## DECLARATION OF ELECTION RESULTS

Be it known and declared that the governing authority of the Parish of Franklin, State of Louisiana (the “Parish”), did meet in open and public session to examine the official certified tabulations of votes cast at the special election held in the Parish on Saturday, November 13, 2021, and did examine and canvass the returns of the said election, there having been submitted at said election the following propositions, to wit:

### PROPOSITION NO. 1 OF 2 (MILLAGE RENEWAL)

Shall the Parish of Franklin, State of Louisiana (the “Parish”), levy a four and seven hundredths (4.07) mills tax on all property subject to taxation in the Parish (an estimated \$436,000 reasonably expected at this time to be collected from the levy of the tax for an entire year), for a period of five (5) years, beginning with the year 2023 and ending with the year 2027, for the purpose of operation and maintenance of the Parish Courthouse?

### PROPOSITION NO. 2 OF 2 (MILLAGE RENEWAL)

Shall the Parish of Franklin, State of Louisiana (the “Parish”), levy an eight and twelve hundredths (8.12) mills tax on all property subject to taxation in the Parish (an estimated \$869,857 reasonably expected at this time to be collected from the levy of the tax for an entire year), for a period of five (5) years, beginning with the year 2023 and ending with the year 2027, for the purpose of maintaining, operating and purchasing Parish equipment?

There was found by said count and canvass that (i) there was a total of 686 votes cast IN FAVOR OF Proposition No. 1 and a total of 651 votes cast AGAINST Proposition No. 1, as hereinabove set forth, and that there was a majority of 35 votes cast IN FAVOR OF Proposition No. 1 as hereinabove set forth, and (ii) there was a total of 639 votes cast IN FAVOR OF Proposition No. 2 and a total of 683 votes cast AGAINST Proposition No. 2, as hereinabove set forth, and that there was a majority of 44 votes cast AGAINST Proposition No. 2 as hereinabove set forth. Therefore, it has been declared by the governing authority of the Parish that Proposition No. 1 as hereinabove set forth was duly CARRIED by a majority of the votes cast by the qualified electors voting at the said special election and Proposition No. 2 as hereinabove set forth was duly DEFEATED by a majority of the votes cast by the

qualified electors voting at the said special election held in the Parish on Saturday, November 13, 2021. Results by precinct are available from the Secretary-Treasurer of the Parish during regular business hours or via the Louisiana Secretary of State’s website (voterportal.sos.la.gov). The actual cost of the election as determined by the Louisiana Secretary of State in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 8-A of Title 18 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, as amended, is \$4,971.39.

## DECLARATION OF ELECTION RESULTS

Be it known and declared that I, Kevin Cobb, Sheriff of the Parish of Franklin, State of Louisiana (the “Sheriff”), and ex officio Chief Executive Officer of the Law Enforcement District of the Parish of Franklin, State of Louisiana (the “District”), did meet in open and public session to examine the official certified tabulations of votes cast at the special election held in the District on Saturday, April 24, 2021, and did examine and canvass the returns of the said election, there having been submitted at said election the following proposition, to wit:

### PROPOSITION (SALES TAX RENEWAL)

Shall the Law Enforcement District of the Parish of Franklin, State of Louisiana (the “District”), be authorized to levy and collect a tax of one-half of one percent (1/2%) (the “Tax”), (an estimated \$1,406,900 reasonably expected at this time to be collected from the levy of the tax for an entire year), for a period of five (5) years, commencing January 1, 2023, upon the sale at retail, the use, the lease or rental, the consumption, and storage for use or consumption, of tangible personal property and on sales of services in the District, all as defined by law, with the proceeds of the Tax (after paying the reasonable and necessary costs and expenses of collecting and administering the Tax) to be dedicated and used to pay costs of operating the Franklin Parish Sheriff’s Office, including the operation of the Franklin Parish Detention Center?

There was found by said count and canvass that there was a total of 1,032 votes cast IN FAVOR OF the Proposition and a total of 227 votes cast AGAINST the Proposition, as hereinabove set forth, and that there was a majority of 805 votes cast IN FAVOR OF the Proposition as hereinabove set forth. Therefore, it has been declared by the Sheriff that the proposition as hereinabove set forth was duly CAR-

RIED by a majority of the votes cast by the qualified electors voting at the said special election held in the District on Saturday, April 24, 2021. Results by precinct are available from the Sheriff during regular business hours or via the Louisiana Secretary of State’s website (voterportal.sos.la.gov). The actual cost of the election as determined by the Louisiana Secretary of State in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 8-A of Title 18 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, as amended, is \$30,795.85.
