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The Franklin Parish Police Jury met in Regular Session on Thursday, August 12, 2021 at 5:00 P.M. in the Police Jury Meeting Room, Courthouse Building, located at 6558 Main Street, Winnsboro, LA 71295 with the following present: Vice President Leodis Norman, Chaplain Gary Peters, Juror Keiona Wesby (5:07 p.m.), Juror Rawhide Robinson, Juror Ricky Campbell and Juror David Deblieux. President James Harris was unable to attend.

Vice President Norman called the meeting to order, followed by roll call. Juror Peters led the assembly in prayer and the pledge of allegiance. Campbell offered the motion to amend the agenda to include his resignation for serving on the Recreation Committee and appointment of a juror to fill the vacancy. Peters seconded the motion with all voting in favor. Robinson offered the motion to approve the agenda. Peters seconded with all voting in agreement. Campbell offered the motion to not activate the Franklin Parish Contingency Plan for COVID-19 Response at this time. All office operations will remain as is. Robinson seconded with all voting in agreement. The motion to approve the meeting minutes for both the July 15, 2021 regular meeting and July 23, 2021 special meeting was offered by Campbell, seconded by Robinson and was passed. Robinson offered the motion to approve withdrawing the application to use accumulated Federal Bridge Program Funds for Deer Creek Bridge and bank the funds to be put towards Bobby Woods Bridge. Campbell seconded with all voting in agreement. Robinson offered the motion to approve Mr. Willie Credit’s request to discharge gray water from septic system in to the parish drainage ditch that abuts his property with the stipulation that no more than 2 structures requiring sewage systems will ever be on the property. Campbell seconded with all voting in agreement. Campbell offered the motion to send letters to all property owners / residents, who are likely to use the McCain bridge, advising of the new 5-ton load limit. Robinson seconded with all voting in agreement. Campbell offered the motion to adopt Resolution 747, giving President Harris authorization to sign documents relating to ACT 119 of 2021 regular legislative session. Peters seconded with all voting in agreement. Peters offered the motion to adopt Resolution 748, giving President Harris authorization to sign documents relating to HB 1 of 2021 regular legislative session. Campbell seconded with all voting in agreement. Robinson offered the motion to adopt Resolution 749, giving President Harris authorization to sign all documents relating to the Parish Activity Center Project. Deblieux seconded with all voting in agreement. Peters offered the motion to adopt Resolution 750, giving President Harris authorization to sign all documents relating to the Bayou Macon Cut-Off (Baker’s) project. Campbell seconded with all voting in agreement. Peters offered the motion to adopt Resolution 751, giving the Secretary/Treasurer the authority to execute all documents necessary to terminate the relationship with Nationwide Retirement Solutions and adopt Security Benefit as the new recordkeeper; and transfer all Plan assets to the new recordkeeper. Campbell seconded the motion with all voting in agreement. Campbell offered the motion to approve holding a public hearing to amend Section 3 of the ordinance for the creation of the tourist commission. Robinson seconded with all voting in agreement. The motion to approve a proclamation appointing Mr. Paul Till to the seat vacancy of the Franklin Parish Constable, Justice of the Peace District 1 and the calling of a Special Election for Franklin Parish Constable, Justice of the Peace District 1 was offered by Peters, seconded by Campbell and was passed. Peters offered the motion to approve reducing the monthly camping rate at Turkey Creek Recreation and RV park from \$1050.00 / \$900.00 Senior Citizen to \$750.00 / \$600.00. A reductio of \$300 for both the regular and senior citizen rate. Robinson seconded the motion with all voting in agreement with the exception of Campbell, who opposed. The motion passed.
