LSU leads track team

Top seven NCAA Outdoor finishes by LSU this season put the Tigers front and center on this year's LSWA Track and Field honors list.

Also announced were the best times in both men's and women's track as compiled based on the top qualifying times list posted by the United States Track and Field and Cross Country Coaches Association.

On the men's side, Jaron Flournoy of LSU was named the Runner of the Year, while freshman star pole vaulter Mondo Duplantis of LSU was named the Field Athlete and Freshman of the Year. Tiger Tyler Terry was named the Newcomer of the Year for non-freshman first year Louisiana products.

Another freshman star for LSU, national sprint winner Sha'Carri Richardson doubled up as Runner and Freshman of the Year for the women with indoor titlist Jasmyn Steels of Northwestern State taking field athlete honors.

LSU Coach Dennis Shaver was named the coach of the year for both men and women after his men finished third indoors and seventh outdoors after winning the SEC Title for the first time since 1990. The Tiger women's team was third outdoors and had seven women combine for 10 first team All-America honors at the NCAA's.

Flournoy scored 16.5 points in the SEC outdoor meet to lead the LSU men to that title. He had season bests of 10.12 in the 100 meters and 20.09 in the 200 meters.

Duplantis in his one year at LSU set collegiate records in the both indoor and outdoor pole vault events, clearing 19-5 at the SEC indoor championships and 19-8.25 at the SEC outdoor championships. He won the NCAA Indoor title and was runner-up for the NCAA outdoor championship.

He is a finalist for the 2019 Bowerman award.

Terry, a first-year LSU track athlete after transferring from Hinds CC, scored 11 points as the SEC outdoor meet in helping the Tigers to the title. He placed sixth in the 200 and third in the 400 meters at that meet and anchored the 4x400 silver finish at both league indoor and outdoor meets.

On the women's side, LSU's Richardson set a collegiate record of 10.75 in the 100 meters to win the NCAA national title, a U20 world record. She set another U20 world mark when she ran 22.17 to finish second in the NCAA 200 meters. The Bowerman finalist was USTFCCCA Outdoor Track Athlete of the Year.

Julia Palin of LSU was the women's cross country freshman of the year, scoring in all six meets for the Tigers where she was the top finisher for LSU in five of the six meets.

NSU quarterback shines at Manning camp

Shelton Eppler's statistics during his first season as the Northwestern State quarterback put him among the nation's best FCS passers.

An invitation to the prestigious Manning Passing Academy helped solidify him as one of the top quarterbacks in the country, regardless of the level of competition.

So when Eppler found himself in Thibodaux for three days this past week, he had one idea.

"I wanted to be like a vacuum, getting all the knowledge I could from the Mannings to the other quarterbacks to high school kids – you can learn from them, too," he said. "It was an awesome experience, and I'm glad I got the chance to go there and learn."

The Manning Passing Academy has been in existence for more than 20 years, tutoring the best passers in the country along the bayou in south Louisiana.

While Eppler said he was not completely familiar with the academy going in, his position coach certainly was.

"I've worked it, and I've participated in it as a camper," NSU quarterbacks coach Anthony Scelfo said. "I've done it for a long time. My dad (Southeastern Louisiana head coach Frank Scelfo) was one of the coaches for the first year. Any time you get a chance to be around those guys and soak up what they know, the amount of football knowledge they have built up, it's pretty special. Plus, you have your peers from around the country, and you get to interact with them."

Eppler said he took plenty away from the Manning Passing Academy on and off the field, some of which made him take a step back and evaluate where he was.

"I think it was the second day we were there, we were eating dinner and you see (Archie, Peyton and Eli Manning) sitting at the next table over," he said. "It was like, 'How am I here now?' I loved every part of it. They're an amazing family. They were very genuine, and the class they showed was awesome."

Eppler threw for 2,693 yards in nine games as a junior and twice set Northwestern State's single-game touchdown pass record with six scoring tosses. His 474 passing yards in a 49-48 win at Lamar established a school single-game record. He was part of a heavy Southland Conference contingent at the MPA.

"It was awesome getting to connect with those

guys and see where they come from," he said. "Me, (Nicholls') Chase Fourcade, (Abilene Christian's) Luke Anthony, (Southeastern Louisiana's) Chason Virgil and (McNeese's) Cody Orgeron all got along. We still have a few rivalries here and there, but this weekend was about fun and learning from them and telling them we're going to get the best of them."

Interacting with other campers – familiar or unfamiliar – is a staple of the MPA.

"You're going to take things you like from other guys, so not only are you soaking it up from three of the best who have ever done it, but also some of the best quarterbacks in the country," Scelfo said. "You can't ask for a better three days of quarterback play than what you get down there."

Eppler soaked in and vacuumed up a great deal of knowledge of what a quarterback needs to do on and off the field.

Some of it pushed him out of his comfort zone – "I had never been under center, so taking a five-step drop was different" – but it ultimately should pay dividends for both himself and for Northwestern State.

The LDEQ, Office of Environmental Services, is accepting written comments on a draft Louisiana Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (LPDES) permit prepared for Concordia Parish Sewerage District #1, Ridgcrest Wastewater Treatment Plant, P.O. Box 823, Ferriday, LA 71334. The facility is located **at the end of Vidalia Dr. in Ferriday, Concordia Parish**. Upon the effective date of the final permit, the LPDES permit shall replace the previously issued LPDES permit.

The principal discharge from this existing source is made into an unnamed canal, thence into Red Bayou, thence into Bayou Cocodrie, waters of the state classified for secondary contact recreation and limited aquatic life and wildlife. Under the SIC Code 4952, the applicant proposes to discharge treated sanitary wastewater from a publicly owned treatment works serving the Town of Ridgcrest and areas not incorporated within the town.

During the preparation of this permit, it has been determined that the discharge will have no adverse impact on the existing uses of the receiving waterbody. As with any discharge, however, some change in existing water quality may occur.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE OPERATING BUDGET OF REVENUES AND EXPENSES FOR THE TOWN OF VIDALIA, LOUISIANA, FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2018-2019

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town of Vidalia, Louisiana, in regular session, duly convened as the governing authority of said municipality, that:

WHEREAS:

At this time there is a variance of greater than 5% in the general and special revenue funds and, therefore, pursuant to R.S. 39:1310 and R.S. 39:1311 it is necessary that the current annual budget be amended.

AND WHEREAS:

This proposed ordinance was previously introduced at the June 11, 2019 meeting of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen;

Due notice of the introduction of this proposed Ordinance was advertised in the official journal on the 19th day of June, 2019; and

A public hearing was held by the Board of Aldermen on the 25th day of June, 2019;

NOW THEREFORE, it is hereby declared and ordained that the attached Amendment of Revenues and Expenditures for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2019, institutes the following changes:

SPECIAL REVENUE FUNDS

The hydro royalty fund is expected to have approximately a 30% increase in net change in fund balance for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2019. Revenue is expected to exceed the original budget by \$1,331,830, but total expenditures and other financing uses are expected to be \$708,200 higher than the original budget. The net change in fund balance will create a \$623,630 increase.
