Ms. Rider first asked Dr. Cooper if the agenda could be amended to include an action item. She noted that it would be action item number six regarding the hiring of Prentice Woods as Pest Control Worker L Dr. Cooper then asked for a motion to add action item number six to the agenda regarding the hiring of Prentice Woods as Pest Control Worker I. Dr. Pankey made a motion to amend the agenda to reflect the aforementioned motion. Mr. Handy seconded the motion. The motion was approved

A motion was made by Mr. Hill to approve the minutes of the March 2020 meeting; seconded by Dr.

Dr. Cooper then introduced the second action item on the agenda regarding the approval of the 2020 Amended Budget and the 2021 Proposed Budget. Ms. Rider then asked everyone to examine their packets in order to review with her the budgets as presented. Both 2020's Amended Budget and 2021's Proposed Budget reflect a millage rate of 1.4 mills with 2020's revenue showing decrease from its original amount of \$1,601,970 to its amended amount of \$1,578,325 while 2021 reflected an estimated increase back to \$1,626,000. However, the major difference in revenue for 2020 and 2021 occurs in interest earnings. Ms. Rider explained that the change in interest earnings occurred so late in the year for 2020 that the budget reflects only a small decrease of \$3,000.00 based on last year's estimate; however, next year's loss will be more significant reflecting a possible decrease of roughly \$29,000.00 in interest earnings bringing total revenues for 2020 to \$1,610,550 and the same of th and 2021 to \$1,629,725. For expenditures, Ms. Rider started with salary and benefits as that portion of the budget is one of the district's largest expenditures. Ms. Rider explained that the only true change reflected in that portion of the proposed budget was a 2.5% COLA increase with some smaller amendments in 2020's budgeted amounts for Medicare Employer % and Parochial Employee Retirement Employer % as well as an increase in Group Hospital Insurar % for 2021. Dr. Cooper then asked Mr. Cammack what the parish was doing as a whole as it relates to COLA. Mr. Cammack explained that the decision has not been made yet but looking at 1.5%. Further discussion ensued. Dr. Cooper then also asked a question of Mr. Cammack as it relates to millages, assessments, and tax collections. Further discussion ensued. Mr. Handy then asked Mr. Cammack a question regarding sales tax collections. Mr. Cammack explained that the parish's sales tax collections were up in 2020. Further discussion ensued. Mr. Handy then asked a question as it relates to revenues of Mr. Cammack. Further discussion ensued. Next, Ms. Rider explained

some of the expenditures as reflected in the 2020 amended and 2021 proposed budgets noting their being highlighted in yellow, and the reasons for those changes being namely due to not having performed those budgeted activities in 2020 due to the pandemic and our desire/need to keep office/property traffic to a minimum. Most of the activities were budgeted again for 2021 such as the painting of the building and parking lot repair. She then noted that Contractual Services was left flat for 2021 but could be amended in 2020 as it related to any potential post-Hurricane Delta work if needed. Ms. Rider then noted an increase in Lab Supplies due to the potential implantation of a new trapping system. Further discussion ensued. She also noted that chemicals had been left flat for 2021 and that 2020 could be amended should the board feel it necessary. Further discussion ensued. Lastly, she pointed out the amendments in Acquisition of Vehicles and Purchase of Equipment as it relates to 2020, and the lack of activity in those line items in 2020 due to the pandemic plus the changes to those same line items in 2021. Ordinances, City of West Monroe, Louisiana, is hereby enacted, to read as follows:

Monroe, Louisiana, in regular and legal session convened, that Section 11-2003.5 of the Code of

"Sec. 11-2003.5. - Battery of emergency room personnel, emergency services personnel, or a healthcare professional

(1) Battery of emergency room personnel, emergency services personnel, or a healthcare professional is battery committed without the consent of the victim when the offender has reasonable grounds to believe that the victim is emergency room personnel, emergency services personnel, or a healthcare professional acting in the performance of his employment

> (2) The use of force of violence upon the person of emergency room personnel, emergency services personnel, or a healthcare professional by throwing feces, urine, blood, saliva, or any form of human waste by an offender while the offender is transported to or from a medical facility or while being evaluated or treated in a medical facility shall also constitute attery of emergency room personnel, emergency se healthcare professional

For purposes of this Section:

(1) "Emergency room personnel" includes a person in a hospital emergency department who, in the course and scope of his employment or as a volunteer, provides services or medical care, or who assists in the providing of services or medical care, for the benefit of the general public during emergency situations. "Emergency room personnel" shall include but not be limited to any healthcare professional, emergency department clerk, emergency department technician, student, and emergency

(2) "Emergency services personnel" means any "emergency medical services personnel" as defined by R.S. 40:1075.3 or any "EMS practitioners" as defined by R.S. 40:1131.

department volunteer working in the hospital emergency department.

(3) "Healthcare professional" means a person licensed or certified by this state to provide healthcare or professional services as a physician, physician assistant, dentist, registered or licensed practical nurse or certified nurse assistant, advanced practice registered nurse, certified emergency medical technician, paramedic, certified registered nurse anesthetist, nurse practitioner, respiratory therapist, clinical nurse specialist, pharmacist, optometrist, podiatrist, chiropractor, physical

therapist, occupational therapist, licensed radiologic technologist, licensed clinical laboratory scientist, licensed professional counselor, certified social worker, or psychologist.

Whoever commits the crime of battery of emergency room personnel, emergency services personnel, or a healthcare professional shall be fined not more than one thousand dollars and imprisoned for not less than fifteen days nor more than six months. At least forty-eight hours of the sentence imposed shall be without benefit of suspension of sentence.

- A. Battery of a dating partner is the intentional use of force or violence committed by one dating partner upon the person of another dating partner.
- For purposes of this Section:
 - (1) "Court-monitored domestic abuse intervention program" means a program, comprised of a minimum of twenty-six in-person sessions occurring over a minimum of twenty-six weeks, that follows a model designed specifically for perpetrators of domestic abuse. The offender's progress in the program shall be monitored by the court. The provider of the program shall have all of the following:
 - Experience in working directly with perpetrators and victims of
 - (b) Experience in facilitating batterer intervention groups.
 - (c) Training in the causes and dynamics of domestic violence. characteristics of batterers, victim safety, and sensitivity to victims.

(2) "Dating partner" means any person who is involved or has been involved in a sexual or intimate relationship with the offender characterized by the expectation of affectionate involvement independent of financial considerations, regardless of whether the person presently lives or formerly lived in the same residence with the offender. "Dating partner" shall not include a casual relationship or ordinary association between persons in a business or social context.

- On conviction, the offender shall be fined not less than three hundred dollars nor more than one thousand dollars and shall be imprisoned for not less than thirty days nor more than six months. Up to forty-eight hours of the sentence imposed may be required to be served without benefit of parole, probation, or suspension of sentence. Imposition or execution of the remainder of the sentence may be suspended upon either of the following conditions:
 - (1) The offender is placed on probation with a minimum condition that he serve four days in jail and complete a court-monitored domestic abuse intervention program, and as a condition of probation the offender shall not possess a firearm throughout the entirety of the sentence.
 - (2) The offender is placed on probation with a minimum condition that he perform eight eight-hour days of court-approved community service activities and complete a court-monitored domestic abuse intervention program and, as a condition of probation the offender shall not possess a firearm throughout the entirety of the sentence.
- An offender ordered to complete a court-monitored domestic abuse intervention program required by the provisions of this Section shall pay the cost incurred by participation in the program. Failure to make such payment shall subject the offender to revocation of probation, unless the court determines that the offender is unable to pay."

- The trial judge shall have the authority to issue any necessary orders to protect the safety of the child during the pendency of the criminal action and beyond its

- The providing of treatment by a parent or tutor in accordance with the tenets of a well-recognized religious method of healing, in lieu of medical treatment, shall not for that reason alone be considered to be criminally negligent mistreatment or neglect of a child. Motion unanimously carried. Mrs. May was absent.

Following the recommendation of Mr. Grant Schlueter with the law firm Foley & Judell, L.L.P, bond counsel, Greg Manley moved, seconded by Harold McCoy, that the Board consider and take action with respect to adopting a resolution providing for the issuance and sale of General Obligation School Refunding Bonds, Series 2020 of the East Ouachita School District of the Parish of Ouachita, State of Louisiana, and providing for other matters in connection therewith. The Issuer has found and determined that the refunding of a portion of the outstanding Series 2011 Bonds consisting of \$6,045,000 of the Series 2011 Bonds which mature March 1, 2022 to March 1, 2031, inclusive (the "Refunded Bonds"), would be financially advantageous to the Issuer and would result in a lower effective interest rate on such Refunded Bonds and debt service savings to the Issuer. Following the reading aloud of the Resolution by President Hicks, Mr. Schlueter announced that Superintendent Coker has executed the commitment letter with the bank that submitted the lowest proposal and Nnamdi Thompson, the Board's Municipal Advisor with Government Consultants, will have the results of the proposal and discuss the bank proposals that were received with the Board. The purpose of the resolution today is to provide for the details of that sale to the low bidding bank. All the savings from this refinancing benefit the property tax payers of the East District. Mr. Schlueter remarked that this is a very, very healthy refinancing with significant savings and invited Mr. Nnamdi Thompson to come forward and present the Board information regarding the sale of the bonds. Mr. Thompson began his report stating that on November 5, eight bids had been received from eight different companies to refinance the bonds. A list that he provided the Board gave potential purchasers two options, whether or not they wanted to allow the district the option to prepay the debt or the district have the opportunity in the future or take away that option. He pointed out that in the first one (Non-Callable), the lowest rate received is from Red River Bank highlighted in green for 1.50%. Just to let the Board know, normally when one has that (Non-Callable) option, those rates are usually lower than if one gets the (Callable) option. After directing the Board to look at the second box on the page, Mr. Thompson pointed out that Red River gave the same rate of 1.50%. Therefore, he and Mr. Schlueter are recommending that the district choose the Red River 1.50% interest rate for the (Callable option). That will save the district over \$722,000 over the life of the issue. Also, Mr. Thompson reminded everybody that we do not extend the debt. The previous bonds will be paid off in 2031 and these bonds will be paid off in 2031 on exact same date which lowers the interest rate and we are able to save over \$700,000.00 that benefits the district. Mr. Schlueter remarked that the present value of savings offered here are measured by the magnitude of the savings given the State Bond Commission's requirement for economic refunding of outstanding bond issues of public bodies. They have a sliding scale on a percentage basis that they want to see and Mr. Schlueter announced that our percentage savings were nearly 12%, the highest on the State Bond Commission is 5%. This is many more times the savings level you would see on typical refinancing across Louisiana that is acceptable to the State Bond Commission when they give approval. President Hicks offered a moment for public comment and the following roll-call votes were recorded: Tommy Comeaux, Yes; Shere May, Absent; Scotty Waggoner, Yes; Harold McCoy, Yes; Dabo Graves, Yes; Greg Manley, Yes; and Jerry Hicks, Yes. Motion carried, with six (6) "Yes" votes; zero (0) "No" votes; one (1) "Absence" and zero (0) Abstentions. Mrs. May was absent.

Title I Supervisor Cynthia Osborne presented a list of the following policies to the Board that have been reviewed and approved in advance by district personnel, Board attorney Elmer Noah and the Board's policy provider, Forethought Consultants, Inc. to be considered and approved at the December 2020 Board meeting: 1) Policy: BCAD (Teleconference/Remote Participation in School Board Meetings); 2) Policy: CBD (Employment of Superintendent); 3) DJE (Purchasing); 4) Policy: DJED (Bids and Quotations); 5) Policy: EFE (Business Continuity and Technology Disaster Recovery); 6) Policy: GBDA (Employment of Retired Personnel); 7) Policy: IDFAB (Sports Injury Management and Concussions); 8) Policy: JBH (Attendance Reports for Student Drivers); and 9) Policy: JGCE (Child Abuse).

Board attorney Elmer Noah discussed the discrepancies in the original land survey of the former Eureka School property. In a previous meeting, the Board voted to sell the Eureka School property to The Frost Town Water System for \$67,000. The system is operating with an old legal description when we got the appraisal and when they had the property resurveyed; it was actually about $\frac{1}{2}$ acre smaller. So, at their request, Attorney Noah is bringing a new proposal before the Board for their consideration. The price per acre remains the same but because the acreage is actually 7.5 rather than approximately 8 acres, they are asking to reduce the purchase price from \$67,000 to \$62,000, which would be reflected by the new appraisal.

Whereby, Scotty Waggoner moved, seconded by Greg Manley, that the Board declare the Eureka School property to be surplus property not needed by the Ouachita Parish School Board, to accept the revised appraisal as reflected by the new survey, accept the amended offer from Frost Town Water System in the amount of \$62,000 for 7.5 acres and authorize President Hicks to execute the sale. Following an offer by President Hicks for public comment, motion unanimously carried. Mrs. May was absent.

Business Director Regina Mekus presented the Ouachita Parish School Board 2020-21 Interim Financial Report for Period ended September 30, 2020. The Board was provided copies of the report representing all funds of the School Board and the total budgeted revenues and expenditures all through the year comparing to their actual performance through the end of September 30, 2020. The following brief highlights were reported:

Mrs. Mekus informed the Board that as we go further into the fiscal year of 2021, a lot of activity is not seen as we go into the transition period due to basically over the summer months and then there is a period of time that our sales tax collections are approved into the prior year for prior year collections, so September is when everything picks up. This is when all our current year salaries hit our Financial Statement when we begin payroll for the year and when we begin collections of our current year taxes. Ms. Mekus pointed out that we are ending this period with an estimated fund balance of \$30, 676,935 in the General Fund, which is up from the prior year about 9% at this time. She offered good news that our sales tax collections have increased from the prior year and we are still operating at less than full capacity after the quarantine period due to the Covid-19 virus shutdown. The district is unable to send employees out to make repairs and there are a lot of delays in shipping whenever items are ordered and we are still working on getting through this process and into a smooth transition. This is the reason our expenditures are lower than usual than they typically are at this time of year. We are also down in employees from this time last year due to lower student count. Basically the changes seen here are not material but just fall in line with what we are seeing every day. Ms. Mekus reported that we are still waiting on some items that were ordered from July 1 forward which is the reason our expenditures are not up like they would be if we were operating on a normal cycle. Ms. Mekus is still seeing a lot of adjustments from this pending situation until businesses get back to their normal operations. Challenges will continue during the Covid-19 Pandemic. In comparison, Ms. Mekus pointed out that her monthly accumulation of Revenues and Expenditures to prior fiscal year periods reveal a 5.53% increase in Revenues and -41.63% decrease in Expenditures and how the lag time affects the M&O operations of getting products in here on time. She complimented the principals and teachers as they worked around their assignments while waiting on their orders to ship. Mrs. Mekus announced that the Sales Tax Report was received yesterday from the City of Monroe and our Sales Tax Collections continue to grow and are up about 7% in each of our Sales Tax Collections for the calendar year above this same time last year. The Parish-Wide Sales Tax that includes the City of Monroe is the only one that is less than the prior year, which only affected the City of Monroe which had a 3% decrease while Ouachita Parish maintained its 7% increase. At this time, Harold McCoy moved, seconded by Dabo Graves, that the Board approve the 2020-21 Interim Financial Report for Period ended September 30, 2020-21 as presented by Business Director Regina Mekus. Following a brief moment allowed for public comments by President Hicks, motion carried unanimously by all members present. Mrs.

On the recommendation of Purchasing Agent Bobby Jones, Greg Manley moved, seconded by Dabo Graves, that the Board waive the liquidated damages for the roof repairs at Sterlington Middle School in lieu of changing the contract since the delay of the project was out of the control of the contractor due to weather related activities. The school experienced two hurricanes back to back (Laura & Delta) that came through within weeks of each other and the week delay was not the fault of the contractor. Following an offer by President Hicks for public comment, motion unanimously carried. Mrs. May was absent.

On the recommendation of Purchasing Agent Bobby Jones, Dabo Graves moved, seconded by Greg Manley, to accept the quotation of Cajun Tree

Cutters at a cost of \$87,000 to remove approximately 210 trees on Lakeshore Elementary School property that includes grinding all stumps at an additional cost of 7,975.00 and adding a 3% charge for the Performance Bond (work includes cleaning up property that was disturbed). President Hicks offered a moment for public comment and motion unanimously carried by all members present. Mrs. May was absent.

The Supervisor of Safety/Construction Ken Slusher gave his Construction/Renovation report along with the OPSB Project Status Report provided by TBA Architects. There was a meeting at the new Boley site this morning where it was announced that the contractor was ahead of schedule a month or more. The slabs on Grade in Wings "A: & "B" Classrooms are now poured. Also, the CMU walls are being installed in those wings along with the MEP rough-in within the Admin/Kitchen area and is approximately 75% in Wings "A" & "B" at Boley Elementary site. Pinecrest roof replacement will be 100% complete by mid-week, next week. Crews are installing the last of the sheet metal flashing now. Lenwil roof replacement will be 100% complete by end of this week and crews are also installing the last of the sheet metal flashing. They are going full speed at Woodlawn after having a delay in starting over again replacing the walls that had blown down during a storm. There is a monthly construction meeting scheduled next Tuesday, November 17, at Woodlawn at 9:00 a.m. and the Board members are encouraged to attend if they possibly can. The $\mbox{\sc Buy/Sell}$ Agreement for the 39 acres of land designated for the new Sterlington Middle School has been completed that is located across from Sterlington High School. Mr. Manley thanked attorney Elmer Noah for his work in getting this agreement finalized and is very excited about the prospect of this new facility being built near the elementary and high schools in the Sterlington area. Once it is all completed, it will be a great location for a facility that will coordinate with both the elementary and the high school. Mr. Slusher announced that the entire roof at Ouachita High School will be replaced by the manufacturer at no cost to the school board. The manufacturer agreed that it was a defective roof and plans to perform the work in sections, but has no start date for the project. The manufacturer agreed to repair any

damages done underneath the roof as it is also warranted.

On the recommendation of Purchasing Agent Bobby Jones, Scotty Waggoner moved, seconded by Tommy Comeaux, that the Board accept the low bid from Trane in the amount of \$43,700 for a chiller at Calhoun Elementary School and funded with M&O funds [Bid No. 20-21]. Following an offer by President Hicks for public comment, motion carried unanimously

by all members present. Mrs. May was absent. There were no Permissions to Bid offered.
