St. Jude's is pioneering a new gene therapy which has some success five of seven treated; however, is showing promise for the future in curing Severe Combined Immune Deficiency.

We are thrilled because both John and Adam Lewis have three hours of intravenous Gamma Globulin every three weeks. Adam is 20 and John, 22, both LSU students. This treatment has kept them going all their lives... just imagine how grateful our family is with the hope for a possible cure. Ainsley and Jason have always put the boys and their treatment first! Jonathan Hoggatt of Harvard Medical says we are "very close" to a permanent cure.

As Anne H. Nielson has written as an artist, author, and inspired spiritual person in her two great books, Angels in Our Midst and Strokes of Courage about the many angels we have around us. Recently I heard of a multi-talented person in our area who was "completely out of luck and cash! That very day, someone sent him a much needed check to give him a boost to get over the bump in his life! How proud we are of whomever you are! Many thanks for your generosity!




