Alderman Wilbert Washington said he had been in contact via email with Bradley Cryer, Assistant Legislative Auditor, about the Bond Commission rejecting our proposal we had worked out with Concordia Bank & Trust Co. Washington said Mr. Cryer's replied "Mr. Washington there are no prohibition against the Village of Clayton and "working out a realistic repayment, refinance with Concordia Bank, this would necessarily require a long term repayment schedule. However to my understanding that the proposal sent to the bond commission for consideration was a one-year extension on the existing debt which the Village has demonstrated they are unable to repay the debt in one year. Mr. Washington said he responded to Mr. Cryer in an email saying there was an agreement with Concordia Bank & Trust Co. for a five year, 2.5 percent refinance of Clayton's debt. Washington also said "evidently there has been some confusion." "The Village was rejected by the bond commission because they were looking at it thinking it was just a one-year extension instead of five years. Mr. Washington said he replied to Mr. Cryer email and asked him to relay the information to the bond commission that the council had approved the 2.5 percent refinance on the loan and the Village had adjusted the water rates to pay back the loan and bills and if they would reconsider. Mayor Washington stated that Mr. Biglane along with attorney Offner said when it was presented it would have to go before the bond commission every year to be approved. Attorney Davis said she would contact Mr. Biglane about the Village's proposal to the bond commission to make sure everything is in order.

Mayor Washington informed the board they get a financial report every month from Ms. Jeri Sue Tosspon.

Mayor Washington stated the board of aldermen could adopt an ordinance on how to be paid. Motion was made by Mr. Barber seconded by Mr. Washington to table the discussion until the next meeting, all voting aye, motion carried.

Motion was made by Mr. Washington seconded by Mr. Barber to approve the resolution from MWPP to continue the work on the sewerage for the Village, all voting aye, motion carried.

Chief stated this is not Bobby's money and this is not Bobby's police department. I wanted the board to be aware of it, and I will be taking other actions.

Mayor asked attorney Myisha Davis to look into the matter of police department payroll. Mayor said, "as far as I know, the police department money from July 1, 2016 has never gone into the general fund where it was going into the general fund before. "If I am wrong I stand to be corrected, and I will correct it."

The Town Of Clayton Water System

The town of Clayton water system is currently in violation of the maximum contaminant level (MCL) for total trihalomethanes as set forth by the State (Part XII of the Louisiana State Sanitary Code (LAC 51:XII)) and the Federal Primary Drinking Water Regulations (40 CFR Part 141).

The United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the Louisiana Department of Health (LDH) set drinking water standards and requires the disinfection of drinking water. Where disinfection is used in the treatment of drinking water, disinfectants combine with naturally occurring organic and inorganic matter present in water to form chemicals called disinfection byproducts (DBPs). EPA and LDH set standards for controlling the levels of disinfectants and DBPs in drinking water, including trihalomethanes (THMs) and haloacetic acid (HAAs). Some people who drink water containing THMs in excess of the MCL over many years may experience problems with their liver, kidneys, or central nervous system, and may have an increased risk of getting cancer.

In December 1998, EPA set enforceable drinking water standards for TTHMs at 80 parts per billion (Ppb) and/or HAAs at 60 parts per billion (Ppb) to reduce the risk of cancer or other adverse health effects. Compliance with the TTHMs and HAAs standard for public water systems serving less than 10,000 individuals initially became effective and enforceable on January 1, 2004. Compliance with the TTHMs standard is determined by calculating a locational running annual average (LRAA) of quarterly TTHMs sample results. Compliance calculations performed for the sequencer quarter of 2019 show that the system's current TTHMs LRAA is 134 ppb at DBP02- 154 Carter; Thus, the system is currently in violation of the TTHMs standard.

Please share this information with all the other people who drink this water, especially those who may not have received this notice directly (for example, people in apartments, nursing homes, schools, and businesses). You can do this by posting this notice in a public place or distributing copies by hand or mail.

This is not an emergency. If it had been, you would have been notified immediately. EPA and LDH do not consider this violation to have any serious adverse health effects on human health as a result of short-term exposure; however, continued long-term exposure to TTHMs and HAAs levels above the standard (e.g., 20 years of exposure) has the potential to have serious adverse effects on human health.
