From these taxes, some have to be transferred to debt services. We have over \$600,000 in indirect cost from ESSER funds this year. If you look at the 2020-2021, we only had \$161,000. The Indirect cost from the ESSER funds are still propping up the general fund. Looking at the report, Maintenance of Plant has increased. Student Transportation Services is looking better. This is due to the decrease in fuel cost. Utilities, the worst in utilities has not happened yet. We are "keeping our head above water," so to

A small cushion was set back because of the workers comp. This was to recognize an expense that did put us in the hole a little. We hope that if it is not all used we can put it in other funds. In the next agenda meeting, I will discuss a few things. Some of that will be about some of the projects that are coming up and insurance.

Sales Tax has held steady. Some of those funds go towards debt. I feel we have accomplished

many things and managed our money well.

Mrs. Nichols asked about the 15% policy that was mentioned by Mr. Freddy Smith and how we need to change that. Is there a way that you and your team could look at that? Mr. Gullatt and I have spoken with our attorney, Mr. Jon Guice; he feels that we probably do not need a policy. Mr. Gullatt said that the easiest thing is to remove the sentence and then present it to the board.

Something I would like to point out is that last year we had to place the student activity fund in our financial statements. Which is why he suggested that we budget that. We have to put all school

funds into our finances. This is because we are all part of the same organization. With that, Mrs. Boquet concluded her report to the board.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Mr. John Gullatt spoke at how he was at a loss for words on losing Mrs. Boquet. He spoke about how he had come to rely on her opinion and all of us here. We wish her well, even though I have tried to convince her to stay a little longer. The official date is January 31.
