Board Meeting called to order at 11:05 A.M. by Don Leach, President.

President Leach asked the Board Members to review the December 12, 2022, Board Meeting Minutes. Following a brief review of the meeting minutes, Commissioner Glover moved that the minutes be accepted as presented.

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Commissioner Sanders seconded the motion and the minutes were approved by a unanimous voice vote.

President Leach recognized Jerry G. Lazenby, P.E., P.L.S. and Dakota Hill, P.E. and requested that they give an update of the status of L & A, Inc. Project No. 21E048.00 & 22E035 - Washington Street 30" DIP Gravity Line Relining Project. Lazenby and Hill reported that the project is scheduled for the receipt of bids on January 19, 2023 and a "pre-bid" conference will be held at the WOSD No. 5 conference room on January 10, 2023.

President Leach requested that Manager McMullen and Engineers Lazenby & Hill report on the status of projects funded using Louisiana Capital Outlay Funds. Lazenby & Hill reported that L & A, Inc. Project No. 17E037.00 Avant Road Pipe Bursting Project is under construction. Notice to Proceed with construction issued November 28, 2022. Lazenby & Hill reported that L & A, Inc. Project No. 21E010.00 & 21E010.01 for the elimination of the package sewer treatment plant serving Country Estates West and the upgrading of WOSD No. 5 Lift Station G-1 was submitted to the LA Division of Administration, Office of Facility Planning and Control in August, 2022 for review and authorization to advertise for bids. The FP&C representative has promised his review and approval would be completed in November, 2022 and then in mid-December, 2022. Based upon the District (or the OPPJ) receiving approval to advertise the project for the receipt of bids, the Engineers advised that they were ready to move the project forward.

President Leach requested that Lazenby & Hill report on the Water Sector Program - Round 1 project currently under development. Lazenby reported that L & A, Inc. Project No. 21E050.00 Country Heritage Estates Sewer Pump Station and Force Main has been permitted by the Louisiana Department of Health and that the WOSD No. 5 has requested authorization to advertise the project for the receipt of bids.

Hill reported that L & A, Inc. Project No. 21E051.00 - Hillside Subdivision Sewer Pump Station and Force Main plans and specifications have been permitted by the Louisiana Department of Health and that the WOSD No. 5 has requested authorization from the office of Community Development for the District to advertise the project for the receipt of bids.

Hill reported the L & A, Inc. Project No. 21E052.00 - Valley Hills Subdivision Sewer Pump Station and Force Main has been reviewed by the Louisiana Department of Health and that a permit approving the project by the LDH has been received and that the WOSD No. 5 needs to request approval from the Office of Community Development to advertise this project for the receipt of bids.

Commissioner Glover moved that the Board of Commissioners authorize President Leach to formally request authorization to advertise the WSP project for the Valley Hills Subdivision Sewer Pump Station and Force Main for the receipt of bids from the Office of Community Development and for President Leach and Manager McMullen be authorized to take all necessary actions to advance the project.

Motion seconded by Commissioner Sanders

Motion approved by a unanimous voice vote.

Manager McMillen reported on the excessive health insurance premiums paid by employees in the past and the plans developed to date to repay employees. No action taken at this meeting.

Manager McMullen reported to the Board the annual raises to be given to employees. Commissioner Glover moved that the Board approve the recommendations of Manager McMullen concerning the proposed raises.

Motion seconded by Commissioner Sanders.

Motion approved by a unanimous voice vote.

President Leach requested that Mr. McMullen present the WOSD No. 5 Balance Sheet as of November 30, 2022 and the WOSD No. 5 Profit and Loss Budget Performance Sheet for November, 2022. These items are informational items only and no formal Board action is required.

President Leach requested that District Manager Ricky McMullen present the WOSD No. 5 Cash Receipts and Distribution Report for December, 2022 and January, 2023.

Following a review and discussion of the various expenditures and receipts, Commissioner Glover moved that the financial report be accepted and that the receipts and expenses be approved.

Motion seconded by Commissioner Sanders.

Motion approved by a unanimous voice vote.

No further business being presented, the meeting was adjourned by President Leach at 11:45 A.M. by a motion made by Commissioner Sanders and seconded by Commissioner Glover.

A resolution authorizing the incurring of debt and issuance of Twenty Million Dollars (\$20,000,000) of General Obligation School Bonds, Series 2023, of the East Ouachita Parish School District of the Parish of Ouachita, State of Louisiana; prescribing the form, terms and conditions of said Bonds; designating the date, denomination and place of payment of said Bonds; providing for the payment thereof in principal and interest; and providing for other matters in connection therewith.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Parish School Board of the Parish of Ouachita, State of

Louisiana, acting as the governing authority of the East Ouachita Parish School District of the

Parish of Ouachita, State of Louisiana, that:

SECTION 1. Definitions. As used herein, the following terms shall have the

following meanings, unless the context otherwise requires:

"Agreement" means the agreement to be entered into between the Issuer and the Paying Agent pursuant to this Resolution

"Bond" means any Bonds of the Issuer authorized to be issued by this Resolution, whether initially delivered or issued in exchange for, upon transfer of, or in lieu of any Bond previously issued.

"Bond Purchase Agreement" means the completed agreement for the purchase of all or a portion of the Bonds by and between the Issuer and the Underwriter with such additions, deletions, or amendments as shall be appropriate to describe the purchase of Bonds, including the principal maturities of the Bonds, the rate or rates of interest to be borne by the Bonds, the optional and/or mandatory redemption provisions and the conditions of the delivery thereof.

"Bonds" means the Issuer's General Obligation School Bonds, Series 2023, authorized by this Resolution in the total aggregate principal amount of Twenty Million Dollars (\$20,000,000), authorized at a special election held on December 11, 2021.

The Bonds shall bear interest at a rate or rates of interest (not exceeding 6.00% per annum) and shall be sold at such prices, all as set forth in the Bond Purchase Agreement

The principal of the Bonds, upon maturity or redemption, shall be payable at the corporate trust office of the Paying Agent upon presentation and surrender thereof, and interest on the Bonds shall be payable by check mailed by the Paying Agent to the Owner (determined as of the close of business on the Record Date) at the address shown on the Bond Register. Each Bond delivered under this Resolution upon transfer of, in exchange for or in lieu of any other Bond shall carry all the rights to interest accrued and unpaid, and to accrue, which were carried by such other Bond, and each such Bond shall bear interest (as herein set forth) so neither gain nor loss in interest shall result from such transfer, exchange or substitution

No Bond shall be entitled to any right or benefit under this Resolution, or be valid or obligatory for any purpose, unless there appears on such Bond a certificate of registration substantially in the form provided in this Resolution, executed by the Paying Agent by manual signature.

SECTION 3. Book-Entry Registration of Bonds. The Bonds shall be initially issued in the name of Cede & Co., as nominee for The Depository Trust Company ("DTC"), as registered owner of the Bonds, and held in the custody of DTC. The Secretary of the Issuer or any other officer of the Issuer is authorized to execute and deliver a Letter of Representation to DTC on behalf of the Issuer with respect to the issuance of the Bonds in "book-entry only" format. The provisions of this Resolution shall constitute a contract between the Issuer and its successors, and the Owner or Owners from time to time of the Bonds and any such Owner or Owners may at law or in equity, by suit, action, mandamus or other proceedings, enforce and compel the performance of all duties required to be performed by the Governing Authority or the Issuer as a result of issuing the Bonds.

No material modification or amendment of this Resolution, or of any resolution amendatory hereof or supplemental hereto, may be made without the consent in writing of the Owners of two-thirds (2/3) of the aggregate principal amount of the Bonds then outstanding; provided, however, that no modification or amendment shall permit a change in the maturity or redemption provisions of the Bonds, or a reduction in the rate of interest thereon, or in the amount of the principal obligation thereof, or affecting the obligation of the Issuer to pay the principal of and the interest on the Bonds as the same shall come due from the revenues appro-

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priated, pledged and dedicated to the payment thereof by this Resolution, or reduce the percentage of the Owners required to consent to any material modification or amendment of this Resolution, without the consent of the Owners of the Bonds.

SECTION 13. Severability; Application of Subsequently Enacted Laws. In case any one or more of the provisions of this Resolution or of the Bonds shall for any reason be held to be illegal or invalid, such illegality or invalidity shall not affect any other provisions of this Resolution or of the Bonds, but this Resolution and the Bonds shall be construed and enforced as if such illegal or invalid provisions had not been contained therein. Any constitutional or statutory provisions enacted after the date of this Resolution which validate or make legal any provision of the Resolution and/or the Bonds which would not otherwise be valid or legal, shall be deemed to apply to this Resolution and to the Bonds.

SECTION 14. <u>Recital of Regularity</u>. This Governing Authority having investigated the regularity of the proceedings had in connection with the Bonds herein authorized and having determined the same to be regular, the Bonds shall contain the following recital, to-wit:

"It is certified that this Bond is authorized by and is issued in conformity with the requirements of the Constitution and statutes of this State."

SECTION 15. <u>Effect of Registration</u>. In any case where notice to Owners of Bonds is given by mail, neither the failure to mail such notice to any particular Owner of Bonds, nor any defect in any notice so mailed, shall affect the sufficiency of such notice with respect to all other Bonds. Where this Resolution provides for notice in any manner, such notice may be waived in writing by the Owner or Owners entitled to receive such notice, either before or after the event, and such waiver shall be the equivalent of such notice. Waivers of notice by Owners shall be filed with the Paying Agent, but such filing shall not be a condition precedent to the validity of any action taken in reliance upon such waiver.

SECTION 17. <u>Cancellation of Bonds</u>. All Bonds surrendered for payment, redemption, transfer, exchange or replacement, if surrendered to the Paying Agent, shall be promptly canceled by it and, if surrendered to the Issuer, shall be delivered to the Paying Agent and, if not already canceled, shall be promptly canceled by the Paying Agent. Rule 15c2-12(b)(5).

SECTION 29. <u>Official Statement</u>. The Issuer hereby approves the form and content of the Preliminary Official Statement, pertaining to the Bonds and hereby ratifies its prior use by the Underwriter in connection with the sale of the Bonds.

SECTION 30. <u>Section Headings</u>. The headings of the various sections hereof are inserted for convenience of reference only and shall not control or affect the meaning or construction of any of the provisions hereof.

SECTION 31. <u>Effective Date</u>. This Resolution shall become effective immediately.
