WHEREAS, Act 399 (2022 Reg. Sess.) amended La. R.S. 33:1233 to increase the maximum amount of such expense accounts from Two Hundred Dollars per month to Four Hundred Dollars per month; and,

WHEREAS, given the significant increase in the prices of fuel, vehicles, meals, and other items since 1999, the Ouachita Parish Police Jury finds that enacting this statutory change and increasing in the monthly itemized expense account available to its members from Two Hundred Dollars per month to Four Hundred Dollars per month is reasonable and appropriate.

NOW, THEREFORE:

BE IT ORDAINED by the Ouachita Parish Police Jury in legal and regular session that in accordance with La. R.S. 33:133, as amended by Act 399 (2022 Reg. Sess.), the provisions of Ordinance 8591 codified at Section 1-25 of the Compiled Ordinances of Ouachita Parish be, and are hereby, amended to increase the expense account limit for Police Jury members from Two Hundred Dollars per month to Four Hundred Dollars per month.

WHEREAS, Part I, Chapter 10, Title 46 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, as amended (La. R.S. 46:1051, et seq. (the "HSD Act"), authorizes and empowers the police juries of parishes, upon their own initiative, to form and create one or more hospital service districts within the respective parishes, with such names as the police juries may designate, and, in so doing, police juries may create hospital service districts whose boundaries overlap those of other hospital service districts; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the HSD Act, the Ouachita Parish Police Jury adopted Ordinance No. 7027, on April 11, 1962, creating G. B. Cooley Hospital Service District of Ouachita Parish, Louisiana (the "District"), which ordinance has been amended as reflected in the Ouachita Code of Ordinances; and

WHEREAS, the District comprises and embraces all of the territory within Ouachita Parish (the "Parish"), and as permitted by the HSD Act the District's boundaries overlap the boundaries of Hospital Service District No. One of Ouachita Parish; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Consolidated Local Government Public Finance Act (La. R.S. 39:501, et seq.), hereinafter referred to as the "Act," a hospital district, including the District which is a political subdivision of the State, is considered a "governmental entity" authorized to incur debt and issue bonds pursuant to the Act; and

WHEREAS, this Board of Commissioners, as governing authority of the District, proposes that Certificates of Indebtedness will be issued by the District in the manner prescribed by and under the authority of La. R.S. 39:526, Subpart A of the Act, and other constitutional and statutory authority supplemental thereto, payable out of the revenues of the District of subsequent years, after the payment from such revenues of: (1) all charges required by law or regulation; (2) all contractual obligations; (3) all necessary and usual charges provided for by ordinance or resolution, excluding depreciation; and (4) all payments in respect of bonds for which a pledge or dedication of specified taxes or revenues has been provided by law or in proceedings authorizing such bonds, regardless of the date of issue of such bonds; and

WHEREAS, other than the proposed indebtedness, the District has no other outstanding debt other than an issue of Revenue Bonds, Series 2020, outstanding in the principal amount of \$1,240,000, bearing interest at a rate of 2.88% per annum, and maturing in annual installments due on March 1 of the years 2023 through 2029, inclusive, which are payable from the excess of annual revenues of the District above statutory, contractual, necessary and usual charges (the "Outstanding Parity Debt"); and

WHEREAS, the Cooperative Endeavor proposed by VCOM meets the criteria for the use of American Rescue Plan Act ("ARPA") funds available to the OPPJ;

NOW, THEREFORE:

BE IT RESOLVED that the Ouachita Parish Police Jury does hereby allocate and commit a total of up to One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) of the OPPJ's ARPA funds to provide funding for VCOM's acquisition of two (2) Mobile Medical Units, to be used for the purposes set forth in the Proposal identified above; and,

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER CALHOUN WATER SYSTEM failed to take corrective action following identification of a significant deficiency.

On 4/26/2022 the Louisiana Dept of Health (LDH) performed a detailed inspection and engineering evaluation on our water system called a sanity survey. During this sanitary survey, they identified one or more significant deficiencies in our system. As our customers, you have a right to know what happened and what we are doing to correct the deficiency (or deficiencies) or work with the State to develop a plan to correct the deficiency (or deficiencies). However we failed to correct the deficiency or contact the State before the established deadline and have therefore violated a requirement of the Ground Water Rule.

What should I do?

There is nothing you need to do. You do not need to boil your water or take other corrective actions. If a situation arises where the water is no longer safe to drink, you will be notified within 24 hours.

What does this mean?

This is not an emergency. If it had been an emergency, you would have been notified within 24 hours.

This significant deficiency has the potential to result in lack of proper treatment and oversight of the water system. Inadequately treated or inadequately protected water may contain disease-causing organisms. These organisms can cause symptoms such as diarrhea, nausea, cramps, and associated headaches. While we have not detected any evidence of contamination or other health threats related or our source water, we are still committed to correcting the deficiency to eliminate the threat of contamination.

What was done?

We completed the required assessment and indentified the cause of the issue. Our ground storage tank was fixed; resurfaced and missing vent screen was replaced.

Please share this information with all the other people who drink this water, especially those who may not received this notice directly (for example, people in apartments, nursing homes, schools, and businesses). You can do this by posting this notice in a public place or distributing copies by hand or mail.

Board Meeting called to order at 11:00 A.M. by Don Leach, President. President Leach asked the Board Members to review the past month's Board Meeting Minutes.

Following a brief review, Commissioner Glover moved that the minutes be accepted as presented.

Commissioner Sanders seconded the motion and the minutes were approved by a unanimous voice vote.

President Leach recognized Ricky McMullen, District Manager and Jerry Lazenby, P.E. and requested that they discuss the emergency repairs on the 30" DIP gravity line on Washington Street. Mr. McMullen informed the Board of Commissioners that a section of Line No. YA0000 from MH #21 to MH #22 had failed with several holes allowing inflow from the roadway ditch during rainfall causing Lift Station Y to overflow. District Manager Ricky McMullen requested that the Board of Commissioners declare an emergency to get this 350 Linear Feet section of 30" gravity line repaired by slip-lining as soon as possible. Jerry Lazenby, P.E. commented that his firm and the District are in the process of talking to JABAR Corporation about performing the repair and checking on the availability of slip-liner pipe and related materials. Mr. Lazenby reported that the preliminary cost estimate for the emergency work is in the neighborhood of \$380,00 to \$450,000. Randy Hammons, P.E. reported that he was working on securing a utility permit from the Louisiana Department of Health and the Louisiana Department of Transportation and Development for the emergency work. Mr. Hammons reported that this section of line was included in the Project to replace the 30" gravity line from Olice Lane to Edwards Road under a Water Sector Program Grant and that the plans and specifications developed for this project will be used to perform the emergency repair.

Following a discussion of the project, Commissioner Glover moved that the WOSD No. 5 declare an emergency to get the 350 Linear Feet section of 30" gravity line along the west side of Washington Street repaired as soon as possible and to authorized District Manager Ricky McMullen to take all necessary actions in hiring JABAR Corporation to perform the necessary repairs and for Lazenby & Associates, Inc. to provide technical assistance and professional services necessary to perform the gravity line repairs.

Motion seconded by Commissioner Sanders.

Motion approved by a unanimous voice vote.

President Leach then requested Mr. Lazenby to report on the Louisiana Capital Outlay Projects currently being developed for the District. Mr. Lazenby reported that Facility Planning & Control had concurred with the OPPJ request to award L & A, Inc. Project No. 17E037.00 - Pipe Bursting of Line No. IA0000 from Matthews Road on Avant Road to Lift Station "I" on the north side of I-20. The contract was awarded to Horseshoe Construction in the amount of \$875,710.00 in which the State's participation

is \$656,782.50 (75%) and the District's share is \$218,927.50. Lazenby & Associates, Inc. is in the process of obtaining contracts, bonds and related items from the contractor for presentation to the OPPJ for execution.

Mr. Lazenby reported that L & A, Inc. Project No. 21E010.00 and 21E010.01 - Elimination of Package Sewer Treatment Plant serving Country Estates - West Subdivision and the reconstruction of Lift Station G-1 are awaiting FP&C approval to advertise for the receipt of bids. This project will be funded using Capital Outlay funds with WOSD No. 5 providing the local match (25%) through the Ouachita Parish Police Jury.

Mr. Lazenby reported the L & A, Inc. Project No. 21E050.00 - Elimination of the Package Treatment Plant serving the Country Heritage Estates subdivision was under design and that plans and specifications are projected to be submitted to the LDH in October, 2022.

The above items were submitted for information only. No formal action requested by the Board.

President Leach then requested that Mr. Lazenby report on the Louisiana Water Sector Program Projects being developed for the WOSD No. 5.

Mr. Lazenby reported that Mr. Hammons, P.E. was developing plans and specifications for L & A, Inc. Project No. 21E048.00 / 22E035.00 -Washington Street Gravity Line Slip-Lining Projects. Mr. Hammons reported that the project extends from Olice Lane northward to Edwards Road. It is anticipated that plans and specifications will be submitted to the LDH and the LDOTD for review and permitting during the month of September.

Mr. Lazenby reported that the projects for the construction of sewer pump stations and force mains necessary to deliver the domestic wastewater from Hillside and Valley Hills to County Heritage Estates are being developed and are projected to be submitted to the LDH during the month of October, 2022.

The above discussion presented for information only. No actions required by the Board at this time.

President Leach requested that Mr. McMullen present the WOSD No. 5 Balance Sheet as of July 31, 2022 and the WOSD No. 5 Profit and Loss Budget Performance Sheet for July, 2022. These items are informational items only and no formal Board action required.

President Leach requested that District Manager Ricky McMullen present the WOSD No. 5 Cash Receipts and Distribution Report for July, 2022 and August, 2022.

Following a review and discussion of the various expenditures and receipts, Commissioner Glover moved that the financial report be accepted and that the receipts and expenses be approved.

Motion seconded by Commissioner Sanders.

Motion approved by a unanimous voice vote.

No further business being presented, the meeting was adjourned by President Leach at 11:35 A.M..
