPJ). They will also be required to be within 45 miles driving distance of Ouachita Parish in case on-site support is required. Employee must remain free of the influence of alcohol or illegal drugs. In addition, the employee should not take any prescription drug that adversely affects their ability to safely and effectively perform their job duties. If an employee has a medical condition and has concerns about complying with this requirement, the employee should consult with the Human Resources department. If they are unable to resolve the problem within a reasonable time frame, the on-call person is responsible for contacting vendors and/or co-workers for assistance.

OPPJ Responsibilities The Ouachita Parish Police Jury will provide mobile phone, MIFI Internet connection access,

VPN and a laptop enabling the person to respond to calls. The on-call compensation will be \$100.00 per week and the Director of Information Systems will review roles annually.

On-call Duty Trading Trading of on-call duty shifts is allowed, with approval from the Support Manager or Director of

The on-call person will maintain a log documenting any problems and resolutions.

Since work and activities of the on-call employees are dictated by the problems and system conditions that arise, the work and activity performed is consider overtime pay regardless of the employees hours worked for the week. Each call out will be a minimum of thirty minutes and will

Staff that participate in the on-call rotation and/or provide off-hours emergency response will be entitled to compensation on the following scale:

be a direct cost allocation to the department that calls the employee.

On-call and Incident Pay: \$125.00 per week for those expected to be on-call, as determined by the Information Systems Director. Holiday Pay: Additional \$50.00 per Ouachita Parish Police Jury approved Holiday weeks to be

Example: Employee works the week of July 4 Holiday. The employee's compensation for being on-call will be \$175.00. (\$125 on-call week + \$50 Holiday + OT pay for each incident).

Payment will be made as supplemental pay on bi-weekly paychecks.

If an Information Systems employee is not on-call but required to assist after hours with a critical incident, the employee will be compensated at overtime rate for the incident, at the Director of Information Systems' discretion and will be a direct cost allocation to the agencies initiating the call. The Director of Information Systems is excluded from this policy.
