LSU upends Liberty

The LSU Tigers used a 27-6 run over the final 7:06 of the game to pull away from a stubborn Liberty team by a score of 74-58 Monday night at the Pete Maravich Assembly Center.

The Tigers are now 3-0 on the young season, holding all three teams under 60 points. LSU, trailing at the half the last two games, has outscored its three opponents by a score of 150-73 in the final 20 minutes combined.

LSU plays again on Thursday night at 7 p.m. against McNeese State.

LSU was down 52-47 after Liberty (1-1) made two free throws off an LSU technical foul. Liberty led by one, 26-

25, at the intermission and by as much as seven in the second half of play.

But a charged-up LSU team got a turnover on the ensuing possession and Darius Days took an Eric Gaines pass to cut the Liberty lead to 52-50 with 6:27 to play.

After a couple of turnovers and missed shots each way, Brandon Murray took a Gaines pass and hit a trey to give LSU the lead for good at 53-52 with 4:52 to play.

Gaines got a steal on the next Liberty possession, getting the ball to Days who fouled and who made two free throws to increase the LSU lead to 55-52. Gaines and Days reversed

roles with Days getting the steal and Gaines making two free throws to make it 57-52.

Liberty finally got two free throws at the 4:14 mark to make it a three-point game, 57-54, but then Days hit a three and Xavier Pinson hit Efton Reid in the corner for a three-pointer and Days followed a Liberty miss with his fifth trey of the game to make it 66-54 sending the LSU crowd into a frenzy.

Days hit 4-of-5 treys in the second half to lead LSU with 26 points, while Reid put in 13, hitting 6-of-9 from the field with the one trey. Pinson and Gaines each had 10 points and the pair combined for 10 assists and seven steals.

LSU nine down Cajuns

Catcher Tyler McManus launched a grand slam in the bottom of the seventh inning Sunday to break a 3-3 tie and lift LSU to a 8-6 win over UL Lafayette in the first half of a 16-inning scrimmage at Alex Box Stadium.

The Tigers edged the Cajuns, 9-8, in the second half of the scrimmage as infielders Jordan Thompson and Cade Doughty combined to drive in five runs for LSU.

"I thought we played really well," said LSU coach Jay Johnson. "We left a few at-bats on the table, but we honestly haven't gotten to that phase of situational hitting yet in practice. What I'm excited about is that the things we need to do better are all in front of us as part of our development process. Our plate discipline was really good, which created a lot of opportunities, and with the ability I believe our players have, we're eventually going to crack through."

LSU trailed the Cajuns, 3-2, entering the bottom of the seventh of the first half of the scrimmage, but Thompson tripled and scored on a sacrifice fly to tie the game. The Tigers loaded the bases later in the inning, setting the stage for the

grand slam by McManus to give LSU a 7-3 lead it would not relinquish.

LSU grabbed a 1-0 lead in the bottom of second on Thompson's RBI single that scored left fielder Gavin Dugas. The Cajuns responded to tie the game 1-1 in top of third and LSU took a 2-1 advantage in the fifth when Doughty was hit by a pitch with the bases loaded, scoring Thompson from third.

UL Lafayette scored two runs in the sixth to take 3-2 lead before LSU mounted its comeback in the seventh inning. LSU overcame an early 4-0 deficit in the second half of the scrimmage, with Thompson's three-run homer in the third inning giving the Tigers a 5-4 lead.

The Cajuns responded and held a 7-5 advantage in the fifth, but Cade Beloso delivered an RBI single in the bottom of the frame, and Doughty's run-scoring double in the sixth tied the contest at 7-7. The Tigers scored the go-ahead run in the seventh when outfielder Dylan Crews drew a bases-loaded walk, and LSU extended the margin to 9-7 later in the inning on a passed ball.

ULM falls to Arkansas St.

ULM's offense slumbered for much of the game Saturday night and Arkansas State hung around long enough to escape with a 27-24 win at Malone Stadium.

Blake Grupe kicked a 42-yard field goal with 1:17 left in the game to give the Red Wolves

(2-8, 1-5 Sun Belt) their 12th straight win over ULM (4-6, 2-5).

"Until you become a football team where you're better than the other team most of the time, this is what you get when you're building a program," ULM coach Terry Bowden said.

Notice is hereby given, pursuant to Article IV, Section 21(D)(1) of the Louisiana Constitution, that on November 9, 2021, Entergy Louisiana, LLC ("ELL"), a public utility providing retail electric and gas service throughout the State of Louisiana, filed with the Louisiana Public Service Commission ("LPSC") its Application for Approval of the 2021 Solar Portfolio, the Geaux Green Option, Cost Recovery and Related Relief (the "Application"). The Application requests LPSC approval to add four solar photovoltaic generating resources (the "2021 Solar Portfolio"), with a total nameplate capacity of 475 megawatts ("MW") to ELL's generation portfolio. The 2021 Solar Portfolio is comprised of the St. Jacques facility, the Vacherie facility, the Sunlight Road facility, and the Elizabeth Facility, each of which would be constructed in the State of Louisiana upon the LPSC's approval of the Application. ELL's Application also requests implementation of the Geaux Green Option ("Rider GGO"), which is a voluntary rate schedule that allows customers to subscribe to a portion of the 2021 Solar Portfolio (and potentially to other future resources) to receive value directly from those resources. Specifically, the proposed Rider GGO sets forth the parameters under which the Company's eligible customers can align some or all of their monthly electricity requirements with renewable resources by being able to receive value from both the energy from a renewable project along with renewable energy credits from the facilities. Although the Company's Application requests to recover the costs of the 2021 Solar Portfolio through existing rate mechanisms, the relief requested will not directly result in a change in rates unless approved by the LPSC and implemented through later filings.
