Southwest Ouachita Waterworks, Inc. (hereinafter called SWOW) recently violated a drinking water standard. Although this incident was NOT an emergency, you, as our customer, have a right to know what happened and what we did (or are doing) to correct this situation.

The SOUTHWEST OUACHITA WATERWORKS, INC. is currently in violation of the maximum contaminant level (MCL) for total trihalomethanes as set forth by the State [Part XII of the Louisiana State Sanitary Code (LAC 51:XII)] and the Federal Primary Drinking Water Regulations (40 CFR Part 141).

The United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the Louisiana Department of Health (LDH) set drinking water standards and requires the disinfection of drinking water. Where disinfection is used in the treatment of drinking water, disinfectants combine with naturally occurring organic and inorganic matter present in water to form chemicals called disinfection byproducts (DBPs). EPA and LDH set standards for controlling the levels of disinfectants and DBPs in drinking water, including trihalomethanes (THMs) and haloacetic acids (HAAs). Some people who drink water containing TTHMs in excess of the MCL over many years may experience problems with their liver, kidneys, or central nervous system, and may have an increased risk of getting cancer.

In December 1998, EPA set enforceable drinking water standards for TTHMs at 80 parts per billion (ppb) and for HAA5s at 60 parts per billion (ppb) to reduce the risk of cancer or other adverse health effects. Due to the extent of the problems within the well it was decided to shut the well down and provide water to those customers from alternate well sites (Larry Henry #1 and Charlie Griggs #7). Additional chlorine adjustments were made at the Larry Henry and Charlie Griggs well sites to be able to reach our farthest points and maintain state requirements. Southwest Ouachita Waterworks is nearing completion of the new well for the Cooney Bonnett site. Southwest Ouachita Waterworks will continue to monitor and make any additional adjustments as needed until the new well is operational.

Please share this information with all the other people who drink this water, especially those who may not have received this notice directly (for example, people in apartments, nursing homes, schools, and businesses). You can do this by posting this notice in a public place or distributing copies by hand or mail.

THIS IS NOT AN EMERGENCY. If it had been, you would have been notified immediately. The improvements include a mill, patch & overlay project with a milling depth of 2.5 inches and an overlay thickness of 2.5 inches. The project length is 2,805 feet. The roadway width is 24 feet with 12-foot travel lanes from Commercial Parkway to the transition lane leading to the turn lane at the Short Constitution Drive Intersection The roadway width at the turn lane is 38 feet, and the average roadway width at the transition lane is 31.5 feet. The cost estimate assumes 20% of the paved area will require full depth asphalt patching. In addition, we included paved shoulder areas 11 feet in width and 1,100 feet in length (north of the roadway from the Dodge dealership to the Convention & Visitor Bureau) & 275 feet in length (north of the roadway from the LaQuinta Hotel to the Underdogs Restaurant). The paved shoulder area consists of 8.5 inches of stone with 4 inches of asphalt overlay. This public infrastructure improvement will increase access and allow for continued growth of businesses along this commercial corridor. This proposed project will allow for the creation of 4 new jobs and the retention of 101 current jobs in the community
