WHEREAS, the Comprehensive Plan recommends the establishment of a parish planning commission pursuant to Louisiana Revised Statutes 33:102 and 33:103 to support coordinated long-term planning, infrastructure review, intergovernmental coordination, and orderly development decision-making within the unincorporated areas of Ouachita Parish; and

WHEREAS, Louisiana Revised Statutes 33:101 et seq. authorize parish governing authorities to establish planning commissions and to provide for the preparation and maintenance of comprehensive and master planning documents for the physical development of the parish; and

WHEREAS, the Ouachita Parish Police Jury finds that the establishment of a planning commission will improve coordination among parish departments, municipalities, utility providers, regional organizations, state agencies, and community stakeholders regarding infrastructure investments, drainage management, transportation planning, housing initiatives, economic development, and related public matters; and

WHEREAS, the Ouachita Parish Police Jury expressly finds that the establishment of the Ouachita Parish Planning Commission pursuant to this Ordinance is intended to facilitate planning, coordination, infrastructure review, and advisory functions authorized by Louisiana law and is not intended to establish zoning districts, regulate private property through zoning classifications, or exercise zoning authority not otherwise approved as required by law; and

NOW, THEREFORE:

BE IT ORDAINED that the Ouachita Parish Police Jury does hereby create a “Ouachita Parish Planning Commission” regulations found at La.R.S.33:103, et seq., as follows:

Sec. 1. Ouachita Parish Planning Commission

The “Ouachita Parish Planning Commission” (the “Commission”) for the unincorporated areas of Ouachita Parish, Louisiana is hereby created. The Commission shall function as an advisory and administrative body to the Ouachita Parish Police Jury concerning matters relating to planning, land use, economic development, infrastructure coordination, environmental conservation, and the orderly physical development of the unincorporated areas of the Parish.

Sec. 2 Membership of the Committee

The Commission shall consist of seven (7) members appointed by the Ouachita Parish Police Jury. Members shall be residents of Ouachita Parish. To the extent practical, membership should reflect geographic diversity within the Parish and include individuals with knowledge or experience in areas such as:

- Economic Development
- Education/Workforce Training
- Real Estate/Housing Development/Community Development
- Agriculture/Forestry/Natural Resource Management
- Emergency Management/Public Safety
- Transportation/Planning
- Healthcare/Social Services
- Engineering/Drainage/Utilities

No elected official of the Ouachita Parish Police Jury shall serve as a voting member of the Commission unless otherwise permitted by Louisiana law.

Sec. 3 Terms of Office

The Commission shall be made up of seven (7) members appointed by the Ouachita Parish Police Jury. One member shall be nominated by the juror representing each of the six (6) Police Jury districts. The seventh member shall be an “at large” member and shall be nominated by the OPPJ President.

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Four (4) members would serve initial terms of two (2) years, and three (3) members would serve initial terms of four (4) years, with said initial terms to be allocated by the drawing of lots at the committee's initial meeting. After these initial terms, all members would serve terms of four (4) years.

At its initial meeting the Commission shall elect a chairman, vice-chairman, and secretary who shall serve one-year terms in such offices. Said secretary shall be responsible for the keeping of minutes, preparation of agendas, posting of notices, and similar clerical matters. Any member may be removed by the Police Jury for neglect of duty, misconduct, excessive absenteeism, malfeasance, or inability to serve, after notice and an opportunity to be heard.

Sec 4. Meetings

The Commission shall hold regular meetings at such times and places as established by its rules. Special meetings may be called by the Chair or by a majority of the members. All meetings shall be conducted in accordance with the Louisiana Open Meetings Law, La. R.S. 42:11 et seq. A majority of the appointed membership shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

Sec. 5 Powers and Duties.

The Commission shall serve in advisory planning, coordination, and review capacity for matters affecting the physical development, infrastructure, transportation, drainage, housing, environmental, economic development, and long-term growth of the unincorporated areas of Ouachita Parish. The Commission shall possess the powers and duties authorized by Louisiana law and this ordinance of the Ouachita Parish Police Jury, including but not limited to:

1. To review, evaluate, maintain, supplement, and periodically update the 2025–2026 Ouachita Parish Comprehensive Planning Study and related planning materials developed for the Ouachita Parish Police Jury through the parish wide planning process;
2. To conduct studies, surveys, analyses, and public meetings relating to:
 - transportation systems;
 - roads and bridges;
 - drainage and flood mitigation;
 - utilities and infrastructure;
 - housing and neighborhood conditions;
 - economic development;
 - environmental conservation;
 - recreation and public facilities;
 - public services; and
 - related planning matters affecting the Parish;

Board Meeting was called to order at 11:00 A.M. by Jeff Glover, Vice-President.
Vice-President Glover asked the Board Members to review the April 13, 2026 Board Meeting Minutes. Following a brief review of the meeting minutes, Commissioner Sanders moved that the minutes be accepted as presented.
Commissioner Glover seconded the motion and the minutes were approved by a unanimous voice vote.

Vice-President Glover then recognized Randy Hammons, P.E. and requested an update on the Lift Station “N” Force Main Project on Washington Street.

Mr. Hammons reported that permits approving the plans for construction have been received from the LDH and the LDOTD has issued permits approving the state highway crossings. Mr. Charles Herold is working on securing servitudes from private land owners along LA 3034 for installation of the force main.
No actions required by the Board at this time.

Vice-President Glover recognized Mr. Jerry Lazenby, P.E. and requested that he present the Legacy Landing duplex project at 2445 Arkansas Road (LA 616).

Mr. Lazenby reviewed the plans for the project with the Board. Project consist of 22 buildings with a total of 44 duplex single family residential units. The WOSD No. 5 will own, operate and maintain the sewer collection system upon satisfactory completion of construction of the project which will gravity flow to the existing WOSD No. 5 sewer collection system. Mr. Lazenby recommended that the WOSD No. 5 grant preliminary approval of the project and upon satisfactory completion, the WOSD No. 5 accept the project.

Commissioner Sanders moved that the WOSD No. 5 accept the plans for the proposed project and grant preliminary approval with final acceptance after satisfactory completion and inspection of construction as outlined in the letter from Mr. Lazenby dated May 7, 2026.

Motion seconded by Commissioner Glover.
Motion accepted by a unanimous voice vote.
Vice-President Glover then requested Mr. Lazenby to present the plans for the Fielding Estates Duplex Development as 900 Harrell Road.

Mr. Lazenby reviewed the plans for the project with the Board. Project consist of 8 buildings with 16-3 bedroom duplex units on a 24' wide private concrete street. This development will have to utilize a small pump station in order to deliver domestic wastewater to the WOSD No. 5 sewer collection system to Harrell Road. Mr. Lazenby recommended that the WOSD No. 5 approve the plans for this development with the understanding that the owner/developer would own, operate and maintain the sewer collection system and the sewer pump station. The WOSD No. 5 would own, operate and maintain the 2” sewer force main located on public right-of-way from the sewer lift station to the WOSD No. 5 collection system on Harrell Road.

Commissioner Sanders moved that the WOSD No. 5 accept the plans for the proposed project and grant preliminary approval with final approval after the satisfactory completion and inspection of the project as outlined in the letter from Mr. Lazenby dated May 11, 2026.

Motion seconded by Commissioner Glover.
Motion approved by an unanimous voice vote.
Vice-President Glover requested that the discussion of the “Paid Time-Off Policy” be delayed to the June, 2026 meeting when the full Board will be present.

Vice-President Glover recognized Manager Ricky McMullen and requested an update on the Rate Study for the WOSD No. 5.

Manager McMullen reported that he is currently discussing a rate study with the Louisiana Rural Water Association who has extensive experience in conducting rate studies for water systems and sewerage systems. He hopes to be able to present a proposal from the LRIWA at the next meeting.

Vice-President Glover requested that District Manager McMullen present the WOSD No. 5 Cash Receipts and Distribution Report for April, 2026 and May, 2026.
