To our patients, friends, and neighbors in Hastings, Prescott and surrounding communities: As the physicians, nurse practitioners, and physician assistants of the Hastings healthcare community, we are asking that the each of you take steps to protect yourself, your loved ones, and your community as we continue to struggle with COVID-19.

As you know, we are seeing more cases of COVID-19 variants in Hastings, across our state and western Wisconsin, and throughout the U.S. Many vulnerable individuals in our community are getting sick, being hospitalized, and even being transferred to larger hospitals for respiratory support and other critical care services. This, coupled with the importance of continuing to meet the on-going health care needs for our community, is creating more pressure on health care systems.

Preventing illness is part of our mission. It is a critical part of who we are. We have seen the devastation of individuals and families affected by COVID-19 first hand. We want nothing more than to prevent the continuation of this suffering, but we cannot do it alone. As a community, we must ensure we are taking every possible step to keep our families, our friends and our communities safe. Thank you for doing your part.
