

Woods, Dillow among top returnees for Amburgey's squad

The 2004 season was one to remember for Abingdon head coach Garrett Amburgey.

Abingdon posted a 10-2 record en route to the Mountain 7 District title and Amburgey set the school all-time wins record.

There is a common thread to this story.

"We talk a lot about our standard," Amburgey said. "The guys played up to that standard last season, and we're currently practicing with the same standard."

Following the graduation of 19 seniors, the immediate goal is to reassemble a regular cast among a 62man roster that has 13 seniors.

Just two starters return on offense. while the defense has five veterans.

"The biggest thing we need is game

experience, especially on the varsity level," Amburgey said. "That's what we're trying to develop."

Versatile lineman Aidan Woods is the headliner.

A 6-foot-5 and 280-pound senior with a 4.2 grade point average, Woods has committed to play at the University of

North Carolina under legendary coach Bill Belichick.

"Aidan is a great player and we're very proud about his success," Amburgey said. "Aidan has put in the work to play at the next level. He accomplished big

things for us last year and we expect the same this season."

The list of proven talents on offense includes junior Judge Dillow and senior Oliver Summitt at receiver.

"Both of those guys run great routes and catch the ball well,"

Abingdon faces a challenge in





replacing running back Owen Barr.

A master at making quick cuts and busting off long runs up the middle, Barr accounted for 23 touchdowns last season and well over 2,000 total rushing yards the past two years. He is now on the roster at Emory & Henry.

Senior Tykenevan Thompson is the new featured back.

"Tykenevan has paid his dues and learned from Owen," Amburgey said. "Tykenevan runs hard and he pops right up when he gets tackled. We love that

approach and we're anxious to see him roll."

Amburgey also praised the leadership of senior defensive back Griffin King.

"We have some very high character seniors have who have put in extra work the past four years to improve and be part of what our program is all about," Amburgey said.

Junior baseball standout Hayden Reed and sophomore Isaiah Draper are also in the mix at receiver.

"Isaiah can be electric," Amburgey said.

on our team," Amburgey said.


Junior Kieffer Widener returns at middle linebacker.



Chisom's Devils try to get more wins

The leading men for the Castlewood Blue Devils in 2025 will be those big boys battling in the trenches each week.

"Our line's looking very great I feel like," said Castlewood senior Jasper Salyers. "We have four seniors and one junior [starting]. ... Our key will be up front and running it."

A 255-pound senior, Salyers was an honorable mention All-Cumberland District pick at guard last season and will help pave the way for the relentless rushing attack.

Brunner Houchins, a 265-pound junior, was an honorable mention all-district selection at offensive tackle and much is expected of him this fall.

Center Burton Casey (275), guard Trey Hamm (285) and tackle Jacob Young (315) join Salyers as seniors on the offensive line.

Junior Brayden Rose (205) and freshman Brady Hall (165) are penciled in at tight end.

On the other side of the ball, Salyers, Young, Houchins, Casey, Hamm and senior Dakota Lambert (295) hold down the D-Line.

"You can have big seniors who can't move, but that's not the case for us,"

said second-year Castlewood boss Shon Chisom. "We're up big up front and we can move.'

Castlewood hopes to make another move in the right direction in the coming months.

The Blue Devils went 2-8 last season after winning just two games combined during the 2022 and 2023 seasons.

"We definitely doubled our winning percentage and made improvements," Chisom said. "Now, it's about leaping further than that and maybe doubling from that. I got to understand the personnel we've got last year and understanding my kids."

Last season marked Chisom's first head-coaching job.

After starting the season with six straight losses, the Blue Devils split their final four games with wins over Twin Springs and Hurley.

"I feel much better than last year to be honest with you," Chisom said. "Last year, the kids were learning a new

system and terminology. This year we've been much better with understanding as far as where we need to be. Our kids understand the offense better and the defense better. We've taken a bigger leap."

The comfort level is mutual.

"He's a smart guy," said Castlewood senior wingback/ safety Wes Harvey said of Chisom. "He expects a lot out of us, and we do our best to make him happy with us."

Harvey, Dalton Phillips and Jacob Farmer will get the bulk of the carries with senior Matthew Nickles taking over at quarterback.

Nickles, Harvey, Farmer, Elv King and Dalten Keith lead the way for a talented defensive secondary. Harvey was a first-team All-Cumberland District pick as a defensive back

in 2024, while King earned honorable-mention status as a DB.

Phillips and Rose lead the way at linebacker with the former being a second-team

all-district selection last year. Castlewood allowed 34.4 points per game a season ago and must improve in that area.

"They understand what the expectation is," Chisom said. "This year should be a better year for us."

If things do turn out better, the linemen will likely deserve much of the credit.

"Dude, I'm excited," Harvey said. "The line's gotten way better. We're looking to run the ball more this year and probably won't pass as much because we're looking solid up front. The line's impressed so much this offseason. They've probably been here working out more than the other kids." ★

Chilhowie looks to return to Region 1D playoffs


The Chilhowie Warriors are coming off a season in which they went 3-7 and missed the VHSL Region 1D playoffs. That's just part of the story, however, because if a few bounces here or there had gone Chilhowie's way the Warriors would have had a winning record and been bound for the postseason. Despite the final record, the team had a plus-six point differential.


A 19-14 loss to Rural Retreat, a 40-39 setback to eventual regional champ Rye Cove and a season-ending 21-14 defeat at the hands of Holston were gut-wrenching and have not been forgotten by the 11 seniors on the roster entering the 2025 season. "We're hungry," said Chilhowie senior tight end/linebacker Blake Robinson.

"It's our last year and we want to go out with a bang. We want to do whatever it takes to win and finish in the key moments. The last few years we haven't been finishing in the key moments."

Chilhowie returns eight starters on each side of the ball and the defense is particularly experienced. Five of the team's top seven tacklers from 2024 return with Robinson (78 tackles),

junior middle linebacker Gavin Walker (73 tackles), junior outside linebacker Garrett Dickison (64 tackles), senior defensive end Landon Hall (57 tackles, three sacks) and sophomore strong safety Luke Mullinax (40 1/2 tackles)

leading that unit.

"We have a ferocious defense," Robinson said. "All 11 guys to the football is what we preach, and our guys really take that to heart."

Defensive tackles Aidan Broughman (6-foot-1, 250-pounds) and Bodie Miller (6-2, 235) and cornerback Gabe Rouse (6-3, 195) are also back. Defensive end Colton Gentry, freshman safety Dylan Martin and cornerback Asher Chapman will also be counted on. Preston Gollehon, Anthony Canales, Christian Ford and freshmen Tyler Gonzalez and Gunnar Milhorne will contribute as

well.

"Defensively, I think this is gonna be one of the better defenses we've had at Chilhowie in a few years," said Chilhowie coach Reid Sturgill.

Dickison is a leader of that defensive crew. He is the team's punter as well. "Garrett is a guy who can play a lot of positions defensively," Sturgill said. "He can line up in the box, play in the defensive backfield and bring the pressure too. He's very hardnosed and likes contact." Offensively, the top returnee is senior quarterback Asher Chapman.

Chapman passed for 1,567



With plethora of returnees, Eastside could make run

The Eastside High School Spartans were mere seconds away from winning the VHSL Region 1D football championship last November.

However, Rye Cove scored with 25 seconds remaining on a touchdown pass to take a 26-20 victory over the Spartans as Eastside's season ended with an 11-2 record.

That setback provided a painful memory and plenty of incentive for 2025.

"Those are pretty bad feelings," said junior running back/linebacker Keldan Hamilton. "It sucked; I'm not going to lie. But it happens, it's the game of football and we're using it as motivation."

A 2,000-yard rusher, a 1,000-yard passer as well as nine defensive starters are back in the fold for the crew from Coeburn and many preseason prognosticators have predicted the Spartans will make a trip to the state finals in Salem come December.

"It's hard not to hear all the chatter," said Eastside coach Mike Rhodes. "It's cliché now, but we're playing one game at a time. I know every coach says that, but if you start looking forward you miss what's in front of you and we don't want to have any false steps in front of us."

Hamilton was a step above other rushers in the Cumberland District last season as he gained 2,077 yards and scored 25 touchdowns on the ground.

"It's a lot of just grit and heart," Rhodes said. "He just refuses to go down and is that kind of football player. He'll do whatever he has to do to lav it on the line and win the football game."

Sophomore Rocky Bond (352 rushing yards, four TDs; 34 receiving yards, one touchdown) holds the distinction of being both the strongest and fastest player on the squad according to Rhodes. Just 5-foot-8 and 165 -pounds he can bench press well over 300 pounds. Freshman Isaiah Barnette (6foot, 175-pounds) steps in at fullback.

They'll be running behind an offensive line anchored by guards Tristan Fields (5-foot-11, 230 pounds, jr.) and Landry Carico (6-1, 250, jr.).

Wide receiver Chase Williams (11 catches, 86 yards, two touchdowns) and tight end Noah Hamilton (12 catches,

224 yards, four TDs) are the top targets for sophomore quarterback Landon Pannell.

Pressed into starting duty last season due to an injury, all Pannell did was throw for 1,292 yards with 19 touchdowns and just four interceptions.

"Landon was thrown in there and never wavered," Rhodes said. "He just got better and better."

Pannell has improved as that jump from freshman to sophomore is among the biggest at the prep level.

"Mostly just my reads and watching film," Pannell said. "I've been working on that a lot this offseason and got really stronger and bigger as well."

The reviews have been positive. Expect Pannell to run the ball more often.

"I talk very highly of him," Hamilton said. "He stepped in and just did his job and dominated. He's a stud."

Defensively, Hamilton (108 tackles) was the Spartans' top tackler last season at linebacker while Chase Williams snagged a team-high three INTs.

Braxton Freeman (90 tackles), Noah Hamilton (59 tackles) and Dalton Yates (51 tackles) are stalwarts for a unit that allowed just 11.2 points per game.

The Spartans do not have a single senior on their roster. They do have 14 juniors.

"These juniors have started as freshmen, so they've got a lot of experience and provide a lot of leadership so we're not missing that element," Rhodes said. "That's a good problem to have." *



Maroons seek to continue winning ways

There will be plenty of new faces in important places for the George Wythe Maroons this season, but with such uncertainty comes opportunity.

Who will step up and deliver for the program that has been Southwest Virginia's most consistent winner on the gridiron over the past 25 years?

There are plenty of youngsters who fit the bill.

"I can't a complain a bit," said GW coach Brandon Harner. "These young kids have been tremendous and are really hard-working kids. During the offseason they never missed the weight room, they don't miss practice and try to do everything you tell them to do. There are going to be some growing pains. ... As the year goes on we'll get better and if we stay healthy. I think we'll be OK."

There will be some big cleats to fill for some newcomers.

After rushing for 1,677 vards and scoring a total of 30 touchdowns, running back Trey Rainey is now on the roster at Roanoke College.

Quarterback Shane Huff graduated after amassing 1,580 yards and 14 touchdowns through the air. Defensive back Holden Luttrell (54 solo tackles) also departed.

However, two of the top linebackers in the VHSL's smallest classification return in 6-foot-2, 225-pound senior Camden Skeens and 6-foot, 185-pound junior Cade Bralley.

"He and I balance each other and I feel we are like brothers," Skeens said. "We have played ball together a long time."

Skeens made 96 solo tackles last year with three sacks, while Bralley collected 94 solo stops and intercepted three passes.

"I think they are two of the best linebackers in

Southwest Virginia if they really play to their potential and we'll have to have them play well





proven leader.

A three-year starter, Roberts has only lost two games.

"Dalton has a chance to be among the among the successful quarterbacks in school history in terms of wins," Palmer said.

The list of proven talents on offense also includes versatile senior Gabe Lilly (19 touchchdowns), senior receiver Malachi Elick (6-3, 200) and 6-3, 225-pound junior running back Gage Palmer.

A pair of all-state picks in Lilly (6-1, 212) and junior lineman Jysir Williamson (6-2,250) are anchors on defense.

"Jysir is strong and smart, and he has an unbelievable motor. We're excited about his future," Palmer said.

Fearless junior Cambel Fix is a play maker at defensive back and receiver.

The G-Men recorded six shutouts last senior en route to a 15-0 record and the third state crown in seven vears.

Two-time Bristol Herald Courier defensive player of the year Omarri Hill is now playing football at NCAA Division II Emory & Henry. Receiver Chris Edwards is in the roster at Morehead State, while linebacker Yubrenal Isabelle is at Ferrum.

Graham must also replace Dylan Nash, who connected on five field goals and over 60 extra points in 2024.

The most dramatic change for Graham fans this season involves the home field.

Instead of playing at historic 10,000-seat Mitchell Stadium, the G-Men will host three games on a turf field located at the high school.

"We're excited to have a place with that G Star at the 50-yard line that represents our program, school and community. Hopefully, that that will help us play even harder," Palmer said.

The Class 2D regional rematch against Union will be held at Tazewell, while

the scheduled home game against Tazewell has been moved to Richlands.

There is no permanent seating at the new home for Graham football, which has long served as the practice facility for the G-Men.

Palmer is hopeful that additions will gradually follow.

"That's the goal," Palmer said.

As usual, Palmer takes a cautious big-picture of his squad.

"I think we have a good team. We just have to put in the work," Palmer said. *

Lester, a dual threat in every sense of the word at quarterback, is now playing at Bluefield University.


"It's weird not seeing Logan standing around somewhere," Bartley said.

Jo'Lon Norman returns at the guard position and will anchor the offensive line. He also starts at defensive end.


"We've got a bunch of speed and we're quick off the ball," Norman said.

As usual, Holston has to avoid injuries.


"Always," Akers said. "We have to stay healthy and be very careful with the way we practice and keep people as fresh as we can for Friday nights."


he's been in this offense for a long time and knows it well. He knows he's got big shoes to fill, but he also knows he has to be calm and collected."

The dude has size, speed and sure hands.



those guys where it doesn't matter who's back there playing quarterback, they'd be tickled to have No. 3 split out there."

Avery Musick - Peyton Musick's younger brother has formed a nice rapport with his new signal-caller and praised Parker Lowe in the preseason.



The fearless 5-foot-9, 165-pound speedster gained more than 1,000 rushing yards last fall and looks to feast on opposing defenses again.



"Overall, I just wanted to get better at everything," he said. "I worked on my vision a lot, hit the weight room a bunch, got a lot stronger, a lot





quicker and I probably went to a dozen football camps this summer."





You can't forget Waylon Nunley (5-8, 135, sr.) who is pound-forpound one of the toughest







"I think the expectations were already there," Cooper said. "We didn't change a lot from the staff we had last year, so everybody is understanding what's going on. It's always a


change going from assistant to head coach and bringing in your system and things you want to do differently. The kids are adjusting well to it." ★



Kent Grant takes over as Ridgeview's head coach

Kent Grant is not new to Ridgeview football.

Grant has been either defensive or offensive coordinator for the Wolfpack since the school opened in 2015.

The coach is, however, new to his new role as head coach of the Pack.

Grant takes over the Ridgeview program following DeWayne Stanley's resignation last year.

Grant is also the school's athletic director and was a very successful head coach for other sports at Ridgeview. including the Wolfpack's softball program. But, he readily admits that stepping into the head coaching role

for the football program has been an adjustment.

"Really, at the end of the day, it's all on you," Grant said. "A lot of people don't realize the behind the scenes work that a head coach has to do. A lot of it is those behind-the-scenes things. The organization of everything."

The coach said he's looking forward to the challenges that being a head coach brings with it.

The biggest challenge on the field for Grant is replacing a four-year starting quarterback. Ryan O'Quinn ran the show for the Wolfpack for four years and he did well. During his

tenure, O'Quinn threw for 8,200 vards and 95 touchdowns.

O'Quinn's replacement at the signal-caller position will most likely come from senior Bentley Brockhoff or sophomore Braxton Deel. Both saw limited playing time last season.

"They've had some reps, but nothing prepares you for when it's on your shoulders and things are

flying at you," Grant said.

With a new quarterback, Grant expects his team will shift some from a passhappy type of offense to a more balanced attack when the Pack has the ball.

Jaalan Deel looks to carry the load when it comes to the rushing game.

Deel had over 800 yards in his sophomore season and accumulated 1,077 vards and 13 touchdowns on the ground in his junior season last year.

Up front for the Pack. three linemen return in center Noah Rasnick. sophomore Logan Justice and Gunner McCoy. Grant said senior Kolter Scanlon is likely to move up front to the offensive line.

Defensively Scanlon and senior Austin Rose will bookend the line. Both return for their third year as a starter on the defensive front. The interior line will primarily be a rotation of offensive starting linemen.

Justice moves from the defensive line to linebacker this season, while Xander Wallace, Jacob Rasnick and Kaleb Wagner will likely see time at linebacker.

There is plenty of experience in the defensive secondary with Alex Grant, Collin Hill and senior and three-year starter Alan Hill all back.

Ridgeview also has the advantage in the kicking game with Arkansas signee Conner Smith handling kickoffs and punts.

Smith averaged 42 yards per punt last season, while 75 percent of his kickoffs were touchbacks. He also had 51 PAT kicks and three field goals. ★





Quinton Hensley returns as boss of Indians

Q Ball is back on the table at Rural Retreat High School and that begs the question: Will the Indians get on a roll?

Quinton Hensley began his second stint as head coach at the Wythe County school after previously helming the program successfully from 2004-2009.

The 61-year-old Hensley was most recently the offensive coordinator at George Wythe but spent the 2024 season out of coaching.

"I thought I was done," Hensley said. "One thing led to another and the more I thought about it, I felt this was something I wanted to do. So here I am."

A 1982 graduate of T.C. Roberson High School in Asheville, North Carolina,

who later attended Virginia Tech, Hensley arrived at Rural Retreat for his first tour of duty in 1988 and remained at the Wythe County school for more than 20 years. Hensley also spent time as the head coach of the boys basketball, girls basketball and track and field teams at Rural Retreat.

He was on the Indians' coaching staff when they won four regional football championships under the direction of popular head coach Dean Rhea. He eventually became Rhea's right-hand man and when his mentor retired became his successor in the fall of 2004.

The Indians play on Dean Rhea Field.

"I've got a lot of pride in the stadium name," Hensley

said. "Dean was my mentor when I was a young coach and we won a lot of games together. I'm excited to be back on this field."

Hensley captured three Region C, Division 1 championships in his first three years as the gridiron boss at Rural Retreat and finished with a 40-32 record in his first goround.

Rural Retreat hasn't been to the state semifinals since 2006 and since Hensley's departure the Indians have had four head coaches and won two playoff

games, the last coming with Chris Akers calling the shots in 2015.

Hensley takes over for Jamey Hughes, who went 31-37 in seven seasons.

The Indians were 5-6 each of the past two years, losing in the first round of the Region 1D playoffs both seasons.

"This team has been real close the last couple of years," Hensley said. "Just had some tight losses, bad luck and injuries. There is talent here. And I think we can be a pretty good team if the guys will buy into what I

am selling."

They are considered a darkhorse in the Region 1D playoff race this fall as they return eight starters on offense and seven on defense. The roster features 12 seniors.

"It's pretty amazing coming back here and meeting with the kids because it seemed I had either coached or taught at least one of their parents or relatives," Hensley said. "So, I had that connection. These are still the same hardworking kids that I remember from when I was here before. They work so hard and have good

attitudes."

Defensive back/wide receiver/kick returner Jake Rollyson, defensive back Chaz Penwright and running back Trever Shelton earned All-Hogoheegee District honors last season and return.

Penwright is back at quarterback and will be the trigger man for the spread offense Hensley hopes to implement.

Hunter Rollyson can play tight end or tailback, while the versatile Shelton figures to get plenty of touches as well. Shelton rushed for 224 yards and three touchdowns in a win over Patrick Henry last season.

James Snavely and Jake Rollyson are other proven playmakers.

Veteran center Easton Burkentine anchors the offensive line.

Jake Rollyson, Hunter Rollyson, Shelton, Snavely, Penwright, Eli Poole and Scottie Campbell will be names to remember on the defensive side of the ball.

"I'm pretty confident that we can be a pretty good team by the end of the year," Hensley said.



Air Raid offense looks to produce points, wins

Sullivan East's Air Raid offense was grounded for most of the 2024 season as the Patriots averaged just 8.8 points per game cracked double digits just twice during a season in which they won just one game.

Meanwhile, the defense struggled in its own right as that unit surrendered 46.4 points per game over the course of the one-win campaign.

With most of their roster intact, the Patriots are improved on both sides of the ball and they proved it on Aug. 22 in a 26-21 seasonopening loss at Johnson County.

That's the same Longhorns squad that put a 53-7 beatdown on East the vear before.

"Any time you play here, you know it's going to be a fight. And man, what an

effort our guys gave tonight," Sullivan East coach J.C. Simmons said after the game.

Peyton Lingerfelt is back at quarterback as he threw for 2,001 yards with seven touchdowns and 17 interceptions last season. Look for the TDs to go up and the INTs to go down as he has more confidence and a better grasp of the offensive scheme.

He threw for 297 yards and two TDs in that seasonopening setback.

Six guys who caught passes last year return with Blue Proffitt (55 catches, 720 yards, three touchdowns) leading the way.

Haden Jones (38 catches, 391 yards), Gabe Johnson, Devin Bowman and Ryley Neal also have a good hands and freshman Issac Deel has shown promise.

Proffitt had a 26yard TD reception and Jones hauled in a 69-yard scoring strike in Week 1.

Proffit is one of the most explosive players in Northeast Tennessee.

"Blue has become a great leader for us and is working his tail off to the best player and teammate he can be," Simmons said. "I'm proud of him and all our guys for the work they have put in so far."

Proffitt said he probably caught a thousand passes from East quarterback Peyton Lingerfelt over the course of the offseason. Lingerfelt estimated the number of throws as too many to count.

"It's a good relationship," Proffitt said. "He's been my best friend since middle

school and we've always had that connection."

Lingerfelt knows he can throw it up and Proffitt can go get it.

"The best catch I've ever seen him have is the one from the Greeneville game last year over like three defenders," Lingerfelt said

Elizabethton and Greeneville reside in Region 1-4A and are perennially two of the top teams in the state.



"Our seniors are tightknit and dedicated, and our middle school and freshmen classes are pretty strong. I think the future is bright here." Harris said.



THS will showcase hard-nosed mentality

The Tennessee High Vikings will once again play a big-boy brand of football with the dudes up front paving the way for a relentless rushing attack on offense, while making opponents earn every yard the hard way on the defensive side.

This is a blue-collar approach that has helped THS achieve success. The team went 8-3 last season.

"We're going to run the ball." said Tennessee High coach Josh Holt. "That's what we do, that's how we live. That's physical football and that's what we want to do. Defensively, we're going to try to get after people. The offense and defense marry and mirror each other when you're physical."

Kai Allison, Ryan Simora, Erasmo Cobian, Spencer Miller, Peyton Lomans, Gavin Dickson, Alex Carey, Kalel Honaker, Isaac Stevens and Josiah Beidleman are among those players battling in the trenches. The Vikings have depth on both sides of the line.

"We've got a whole section in the locker room we call Fat Alley," Holt said. "That's where the linemen live and they embrace. Coach [Josh] Pendleton, Coach [T.J.] McMurray and Coach [Jesse] Taylor do a good job

of making sure those guys understand how important they are to what we do here."

Benefitting from that line play on offense will be running back Elijah Plumbar, who rushed for 855 yards last season and also had 130 receiving yards. He began the current campaign sidelined by an injury and did not play in the team's 30-13 season-opening loss at West Ridae.

While Trent Dowdell (now on the roster at Emory & Henry University) was the workhorse last year, THS will look to be more balanced on offense this year.

"I don't think we'll have another 180-carry back

but we have a great stable of backs from seniors on down," Holt said. "We feel good about our guys."

Carter Smith, Cooper Booher. Cannon Stalnaker. and Kalel Honaker will also get carries. Riley Price (15 catches, 132 yards) and





Barron Harkleroad (12 catches, 177 yards) are the top returning receivers.

Jack Richardson and Knox Kessee will both see time at quarterback. Richardson threw for 320 yards with six touchdowns and four interceptions last season.

"This day and age you have to have both of those guys ready to play at all times," Holt said.

Richardson connected on 10 of his 13 pass attempts for 110 yards in that seasonopening loss to West Ridge as Harkleroad (six catches, 87 yards) was his top target.

Linebacker Preston Feagins leads the way for the defense, which allowed less than 100 rushing yards per game last season.

He amassed 50 solo tackles, recorded seven sacks and recovered two fumbles last season, all of which led Tennessee High.

"He's kind of the epitome of what we want," Holt said. "Tough, hard-nosed, competitive, works hard in the classroom, works hard in the weight room, goes hard in practice and it all shows on Friday night."



Feagins has left a trail of battered running backs and quarterbacks in his wake.

"He's a thumper," Holt said. "If he latches on to you, you're going down and going to be tackled."

Cooper Booher, Frank Reed and those aforementioned defensive linemen will be disrupters as well. Booher returned a fumble 66 yards for a score for Tennessee High's first touchdown of 2025.

Dayne Musick is the dominator in the defensive secondary as he snagged three interceptions a

season ago.

"Our defensive coaches, all the way around, are hard on us and that's what makes us good ballplayers," Feagins said. "They always make sure we do the little things right, so when we get on the field it's all habit."

"We had some highs and we had some lows." Holt told reporters afterward. "We handled the highs just fine, but we didn't handle the lows well."


The Vikings' goals are still within reach despite a slow start and something they would like to achieve is the right to host a first-round playoff game.

you start to see. ... Our conference top to bottom is pretty solid." *







For good reasons, the vibe among the parents and supporters of the Bears was downright giddy.

"Our kids have a chance do something special for our school, program and community," head coach Travis Turner said.

One year after advancing to the Region 2D title game for the second straight year, the Bears feature 16 returning starters and 11 seniors. Several of those seniors. such as running back Keith Chandler and versatile Kam Bostic, have become household names across the region over the past three years.



last season.

"Braxton is a multi-talented guy who can run the ball and catch it, so we're able to move him around," Turner said.

The headliner among the line corps is another fouryear starter in 6-foot-3 and 335-pound tackle Jacob Horton.

Senior Brayden Chandler (6-2, 230) and Chris May (6-3, 340) return to starting positions on the line, while junior Kaleb Stacy (6-2, 275) sophomore center Talen Wharton (6-1, 240) and junior Evan Roberts (5-9, 225) are also in the mix. "We have the capability

to open things up and be different on offense this season," Turner said. The offense features a total of nine returning starters, while seven veterans return on defense.

Keith Chandler is a pounder at linebacker.

Senior Carlos Anderson (6-3, 200) is a three-year starter at end, Bostic recorded eight interceptions last season at safety, and senior Camden Wharton (6-2, 210) emerged as an all-state performer at linebacker.

According to Turner, Wharton approaches the linebacker position in the

same cerebral fashion that former Union standout Tanner Kennedy played with. "Camden comes from an athletic family and he really knows the game," Turner said.

Bunch has experience at free safety, while juniors Abe Hall (6-0, 180), Rayvon Jones (5-9, 150) and Keshawn Milbro provide depth in the secondary. Sophomore end Matty Polier (6-3, 215) and sophomore linebacker Kaden Dillman (5-9, 215) are rising stars. Dillman, who runs with a mix of power and quickness, might also see time at running back.

Entering his 15th year as the boss of the Bears, Turner realizes the expectations are high among the avid Union fans.

"This senior class has won some big ball games and lost some tough ones," Turner said. "We had a very successful season in 2024 against a tough schedule. "Ever since our kids walked off the field at Graham in that regional championship loss, they have put in the work and set their minds on getting back to that point." 🚖

"Our coaching staff feels good about where our program is, but we're not satisfied," Patterson said. "We want more and our players want more."

VHS must replace eight seniors, including several athletes who started both ways.

The key loss among seven



Wolves have relentless rushing attack

As West Ridge's football team went through the traditional paces that comprise media day on July 24, a bystander asked head coach Justin Hilton about senior running back Ethan Amyx.

"Look at him," Hilton remarked. "He fits the bill in a uniform. He needs to be the first one off the bus when we play on the road." Amyx figuratively drove the bus as West Ridge opened the season with a 30-13 thumping of Tennessee High on Aug. 22.

He amassed 158 yards on 27 carries with two touchdowns, including motoring to the end zone for a jaunt that covered 48 yards in the third quarter.

Fittingly sporting jersey No. 1, the 6-foot-1, 195-pound Amyx will be the first option for West Ridge's offense this season. He has put on about 20 pounds thanks to rigorous work in the weight room and can now bench press 340 pounds.

The 2025 season will be his third toting the rock for the Wolves.

"It feels like he's been here forever doesn't it?" Hilton said.

Opponents are probably saying the Amyx rushed for 581 yards on 103 attempts last season with seven touchdowns. "Amyx is a hard-nosed north-south runner," Hilton said. "He is a very good blocker as well.

West Ridge lost four of its last six games last season in missing out on the playoffs and that has provided plenty of incentive in his final goround. "It's my last year, so hopefully I can go out with a bang," Amyx said. "We were disappointed with how last season ended." Amyx will be running behind an experienced offensive line featuring the









likes of Morgan Thornton (6foot-1, 300 pounds, senior), Cal Tatum (6-3, 220, jr.), Kingston McConell (5-8, 285, jr.), Ethan Iacino (6-0, 250, sr.) and Nathan Arnold (6-2, 225, sr.).

The bunch from Blountville hope to finish strong this fall. The Wolves got off to a 3-1 start last season, but it was all downhill from there as they missed the playoffs. "[A] 5-5 [record] isn't what anybody wants," Hilton

said. "But I think there's been a refocus on discipline and a refocus on family. Our seniors met with us in November and set some goals and they're posted on the wall in there. A lot of it is centered around being team first."

Quarterback Trey Frazier and tight end Trent Tatum are now on the roster at Tusculum University and while their absence will be felt, West Ridge likes what
