debt and issue not to exceed Five Million Dollars (\$5,000,000) Certificates of Indebtedness and/or anticipation Notes, Series 2020 (the "Certificates"), in the manner authorized and provided by the Act, as hereinafter provided, for the purposes of paying current general expenses of, and in anticipation of, the revenues of the Issuer and to the extent applicable, its subordinate entities, for the fiscal year ending 2021, said Certificates to mature not later than thirteen (13) months from the date of issuance and to bear interest at a rate or rates not to exceed six per centum (6%) per annum; and

WHEREAS, the Issuer desires to make formal application to the Louisiana State Bond Commission (the "SBC") for approval of the above described borrowing

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Police Jury, acting as the governing authority (the "Governing Authority") of the Issuer, that:

SECTION 1. State Bond Commission. Application is hereby made to the SBC, for approval of the Certificates. The Certificates shall be secured by and payable from a pledge of all revenues accruing to the General Fund (including transfers to the General Fund) of the Issuer for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2021.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 3, ARTICLE II OF THE COMPILED ORDINANCES OF OUACHITA PARISH GOVERNING "LIVESTOCK" TO REGULATE THE KEEPING OF LIVESTOCK IN RESIDENTIAL SUBDIVISIONS; AND, FURTHER PROVIDING WITH RESPECT THERETO.

ORDINANCE NO. 9332

WHEREAS, Ouachita Parish Animal Control has encountered repeated instances in which livestock, primarily horses, have been kept on small lots in residential subdivisions

WHEREAS, the presence of livestock on small lots in residential subdivisions where other residences are in close proximity creates a risk of odors, flies, vermin, undesirable run-off, and other conditions constituting a public nuisance;

WHEREAS, the keeping of livestock on small lots of property also creates undesirable conditions for said livestock; and,

WHEREAS, the Ouachita Parish Police Jury finds that the prohibition of the keeping of livestock on small lots in residential subdivisions is in the public interest;

NOW, THEREFORE:

BE IT ORDAINED by the Ouachita Parish Police Jury in legal and regular session that Chapter 3, Article II of the Compiled Ordinances of Ouachita Parish, Louisiana governing "Livestock" be, and hereby is, supplemented and amended as follows to prohibit the keeping of livestock on small lots in residential subdivisions in the unincorporated areas of Ouachita Parish,

"ARTICLE II. LIVESTOCK

Division 2. Livestock in Residential Subdivisions

Sec. 3-16. Prohibition, exception

It shall be unlawful for any person to keep, or allow the keeping of, livestock on any lot or parcel less than one (1) acre in size located within a residential subdivision in the

This prohibition shall not apply to the keeping of porcine breeds commonly recognized as pets; to equine breeds commonly recognized as miniatures; or to not more than two (2) immature ovine or caprine animals, so long as the conditions in which such animals are kept do not create a nuisance to neighboring properties or constitute cruel treatment of said

Sec. 3-17. Penalty, impoundment, and fees.

Persons found to be in violation of the above provision shall be subject to a fine of not more than \$200.00 per offense

If the owner of livestock kept in violation of this division fails to remove said livestock within 24 hours of the giving or posting of notice of violation by Ouachita Parish Animal Control or other officers, then Ouachita Parish Animal Control may impound the animals. To recover an animal from such impoundment, the owner or custodian shall pay an impoundment fee of one hundred dollars (\$100.00); a boarding fee of five dollars (\$5.00) for each day or portion thereof that the animal is impounded; and, any other expenses incurred by Ouachita Parish Animal Control for care of the animal, including but not limited to vaccinations, medications, and veterinary expenses. Such impoundment fees or expenses shall be in addition to any fine or court costs imposed as a penalty for the violation.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that the provisions of this Ordinance shall become
