Tech players earn honors

RUSTON - After putting on to their two worst shooting tinued their hot streak, overa shooting clinic in the twogame series sweep over Rice, Louisiana Tech's Kalob Ledoux was named the College Sports Madness C-USA Player of the Week, the publication announced on Monday.

Ledoux came off the bench in both games to provide offensive sparks, helping the Bulldogs overpower the Owls by scores of 101-57 and 79-58.

He averaged 21.0 points (scored 42 points in 44 minutes of action) while shooting 54.2 percent from the field and a blistering 64.3 percent from beyond the arc.

On Friday in game one, he recorded a season-high 25 points while making six threes (his most as a Bulldog). He also pulled down a career-high eight rebounds.

The senior continued his hot shooting on Senior Day, posting a team-high 17 points with three triples.

He was also part of a Bulldog defense that held the Owls performances of the season (32.3% and 33.9%).

The 101 points, +44 scoring margin and 17 made three-pointers in Friday's contest set new LA Tech records against a C-USA opponent (17 threes also tied a single-game program record).

Another week, another award for Kenneth Lofton, Jr.

The Louisiana Tech forward was voted as the Conference USA Freshman of the Week in an announcement made by the league office on Monday.

This marks the fifth straight honor for Lofton, Jr. (no award was given last week due to all the canceled games). In doing so, he became just the third player in C-USA history to win the award five consecutive times.

It also brought his season total to eight, which is tied for the fourth most ever in C-USA (has won eight of the 13 weekly awards this season).

Lofton, Jr. and LA Tech con-

powering the Rice Owls by scores of 101-57 and 79-58 to complete another league sweep this past weekend.

The Bulldogs have now won eight of their last nine games and are in a tie for first in the West Division.

The freshman was too much for Rice's frontcourt, averaging 16.5 points while shooting 70 percent from the field. He also averaged 8.0 rebounds per

On Friday night, he notched his seventh double-double of the season with 16 points and a game-high 10 boards.

He turned around on Saturday and had a team-high 17 points to go along with six rebounds.

The forward also totaled four steals, the most of any Bulldog in the series.

The team ended up holding Rice to its two worst shooting performances of the season (32.3% on Friday and 33.9% on Saturday).
