

LSU falls big to Auburn

Auburn scored 21 points off three LSU turnovers as the homestanding Tigers came away with a 48-11 victory on Saturday afternoon on The Plains.

With quarterback Myles Brennan against sidelined with an injury, LSU (2-3) turned to true freshmen TJ Finley and Max Johnson. Finley started the game and was 13-of-24 passing for 143 yards with two interceptions and a fumble that was returned for a touchdown. Johnson entered in the third quarter and finished the game 15-of-24 passing for 172 yards with a 43-yard touchdown pass to freshman wide receiver Kayshon Boutte in the fourth quarter.

LSU struggled to run the ball, managing only 32 net yards on 27 carries.

Auburn (4-2) was led by quarterback Bo Nix, who was 18-for-24 passing for 300 yards with three touchdowns including a 91-yard touchdown pass in the fourth quarter when the game was in-hand. Nix led Auburn with 81 rushing yards on 11 carries with a 5-yard scoring run in the third quarter. Anthony Schwartz had a game-high 123 yards including the long score, while Eli Stova had five catches for 64 yards with a touchdown.

LSU has an open date on Nov. 7 before playing host to Alabama on Nov. 14. Kickoff between the Tigers and Crimson Tide is set for 5 p.m. on CBS.

Auburn won the coin toss and deferred its decision until the second half.

Following a scoreless first quarter that included four punts, LSU placekicker Cole York missed a 54-yard field goal on the opening play of the second quarter to keep the scoreboard clean.

Nix' 38-yard screen pass to Eli Stove put the homestanding Tigers on LSU's side of the field at the 26. Two plays later, Nix connected with Seth Williams inside the LSU 5, where LSU's Derek Stingley Jr. stripped the ball at the 1 and saw the ball

roll out of bounds inside the end zone for a touch-back. The play was initially ruled a touchdown but overturned by video review.

Though LSU dodged that bullet, Finley overthrew Marshall on a second-and-9 pass and Auburn's Nehemiah Pritchett returned the intercepted pass 48 yards to the LSU 4.

After an Auburn penalty, Stove took a short pass from Nix, dodged a tackle and scored from the 9. Auburn led 7-0 with 12:13 remaining in the half.

On the ensuing drive, Finley and the Tigers converted a fourth-and-1 on the LSU side of the field by drawing Auburn offsides. LSU crossed midfield with a 12-yard pass to Jaray Jenkins, but couldn't advance past the Auburn 44 and punted into the end zone.

With another defensive stop by LSU, Auburn punted to the LSU 25 while leading 7-0. On third-and-6 from his 29, Finley stripped of the ball by Auburn's Derick Hall at the 20, where Christian Tutt recovered and ran for a touchdown.

Auburn led 14-0 with 5:27 remaining in the half. After gaining a first down with a short run by John Emery Jr., three-straight incomplete passes by Finley led to a Zach Von Rosenberg 54-yard punt that was downed at the Auburn 1.

Auburn escaped the shadow of its end zone with a 26-yard run around the right end by Tank Bigsby. Nix ran for 11 before passing 28-yards to Williams for a first down at the LSU 34. Four plays later, Nix found Ze'Vian Capers wide open in the left corner of the end zone for a 9-yard touchdown and a 21-0 lead. A 32-yard kickoff return by Trey Palmer helped LSU put points on the board in the final 33 seconds of the half. An 18-yard reception by Jenkins and 14 to Racey McMath setup a 50-yard field goal by York as time expired.

Louisiana Tech senior wide receiver Adrian Hardy was named an honorable mention for The Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award National Player of the Week after helping lead the Bulldogs to a 37-34 comeback victory against UAB in double overtime.

Hardy had seven receptions for 101 yards and two touchdowns in the win over the Blazers. The native of Houston, Texas, caught a 24-yard touchdown pass from sophomore quarterback Aaron Allen which, after redshirt freshman kicker/punter Jacob Barnes kicked the extra point, tied the game at 31-

31 with 10 seconds left in regulation.

San Jose State QB Nick Starkel was named The Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award National Player of the Week for the weekend of Oct. 31.

The Pledge, Invocation, and Roll Call were conducted. A quorum was present.

1) A motion was made by Mr. Probst seconded by Mr. Yearby to approve the September 28, 2020 minutes as mailed. Motion carried unanimously.

2) A letter was received from the Town of Ferriday to use our side boom tractor. Mr. Parker stated he had talked with Mayor Turner and due to liability issues, we could not loan out our equipment. Rather the town would need to provide a scope of work and a hold harmless letter to have the parish complete the work and the town reimburse for time and materials.

3) A request to conduct a survey for Lake Concordia Weir had been received. Mr. Adams brought forward that Black River Lake had not had one conducted either. Mr. Parker stated the boards need to get a quote in which to proceed and allocate funds.

4) A request to appoint Mr. Jamie McCartney to the Lake St. John Waterworks Board was received after the resignation of Mr. Lynwood Wiley. A motion was made by Mr. Bachus seconded by Mr. Probst to approve the board appointment. Motion carried unanimously.

5) Under Committee Action and Reports, the following was discussed:
A) The Finance Committee had met to review the purchase orders and bank statements. A motion was made by Mr. Probst seconded by Mr. Bachus to approve the documents as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

6) Projects of the Parish were next discussed.
Brushy Bayou – Additional conference calls have been held to keep the project on track. Brant Jones with JKS is working on the final comments for DOTD. The stamped drawings were submitted to USACE. A conference call was held with FEMA and GOHSEP for questions on

The H&H study pertaining to the BCA. An addendum to the H&H study has been completed to show the positive effect the project would have in the Concordia Park area

Courtroom – Electrical components are on order to be installed to complete the project.
Washington Heights – The project is near completion. Handrails have been installed and culverts have been ordered for installation.
DR-4462 – A conference call was held with FEMA, GOHSEP, Rostan, and the parish to discuss the information still needed. An analysis of the road base for asphalt roads was needed. Pictures and information were gathered and submitted to satisfy the request.

Vidalia Canal – Mr. Adams had talked with a chemical consultant. Discussions of the vegetation contract was held. After speaking with Lary Graf who was awarded the vegetation contract, the understanding was to kill broadleaf grass along the banks. A different method was available for the aquatic grass. A motion was made by Mr. Yearby seconded by Mr. Edwards to reach out to Mr. Graf about treating the Vidalia Canal, Little Cross Bayou, and the Ridgecrest canal for aquatic grass.
Mr. William Saul was present and asked which parts of the Vidalia Canal were to be sprayed. Due to the type of chemicals used, these could not be used around residential dwellings to prevent damages to household flowers. Mr. Saul also asked for a plat of the Brushy Bayou Project to see how the Vidalia Canal and slough near his house would be affected.

Watershed Initiative – The upcoming regional meeting set for October 14, 2020 to discuss further developments.

CARES Act - Application for the third and final phase is being prepared. Applications must be submitted by October 15th.

7) Ordinance Violations of the Parish were next discussed. A motion was made by Mr. Neal seconded by Mr. Bachus and carried unanimously to cite the following:

Yearby – culvert crushed and needs replacing by owner at 115 Howard Road; property belongs to Kyle Cupit of 208 Spruce Street (Per Mr. Guillory a 15"x 20-foot culvert was needed.

Allen – Discussions were held with home owners of 241, 251, and 281 Doty Gardens Circle to clean up lots. If clean-up is not completed by the next meeting a formal letter will be requested. Property of Mr. Benjamin Williams of 282 Doty Garden Circle – no dumping; clean up needed

8) A motion was made by Mr. Adams seconded by Mr. Edwards and carried unanimously to approve the following occupation license:

No response to the letter or notification had been received by the parish office. Mr. Edwards asked that we keep Mr. Beasley in our thoughts with his upcoming medical procedures.

13) There being no further discussion, a motion was made by Ms. Allen seconded by Mr. Neal to adjourn. Motion carried unanimously.

PROPOSITION (SALES & USE TAX RENEWAL)

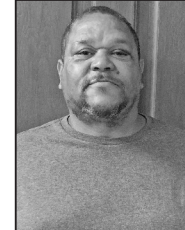
Shall the Parish School Board of the Parish of Concordia, State of Louisiana (the "School Board"), be authorized to continue to levy and collect a tax of one per cent (1%) (the "Tax"), upon the sale at retail, the use, the lease or rental, the consumption, and the storage for use or consumption, of tangible personal property and on sales of services in the Parish of Concordia (the "Parish"), all as defined by law (an estimated \$2,700,000 reasonably expected at this time to be collected from the levy of the Tax for an entire year), for a period of ten (10) years, beginning January 1, 2021, with sixty per cent (60%) of the net proceeds of the Tax to be used for support for curriculum improvement and for improving, purchasing and erecting school buildings and related facilities and for operating and maintaining schools and related facilities within the Parish, and the remaining forty per cent (40%) to be used to supplement the payment of salaries of public school teachers and other public school employees of the School Board, including the payment of unemployment compensation benefits and costs of retirement and insurance programs for active and retired School Board personnel?

There was found by said count and canvass that there was a total of 1,403 votes cast IN FAVOR OF the Proposition and a total of 341 votes cast AGAINST the Proposition n, as hereinabove set forth, and that there was a majority of 1,062 votes cast IN FAVOR OF the Proposition as hereinabove set forth. Therefore, it has been declared by the governing authority of the Parish that the proposition as hereinabove set forth was duly CARRIED by a majority of the votes cast by the qualified electors voting at the said special election held in the Parish on Saturday, August 15, 2020. Results by precinct are available from the Secretary of the Parish School Board during regular business hours or via the Louisiana Secretary of State's website (voterportal.sos.la.gov). The actual cost of the election as determined by the Louisiana Secretary of State in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 8-A of Title 18 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, as amended, is \$30,049.84.
