Smiley spent most of fall camp excited about the prospects transfer tight ends David Fitzwater and Corey Smallwood brought to the Demons offense.

Through three games entering Saturday's 6 p.m. Southland Conference opener at Houston Baptist, the pair of juniors has delivered on that promise.

Fitzwater and Smallwood have combined for nine receptions, 170 yards and a pair of touchdowns. By comparison, Northwestern State tight ends caught 12 passes for 105 yards and one touchdown in the 2018 season.

"We knew what we were getting when we brought them here," Smiley said. "The one thing is they have both caught on (to the offense) quickly. Taking everything from June 30 to this point, they've done a good job.

"They've worked. They've learned. They've made plays when they've had the opportunity."

Both Fitzwater and Smallwood have a threecatch game that included a scoring grab.

Smallwood's came in his Demons' debut, snaring three passes for 71 yards and a go-ahead touchdown in the season opener at UT Martin. Smallwood leapt over a Skyhawks defensive back to ball despite a pass interference penalty on the play.

For two newcomers who spent the majority of fall camp battling for the starting spot, they have emerged as friendly competitors whose differing skill sets have allowed Smiley's offense to become more multiple.

"It's a friendly competition," Fitzwater said. "We each bring out the best in each other. We support each other when we're not in. We do our best to do our part and keep the other team on their toes."

Through three games, both Fitzwater and Smallwood have enjoyed a signature moment.

Two weeks after Smallwood's touchdown grab at UT Martin, Fitzwater found himself wide open in the end zone at LSU and hauled in a 26-yard touchdown pass from Shelton Eppler, pulling the Demons to within three points of the No. 4-ranked

Both Smallwood and Fitzwater were on the field for that play but neither were in a traditional tight end position as both flexed out to more traditional wide receiver alignments. Regardless, Smallwood was one of the first Demons to greet his fellow tight end after Fitzwater's first career touchdown.
