NATCHITOCHES – Improved defense and rebounding in the front court was key to Northwestern State's return to the Southland Conference Tournament this past season.

Alderman Keys said the town was already out of compliance with the budget and could not afford to give any raises.

Appointment of Police Chief: Mayor Turner explained to the Board Interim Police Chief Margaret Glasper would serve her 90-day term ending on November 24, 2020 and then she would resign.

Appointment of Town Attorney: Attorney Philip A. Letard, Sr. addressed the Mayor and Board informing he has been a lawyer for 45 years practicing in Louisiana and Mississippi. Mayor asked for a motion to accept Attorney Letard as the attorney for the town. Motion made by Alderwoman Pryor, 2nd by Alderwoman Bacon; Roll call established: 4 yeas -- 1 nay, so carried.

IBTS (Institute for Building Technology and Safety): Deborah Elaine-Jones explained the importance of engaging IBTS to perform inspections for mobile homes, ordinance compliance with state, permits for residential and commercial property. The service is free to the town and ensures the town will not be fined for non-compliance. Alderwoman Lloyd stated she thought the use of this service would be good for the town and Alderwoman Pryor thought it would not be good to outsource this service the town provides.

Policy & Procedures: Alderman Keys questioned whether all employees of the town have seen and signed the policy & procedures manual. He suggested the department heads make sure that all employees have signed withing the next two weeks. Alderwoman Lloyd was uncertain but wanted to ask the attorney if this was a task for the Mavor.

Speeding: Alderwoman Bacon expressed her concerns about speeding on Jerry Lee Lewis Blvd. Mayor stated he would contact the Sheriff's office to work together with the Police Department to assist if necessary.

Alderwoman Bacon also wanted to know if the town had a Code of Conduct for police officers & Dress Code and did it apply when off duty. Mayor Turner explained the town does and it not only applies for officers, but for any employee of the town.

Leola Dixon: Alderman Kevs planned to honor Ms. Leola Dixon by giving her a "Key to the City" for her 100th birthday on October 20, 2020. Pastor Conner acknowledged Ms. Olivia Seals turned 108 on October 12.
