Davis to be honored by Tech

Parish legend O.K. "Buddy" Davis when the Bulldogs host Grambling State Sept. 7 at Joe Aillet Stadium.

The "Buddy Bowl" will kick off at 2:30 p.m. and will be televised live on the NFL Network in the first meeting ever played between the two programs in Lincoln Parish (Tech and Grambling State met at Independence Stadium in Shreveport in 2010).

A member of the Louisiana Tech Athletics Hall of Fame and the Louisiana Sports Hall of Fame, Davis recently passed away at the age of 72. For 55 years, the Ruston native covered both the Bulldogs and the Tigers for the Ruston Daily Leader, penning countless stories about so many great players, coaches and teams from both Universities.

Louisiana Tech named the press area of the new press box and suites of Joe Aillet Stadium - opened in September of 2017 – after Davis, a 2013 inductee of the LA Tech Athletics Hall of Fame.

The Bulldogs will wear special helmet stickers honoring Davis during the game, while a tribute video will be played and Buddy Davis trivia will be pushed through LA Tech social media accounts during the game. Tech officials plan a moment of silence prior to the game and an on-the-field recognition during the game as well.

In honor of Buddy, Louisiana Tech has set up the free event slated to run until 2 p.m.

Tech preparing for Texas

RUSTON, La. – The Louisiana Tech football team held its first official fall scrimmage on Saturday morning out on the practice fields beside Joe Aillet Stadium, as the team prepares for its 2019 season opener on August 31 at Texas.

Head coach Skip Holtz said the day was dedicated to getting ingame reps for all players up and down the roster and was a good benchmark for evaluating position battles among some of the newcomers and younger players on the team.

"I thought today was very productive overall," remarked Holtz. 'We did most of the live work with our twos and threes today, but also got some reps in the red zone for the ones. We made some plays on both sides of the ball, but the key to today will be watching the film to correct our mistakes and improve on what we can. This is a game that has to be played live to really get a gauge of where we're at as a team, and I thought today was a good first mark. This scrimmage

was about personnel as much as anything to see where we are and who those 70 on the travel roster will be."

The team began Saturday's practice with some special teams work, primarily punt coverage and return situations before breaking off into some position drills. Then the two sides of the ball came together for a spirited full contact scrimmage, lasting just over an hour.

"I liked how the running backs competed today - they broke some tackles, ran really hard and made a difference on the offensive side of the ball," added Holtz. "I thought they showed up and did some really good things. I thought the ones and twos were extremely physical across the board. It was definitely a physical day, but we've got the rest of it to recover and stretch to get ready to come back out here on Monday."

The scrimmage consisted of offensive possessions, exclusively working on first and second downs, while rotating in the majority of freshman and newcomers to gauge the roster and depth chart in preparation for the 2019 season.

"I thought our receivers and running backs were both great today," senior quarterback J'Mar Smith said. "They made plays in both our goal line situations and out in the open field and made some big plays for us overall. We (the quarterbacks) built a strong connection with our receivers throughout the spring and summer, and I think that's showing here in camp."

The Bulldogs will take the rest of today and Sunday to recover before hitting the practice fields again on Monday morning at 9 a.m. The team will through Friday next week, leading up to its second scrimmage on Saturday at 9 a.m.

The Police Jury of Concordia Parish met this day in regular session convened. There were present the following members:

1) Invocation, pledge, and roll call of members

2) A motion was made by Mr. Cook seconded by Mr. Probst to approve the minutes of the regular meeting of July 8, 2019 as mailed. Mr. Dunbar had two corrections to the minutes. Agenda item #8 corrected to state that Mr. Dunbar's motion was to have the barn staff clean the lot on Freeman Road. Agenda item #14 corrected to state that Mr. Cornell does not live on Freeman Road but owns property on Freeman Road. Motion carried.

3) Mr. Wilkinson asked Ms. Burley to read a Resolution of Memorial honoring Mr. Guy Murray who recently passed away and served as the Parish Director of Emergency Preparedness. (See addendum for resolution). A motion was made by Mr. Tiffee seconded by Mr. Shirley to adopt the resolution as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

4) Sgt. David Perryman, Liaison for the National Guard was scheduled to introduce himself to the Jurors but was unable to attend the meeting.

5) Mr. Mike Russell owner of Cross Bayou Campgrounds addressed the Jurors regarding No Wake Zone signs for the area around his boat launch. Mr. Russell read aloud statute RS 34:851.27 which describes regulations and speed limits for local bodies of water. Mr. Boothe was present from the District Attorney's office and stated that the definition of public boat launch needed to be determined as described by the Wildlife and Fisheries. Discussion also ensued about whether a future need for a parish ordinance was needed to either establish a speed limit in the Bayou Cocodrie canal or declare this area as a no wake zone. A motion was made by Mr. Parker seconded by Mr. Tiffee to send a letter to the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries to define a public boat launch and a determination whether the signs are to be provided by the parish. Motion carried unanimously.

6) To renew and update current Capital Outlay grant funding, a motion was made by Mr. Shirley seconded by Mr. Probst and carried unanimously to approve Resolution 19-015 committing the obligation of required matching funds to the tions or changes to the criteria of the position before posting for applications. Mr. Tiffee seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

19) The Parish was recently notified that Mr. Elijah Banks had submitted his resignation to the state. Discussion was held as to whether the person appointed to the position could also qualify to run for the position. Mr. Parker made a motion to table action on making an appointment until the next meeting to allow for more information to be gathered. The motion was seconded by Mr. Cook and passed unanimously.

20) Project of the Parish were next discussed:

<u>Brushy Bayou</u>: Revising the Cooperative Endeavor Agreement with the Fifth Levee District to expand on creating a reserve for fund for future major maintenance and repairs that may be needed during the life of the structure. This is needed for USACE to approve the 408 permit and continue to work on the process to approve the 404 permit.

<u>Courtroom Renovations</u>: The project is currently being advertised for bids. Bid packets are available from Mr. Joe Brocato's office. Bid opening is scheduled for August 6th at 10 am. The project has a window of 120 days for completion.

<u>Washington Heights</u>: A redesign is being conducted for approval in which to advertise for bids a third time. Advertisement for bidding is underway. A pre-bid meeting is scheduled for July 30th at 11 am. Bid opening is scheduled for August 13th at 11 am.

<u>Vidalia Canal</u>: There has been no response from two companies that were asked to provide information to spray the canals by airboat in which to kill the aquatic grass that is problematic. Canal and ditch clean out are being conducted as the weather permits.

22) Under the Secretary / Treasurer's report, Ms. Burley reminded the Jurors that qualifying for the upcoming election will be held August 6,7 and 8. Mr. Shirley announced that he would not be running for another term. Mr. Tiffee also announced that he would not be running for another term. Discussion of their time served to the Parish was acknowledged and appreciated by their fellow Jurors.

Ms. Burley also reminded the Jurors that she would be attending the OPAO conference in New Orleans for the remainder of the week. Mr. Dunbar questioned the approval process for attending conferences. Mr. Parker recognized that the Finance Committee approved and the Jurors adopted the budget at the beginning of the year having the allocated line item for training and travel.
