did not have to do those things again.”

In 2011, Toms received the PGA Tour’s Payne Stewart Award – the top off-the-course honor.

He received the Independence Bowl’s Sportsman of the Year

in 1997 and entered the Gulf States Section PGA Hall of Fame in 2012.

“It begins with the image of the sport, and the image of the sport is driven by the players, how they carry themselves, how they conduct

themselves, what people at home feel like they represent, and when 93, 94 percent of Americans say I want my kid — I’m comfortable with my kid using a PGA Tour player as a role model, significantly higher than any

other sport, it’s because of players like David Toms,” former PGA Tour commissioner Tim Finchem said.

“David Toms, in addition to everything else, has been a leader on the PGA Tour. He’s been on

our policy board, and all of us in the sport owe him a debt of gratitude for the contribution he’s made in that regard.”

Toms hopes his resume and visions like 265 can help produce subsequent Tour stars

oozing with Louisiana pride.

“I’ve always tried to provide a good example for them – on the course and off the course,” Toms said. “If that’s helped them, I think that’s great.”

“He made it so easy because he never talked about the draft or about LSU,” said Simoneaux, reflecting on the season. “He’s every coaches dream. He was our best player and hardest worker. I’ve had a lot of

talented guys in the past that didn’t put in the work, so when coaches and scouts would ask about them I would be honest about that. Because when I recruiting in college and a high school coach sold me a bad kid, I wouldn’t go back to that high school. None of that was ever an

issue with Pearson.”

Since getting drafted by the Angels last Tuesday, Pearson has spent most of his time doing what brought him to the dance — hitting.

“I’ve just been doing a whole lot of working out,” Pearson said “That hard work has just begun.”

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND PARAGRAPH 701 OF SECTION 12-8001 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES, CITY OF WEST MONROE, LOUISIANA, RELATING TO THE PROVISIONS REGARDING ENFORCEMENT OF MINIMUM PROPERTY STANDARDS; TO ESTABLISH AN EFFECTIVE DATE; AND TO OTHERWISE PROVIDE WITH RESPECT THERETO.

SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of West Monroe, Louisiana, in regular and legal session convened, that Paragraph 701 of Section 12-8001

of the Code of Ordinances, City of West Monroe, Louisiana, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Sec. 12-8001. - Minimum Property Standards.
* * *

701.1 Change of occupancy. Prior to any change in occupancy of a dwelling subject to this section, an owner shall contact the code official and make the dwelling available for inspection by the code official under the requirements of this section. Except as otherwise provided in this paragraph, no issuance and/or transfer of any utility account relating to that dwelling unit shall be made until the code official has approved compliance with this section.

701.2 Other events. Whenever the code official finds an occupied structure or a piece of equipment in an occupied structure to be in violation of this section, notice shall be served on the owner or the person or persons responsible for the structure or equipment by personal delivery or in accordance with the requirements of Sec. 12-7003. The notice shall provide a list of violations and a timeline for elimination of each violation.

701.3 Continued occupancy. The code official may allow a change in occupancy even though violations and/or deficiencies may exist, if the code official determines that prompt repair and/or correction of these deficiencies will be adequate to satisfy the requirements of this section. In such situation, the code official shall provide the owner with a listing of required changes/repairs, and the deadlines by which those listed must be accomplished. Upon re-inspection by the code official, any failure by the owner to have completed those listed changes/repairs shall result in the following costs to owner:

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND RE-ENACTING THE ZONING ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF WEST MONROE, LOUISIANA, PARTICULARLY THE ZONING MAP ANNEXED TO AND MADE A PART OF ORDINANCE NO. 1501, AS THAT ZONING MAP, AS CODIFIED BY SECTION 12-501(C) OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES, CITY OF WEST MONROE, LOUISIANA, HAS BEEN FROM TIME TO TIME AMENDED, AND PARTICULARLY TO AMEND THAT ZONING MAP AS IT PERTAINS TO CERTAIN PROPERTY LOCATED 218 BELL LANE, AS MORE PARTICULARLY DESCRIBED ON THE ATTACHED EXHIBIT "A", PURSUANT TO THE APPLICATION OF DEFINE LASH COMPANY, LLC/TIFFANY PATTON WILKS, SO AS TO RE-ZONE THE PROPERTY LISTED ON EXHIBIT "A" FROM A R-1 (ONE-FAMILY RESIDENTIAL) DISTRICT TO A B-3 (GENERAL BUSINESS) DISTRICT, TO AUTHORIZE AND DIRECT THE CITY ENGINEER OF THE CITY OF WEST MONROE, LOUISIANA, OR OTHER PERSON ACTING IN LIEU THEREOF AT THE DESIGNATION OF THE MAYOR TO DO AND PERFORM ANY AND ALL THINGS NECESSARY TO CARRY OUT THE FOREGOING AND PARTICULARLY TO NOTE THE AMENDMENTS ON THE ZONING MAP OF THE CITY OF WEST MONROE AS HEREIN ENACTED; AND TO OTHERWISE PROVIDE WITH RESPECT THERETO.

WHEREAS, the City of West Monroe, Louisiana, has adopted a Zoning Ordinance (Ordinance No. 1501, as amended) now codified as Section 12-5001 et seq. of the Code of Ordinances, City of West Monroe, Louisiana; and,

WHEREAS, the West Monroe Municipal Planning Commission, acting as the municipal zoning commission for the City of West Monroe, Louisiana, has held a public hearing pursuant to written application and notice in accordance with law, and has made a recommendation to the Board of Aldermen of the City of West Monroe; and,

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of West Monroe have held a public hearing and given public notice to the extent required by law; and,

WHEREAS, after careful consideration of all recommendations made by the West Monroe Municipal Planning Commission, acting as the zoning commission for the City of West Monroe, Louisiana, the comments and objections made at such hearing, and the comments and objections made at this meeting, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of West Monroe, Louisiana, declare that it is in the best judgment and opinion of the governmental body in the interest of promoting the public health, safety and laws of the general welfare of the City of West Monroe to amend the Zoning Ordinance, including the Zoning Map of the City of West Monroe, as set forth hereinbelow;

NOW, THEREFORE,

SECTION 1. SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of West Monroe, Louisiana, in regular and legal session convened, that Section 4-2030 of the Code of Ordinances, City of West Monroe, Louisiana, is hereby amended to read as follows:

*** Sec. 4-2030. - Enforcement; penalties.**

- No person shall violate any of the provisions of the fire prevention code adopted in this article, nor fail to comply with all applicable provisions of that fire prevention code, nor shall any person violate or fail to timely comply with any order issued by the bureau of fire prevention thereunder. No person shall construct any structure differing in any manner from the detailed statement of specifications and plans submitted and approved by the office of the Fire Marshal of the State of Louisiana (if such approval was required), nor differing in any manner from any certificate or permit issued either under the provisions of the fire prevention code or by some other department or agency in reliance on any approval of the fire prevention bureau. The imposition of a penalty for any violation shall not excuse that or any other violation, or thereafter allow any violation to continue. All persons shall be required to correct or remedy each violation promptly following notification of the violation by the fire prevention bureau. When not otherwise specified, each fifteen (15) days during which a violation is thereafter maintained shall constitute a separate offense as to each violation.
 - Should a violation be determined by the bureau of fire prevention to have the potential to comprise a significant risk of harm to person or property, the fire prevention bureau shall have the right to require the structure to be immediately vacated, to require all natural gas and electrical service to the structure be immediately halted, and to require the structures remain vacated by all persons until those violations have been corrected, except for those persons as the fire prevention bureau shall allow entry in order to undertake any and all necessary actions to eliminate the violation(s).
 - The failure of the owner of the structure and of any person utilizing the structure as a tenant or other occupant to have fully and properly corrected any violation within the deadline provided in the second notice of the violation shall result in the following costs to the responsible person:
 - \$50.00 fee, for the fire prevention bureau then providing the owner and any occupant with an updated written notification and listing of all remaining violation(s); and
 - \$100.00 fee, for each subsequent re-inspection and written notification, until all violations are corrected. No more than one re-inspection shall occur each 15 days.
- The determination of the responsible person, whether the owner or tenant or other occupant, shall be determined by the fire prevention bureau based upon the standards set out in the fire prevention code, and the particular facts and circumstances of the violation.
- Notifications shall be sufficient to an owner if presented personally, or to any shareholder, registered agent, partner, member, manager of a limited liability company, officer, director, trustee, or to any managerial or supervisory person of the owner on the premises at the time of delivery. Notifications shall be sufficient to a tenant or other occupant if presented personally, or to any shareholder, registered agent, partner, member, manager of a limited liability company, officer, director, trustee, or to any managerial or supervisory person of the tenant or occupant on the premises at the time of delivery.
 - Penalty for violations. [Reserved]

Parole check results in arrest

A West Monroe man was arrested by Louisiana State Probation and Parole officers last week after they found two firearms and suspected drugs in his residence.

Marclin Shane Riddle, 49, of 165 Alton Smith Road, West Monroe, was arrested after officers went to Riddle's residence to talk to him, according to the June 12 arrest affidavit.

Officers conducted a search of the residence and found a glass pipe and a .25 caliber pistol laying on a nightstand. The glass pipe and .25

caliber pistol were in the same room Riddle was in. Officers also found a .22 caliber pistol inside the same nightstand.

A bag of suspected methamphetamine was found inside the opposite nightstand. Riddle denied knowing the firearm and meth were in the bedroom. Riddle is on parole for possession of meth, according to the arrest affidavit.

Riddle was booked into Ouachita Correctional Center for parole violations, possession of firearms by a prohibited person, prohibited acts and possession of a level two controlled substance.

Woman arrested after car swerves

Louisiana State police troopers arrested a West Monroe woman on multiple charges after troopers observed her vehicle swerve off the road.

Sylvia Leanne Gordon, 41, of 5991 New Natchitoches Road, West Monroe, was arrested for driving while impaired, contributing to the delinquency of a minor, possession of drug paraphernalia and numerous other vehicle charges, according to the June 13 arrest affidavit.

Troopers first noticed Gordon when she made a wide turn in an or-

ange Chevrolet Avalanche onto LA 546 Southbound from U.S. Hwy 80. The Avalanche went wide into the northbound lanes.

The Avalanche swerved back onto the road, but it continued to veer over the center double yellow line and fog line. Troopers noticed the driver had difficulty walking when they asked her to exit the vehicle.

After identifying the driver as Gordon, troopers saw that she had "dilated, bloodshot, droopy eyes, according to the arrest affidavit." Troopers noticed Gordon had slurred speech as well as difficulty standing. Gordon also had an odor of alcohol and chemicals coming from her person.

Troopers used a field sobriety test and determined Gordon to be extremely impaired. Gordon told troopers she took medication and drank a White Russian.

Troopers spoke with the front passenger, Falen Oneil Massey, who had a warrant from West Monroe Police Department for failure to appear.

A white Styrofoam cup containing an alcoholic beverage was located in the rear passenger cup holder. Several small plastic bags containing unknown residue and a pipe used for smoking illegal substances were found in the center con-

sole. A round glass object with white and brown residue and burn marks inside a plastic bag hanging from the steering column, according to the arrest affidavit. There was a rear passenger, an unrestrained minor, in the back seat.

Troopers tested Gordon's blood alcohol content which came back to 0.05 grams percent alcohol. Gordon refused to give a urine sample. Gordon was determined to be under the influence of alcohol, depressants and stimulants.

Gordon was booked into Ouachita Correctional Center and bonded out on June 14. **(Above briefs by Citizen reporter Alan Rawles)**

WM couple booked on drug charges

A West Monroe couple has been arrested on drug-related charges after a traffic stop on La. Hwy. 2 near Wallace Road in Union Parish.

Harold E. Martin Jr., 52, and Angela R. Martin, 49, both of 2809 Arkansas Rd., West Monroe, were stopped the morning of June 14 for failing to signal before turning onto La. Hwy. 2, no license plate light and having a modified exhaust.

Sheriff Dusty Gates said the patrol deputy stated that both were extremely nervous when stopped and could not produce proper identification.

The deputy reported that Harold Martin identified himself properly but gave a wrong birth date so his license could not be found on computer programs. When dispatch finally found his correct birthday, it revealed Martin's driver's license has been suspended many times since 1985 for driving while under the influence.

Gates said the deputy could see, in plain view, a clear plastic bag near the driver (Harold) that contained a substance thought to be methamphetamine. Harold first stated that the meth belonged to him, but Angela said she was also going to use it, the deputy reported.

After they were arrested, a vehicle inventory revealed a bottle of whiskey on the passenger's side. Angela claimed ownership of it, the arrest report stated.

Harold was booked on the above traffic charges plus driving under suspension. He also was booked into the parish detention center for possession of meth and resisting by giving false information. His bond on these two charges was set at \$3,650.

Angela was booked for possession of meth, bond set at \$2,900, and having an open container and no seat belt. Bond was not specified on these two charges.
