## Little Bristol Needs to Embrace Big NHRA Show

he Super Grip NHRA
Thunder Valley Nationals at Bristol Dragway
represents big business,
major league competition
and civic pride.

From June 7-9, little
Bristol will again be under a
national spotlight as the top
stars and cars in drag racing
work their magic among
the green hills of Northeast
Tennessee.

While some area business and civic types have yet to grasp the lucrative big picture, fans and competitors know all about the rich history for stock cars, motocross, dirt tracks, kart racing and drag racing across the Mountain Empire.

Consider the comments of National Hot Rod Association Funny Car veteran Ron Capps from Carlsbad,

California.

"When you get off the plane in Bristol, the whole town is all about the race," Capps said. "You go to a restaurant, or a store, everybody knows you're in town.

"The newspaper, the front page of sports is about the race. I feed off that."

Capps knows the secret to success at the legendary Bristol Dragway layout. He holds the track record for Funny Cars victories with six, including two straight victories in the Super Grip Nationals.

Naturally, Capps is eager for another blast in Bristol.

"The Bristol fans are really into it," Capps said. "It's just a fun time, some of the best times I've had.

"It's like a good rock band showing up in a town and When you get off the plane in Bristol, the whole town is all about the race," Capps said. "You go to a restaurant, or a store, everybody knows you're in town.

the fans are waiting outside the tour bus. You're going to put on a good show."

The success story of Bristol Motor Speedway has been well documented across the region and nation, but the tales of Bristol Dragway are just as fascinating.

When the facility opened in 1965, is was cutting edge in all aspects.

Before the 1965 Spring Nationals at Thunder Valley, many drag races were staged on airport runways with bleacher seating.

Thanks to the bold vision of track founders Larry Carrier and Carl Moore, Bristol Dragway was a purpose-built masterpiece with expansive parking, massive concrete grandstands and a wide, smooth racing surface.

Carrier and Moore even constructed a four-story tower for officials, media and quests.

From radical rides to earth-sharing sounds and colorful characters, the first

NHRA national event held in the Southeast soon became a must-see experience.

The names have changed over the years, but the appeal of Thunder Valley is just as intoxicating.

Here's hoping every business owner in the surrounding Bristol area offers some sort of welcome message, banner or salute to NHRA and Bristol Dragway this week.

We're talking about major exposure here. Just imagine the cost of a national television, radio or print campaign showcasing images of the city and region.

Welcome to Bristol, NHRA. Little Bristol is ready for another big show. ◆

# Thunder Valley Nationals Return to Bristol

ustin Ashley (Top Fuel), Ron Capps (Funny Car), Erica Enders (Pro Stock) and Steve Johnson (Pro Stock Motorcycle) claimed titles in 2023 at Bristol Dragway and those drivers will again be under the spotlight for the 23rd annual Super Grip NHRA Thunder Valley Nationals. Capps claimed his second consecutive Super

ond consecutive Super Grip NHRA Thunder Valley Nationals crown last season when he defeated Alexis DeJoria in the final round.

If he wants to go three in a row, Capps must defeat the likes of early season points leader Austin Prock, Gainesville winner J.R. Todd, reigning series champ Matt Hagan, Bob Tasca and John Force.

With six victories,
Capps is the winningest
Funny Car driver at Bristol
Dragway.

Ashley enjoyed a weekend to remember in Bristol last year.

When the rain-delayed

NHRA New England Nationals had to be contested in Bristol, Ashley not only claimed the Epping title on Saturday, but he also went on to win the Bristol race.

Ashley won two races early this season. His competition includes defending series champion Doug Kalitta, two-time 2024 winner Shawn Langdon. and the Capco duo of Steve and Billy Torrence. Fans can also watch NASCAR legend Tony Stewart make his Bristol Top Fuel debut.

Enders, the reigning Pro Stock world champ, was winless until her Bristol breakthrough last season. The Super Grip NHRA Thunder Valley Nationals title was the turning point in her season, as she went on to win her sixth Pro Stock title.

Boosted by an earlyseason win in Gainesville, Enders is in the hunt again. The Pro Stock mix also includes earlyseason points leader and Enders' longtime rival

Greg Anderson along with Dallas Glenn, veteran driver Jeg Coughlin Jr., Aaron Stanfield and Cristian Cuadra.

Johnson, a veteran within the Pro Stock Motorcycle class, was one of only four race winners in 2023. He claimed his Bristol triumph over Gaige Herrera, who went red in the final round.

Herrera, who won 11

events last year, went on to claim the title in dominant fashion. He was just as dominant early this season.

Johnson is only the third motorcycle rider to win at Bristol Dragway, as the class was added to the Super Grip NHRA Thunder Valley Nationals in 2021. Other contenders include six-time champion Matt Smith,

former champ LE Tonglet, John Hall, Hector Arana Jr. and Angie Smith.

The fan-favorite Mission #2Fast2Tasty NHRA Challenge is scheduled for Saturday. Semifinalists from the NHRA New England Nationals, will meet up in Bristol for a specialty race rematch with the winners taking home bonus points and

a bonus purse.

The Super Grip NHRA Thunder Valley Nationals will also feature competition in the NHRA Lucas Oil Drag Racing Series, featuring some of the top racers in the country, as well as the Congruity NHRA Pro Mod Drag Racing Series presented by LearnEV+, Flexjet NHRA Factory Stock Showdown and Johnson's Horsepowered Garage Mountain Motor Pro Stock.

The weekend features an appearance from the Legends Nostalgia Nitro Funny Cars as well.

Fans will be invited to the Nitro Alley Stage all weekend, which features Nitro School, meet and greets, music and more. The festivities feature special pre-race ceremonies that celebrate each of the drivers racing for the Wally on Sunday and includes the fan favorite SealMaster Track Walk.

After final qualifying on Saturday, fans will be treated to an autograph session and fanfest at the Bristol Dragway welcome tent midway.

As always, fans also get an exclusive pit pass where they can watch teams service their hot rods between rounds and get autographs from their favorite drivers.

Fans can also visit NHRA's popular Nitro Alley and Manufacturers Midway, where sponsors and race vendors have interactive displays, simulated competitions, merchandise and food.

NHRA Mission Foods Drag Racing Series qualifying will feature two rounds at 4 and 6:45 p.m. on Friday, June 7, and the final two rounds of qualifying on Saturday, June 8 at 12:30 and 3:15 p.m.

Eliminations will begin at 12 p.m. on Sunday, June 9.

Television coverage includes qualifying action at 7 p.m. on Friday and

## Feel the Force

## John Force Returns to Bristol Dragway

otorsports fans of all types have a golden opportunity to witness history from June 7-9 at Bristol Dragway.

That's when the winningest driver in NHRA history makes another stop in Bristol for the Super Grip NHRA Thunder Valley Nationals.

Feel the Force.

Over the past four decades, John Force has delighted crowds with his magnetic personality, courage and uncanny skill.

At age 75, Force has ad-

mitted in recent interviews that his time is running short after 16 NHRA Funny Car world titles.

"I'm just facing the truth in life. I'm trying to hang on," Force said.

That narrative changed on April 7 when Forced powered to his 156th career NHRA victory and first in two years at Arizona's Firebird Motorsports Park in the completion of the postponed Lucas Oil NHRA Winternationals.

"All of sudden you win and

your personality just changes. Things went right, and I got the win, so I'm excited," Force said.

Force has won four times at Bristol Dragway, with the last triumph coming in 2013.

Win or lose, fans come out in droves to support their battle-tested superhero.

With Force on the marquee, there is no need for flashy television commercials or a screaming carnival barker to sell tickets or move merchandise.

From his trademark smoky

burnouts to his animated interviews, this former truck driver and high school quarterback from Yorba Linda, California, is a one-man marketing machine.

While four-time series champion Matt Hagan and young gun Austin Prock have led the Funny Car standings early this season, Force has remained in the mix.

Several times during his remarkable career, Force has been written off and counted out.

The secret power in this story is sheer willpower.

Through gruesome crashes, horrific injuries and financial setbacks, Force has been able to storm back off the canvas and re-invent himself better than any Transformer action figure.

The Force is strong and look for him to work more magic inside Thunder Valley.

## Hagan Claims 50th NHRA Victory

Matt Hagan spent
the first four races of
the NHRA season getting "back to where we
feel comfortable" after
what he described were
"wholesale changes" with
the motor and bellhousing in his Tony Stewart
Racing Funny Car.

The Christiansburg native hadn't tasted victory in those events despite reaching a pair of finals.

The fifth time was the charm for the four-time world champion.

Hagan, an Auburn
High School graduate,
recorded his 50th career
victory Sunday when he
outdueled three Funny
Car drivers in the final of
the 14th annual FourWide Nationals at zMAX
Dragway.

"It honestly is incredible. I never dreamed I'd be out here this long doing this for a living and being successful at it,"
Hagan said Monday in



a phone interview. "You always kind of start it off as, oh, this is going to be fun and we'll ride the wave as long as it'll last. Man, it's been close to 15 years now that I've been in a Funny Car. To have 50 wins, it's incred-

ible."

He joined John Force, Ron Capps and Robert Hight as the only drivers to reach the 50-win mark exclusively in a Funny Car. Hagan became the 24th driver in NHRA history to reach 50 career victories and the 16th to do so in pro classes.

Hagan won his fourth Funny Car world championship last year to join Force, Kenny Bernstein and Don Prudhomme as the only drivers to win that many titles. "To do that in today's age with the rules and just the regulations and the way they are, it's honestly incredible," Hagan said. "It's a huge testament to the team that's around me because they're such driven

individuals.

"I would love to sit here and tell you it's because I'm a great driver, but it's truly been about the guys that I put myself around and how smart they are and how driven and motivated they are and how

hard they work. I've just been kind of been riding their coattails.

"It's been an amazing career. If it ended tomorrow, to have 50 wins is incredible. To be in the ... ranks of Force and Don Prudhomme and Kenny Bernstein, that blows my mind."

The reigning Funny Car world champ beat Force, J.R. Todd and Daniel Wilkerson in the four-car final Sunday, turning in a time of 3.946 seconds at 332.34 mph in his 11,000-horsepower TSR Direct Connection Dodge/SRT Hellcat. Wilkerson was second.

"It puts a special little feather in your cap just knowing that you got to race the guy and beat one of the greatest that ever lived," Hagan said of beating Force, a 16-time Funny Car world champion.

Force edged Hagan to win the Winternationals. It was Force's record 156th NHRA victory.

"I've been able to battle it out with him for championships," Hagan said of Force. "... I have a lot of respect for him."

Hagan moved up to third in the Funny Car points standings with his first victory of the season. He is 32 points behind leader Austin Prock and 15 points behind Todd.

Hagan had three wins at this point one year ago, but his team made changes in the motor and bellhousing over the offseason. He said Monday that different things—such as weather- and track-related issues—prevented the team from getting the necessary number of test runs to iron out the kinks.

"Sometimes it takes some races to iron that stuff out," he said. "One thing about it, my guys are super smart, so they do a good job of ironing those combos out. We've got some of the best boys working on this thing that I wouldn't trade them for anybody. There's just nobody out there that I think are finer guys to wrench on these cars."

Hagan had speed in the first four races. He reached the quarterfinals at the season-opening Gatornationals, lost to Force in the final at the

Winternationals, advanced to the Round of 16 at the Arizona Nationals, and finished fourth in the final of the Four-Wide Nationals at The Strip at Las Vegas Motor Speedway.

## Antron Brown Looking for a Win at Bristol Dragway

ntron Brown has earned three NHRA Top Fuel world titles and recently pushed his career victory total to 75.
One piece of that resume remains missing.
The former Pro Stock Motorcycle racer has won at least one race at every NHRA facility except Bristol Dragway.

"That's a problem,"
Brown said. "I've always
loved this track and I've
always wanted to win
here."

Brown was in Bristol recently to promote the 23rd annual Super Grip NHRA Thunder Valley Nationals.

During a wide-ranging chat, Brown shared details of his many adventures on the unpredictable Thunder Valley layout.

"I have never cried in this sport, but I did cry here one year," Brown said.

The culprit was the infamous bump in the track surface located just before the finish line.

"I was beating Larry
Dixon in the final round
when I looked over at

Larry and hit that bump," Brown said. "I ended up hitting the parachute button by mistake and lost the race by two-thousandth of a second. Thank goodness, the track got new asphalt after that."

Brown experienced a highlight on May 19 in the NHRA Route 66 Nationals at Route 66 Raceway in Joliet, Illinois.

In an all-Toyota final round between two past

world champions, Brown delivered a 3.838-second charge at 324.75 in his Matco Tools dragster to finish ahead of Shawn Langdon.

In his post-race interview, Brown was presented with a large banner that signified his 75th victory.

"That made me feel old," Brown said. "It's one of those deals where you don't think about what you're accomplishing because you are always looking ahead to the next race."

At age 48, Brown is one of the most dynamic and driven drivers in the sport.

Where does he find that spark week after week?

"I tell people all the time that I'm 21 with 27 years of experience," Brown said. "We have a lot of fun doing what we do."

Brown dedicated the

Route 66 triumph to his former team owner and mentor Don Schumacher, who died in December following a cancer battle.

Following the path of Schumacher, Brown formed his own singlecar AB Motorsports operation three years ago.

"I had been winning a lot of races for teams and I got tired of seeing all the changes in terms of crew chiefs and crew members," Brown said. "I wanted a more stable foundation, so I took a chance and went out of my own. It's been a lot of hard work, but it's been rewarding."

The victory total for Brown includes 16 victories in Pro Stock Motorcycle.

"I stay humble, and I'm always hungry for the next win," Brown said.

Next stop, Thunder Valley.

"I've qualified number one here numerous times, but I've never won a race," Brown said. "We're gonna try to make that happen this year." Page 12



## Driver Changes for 2024

he NHRA Mission

Series features a new
mix of stars and teams
for the 2024 season.
Following is a glance
at some of top drivers
and their plans:

Tony Stewart, Top
Fuel: The legendary has
made his debut in Top
Fuel, as his wife, Leah
Pruett, stepped out of
the seat and the couple
plans to start a family.
The former NASCAR and
IndyCar world champ
was successful in the Top
Alcohol Dragster ranks
last year and is set for
another huge move in
2024.

Shawn Reed, Top Fuel: Reed returned to the Top Fuel ranks after several years away. He'll be a full-time driver as the owner/driver of Shawn Reed Racing, but it's not the only big step in his career. Reed

will also have a technical and advancement alliance with three-time world champ Antron Brown, giving Reed a strong path to success next year.

lda Zetterstrom, Top Fuel: The European Top Fuel champ has moved to NHRA as a part of JCM Racing. The Finnish standout plans to run a limited schedule - with the aim to go full-time in 2025 - and she brings a huge amount of fanfare and excitement with the announcement. Zetterstrom is already a popular name in the racing world, bringing plenty of anticipation for her 2024 debut in the NHRA ranks.

Jacob McNeal, Top Fuel: McNeal made his Top Fuel debut in 2023, racing four times with Scott Palmer Racing, but he took it a step further this off-season. McNeal

is now a Top Fuel team owner and is set to compete in eight races. He purchased the Top Fuel operation of Buddy Hull and will work with crew chief Mike Guger in a move he called a dream come true.

Jasmine Salinas,
Top Fuel: A successful
driver in the Top Alcohol
Dragster ranks, Salinas
will follow her father,
Mike, in a talent-heavy
Top Fuel category, with
her sister, Jianna, a
standout in Pro Stock
Motorcycle.

Travis Shumake,
Top Fuel: Shumake took
a number of big steps in
his career last year earning his Top Fuel license,
taking delivering of his
truck and hauler, and
moving into a race shop
in Indy.

Buddy Hull, Funny Car: After starting his

## 50 Years Ago at Thunder Valley: Funk a record-smashing winner in Top Fuel

t was the weekend of June 14-16, 1974, when then-Bristol International Dragway hosted its tenth annual Sprina Nationals. The race was the fourth at Thunder Vallev under the International Hot Rod Association banner and it proved to be one of the largest, loudest and most unpredictable events in the track's colorful history.

Post-event media coverage reported that 104,500 people packed into the track that week-

end and -- while that number may be inflated - the race remains one of the most talked about in Bristol's 59-vear history.

In part for the way that Dale Funk captured Top Fuel eliminator.

While the true attendance may forever be unknown, photographs of the event prove the place was packed and crowds were standing room only both Saturday and Sunday, Impressive since it came on the heels of a national energy crisis where gasoline was both expensive and in short supply.

By comparison, that season's Daytona 500 attendance was reported as 85,000, Charlotte's World 600 reported 84,000 attendees and Bristol's two NASCAR races combined to attract an estimated 38,000 people.

Funk, of Radcliff, Ky., hadn't planned to run the Bristol event, despite winning the seasonopening IHRA Southern

Nationals held on pit road of Charlotte Motor Speedway in mid-April. That win came behind the wheel of Richard Holcomb's borrowed car because Funk, car owner Bill English and crew chief Robert Frakes had just taken delivery of a new Stebbins Engineering-built rear engine dragster which didn't yet have an engine.

However, when fellow racer John "Tarzan" Austin made a last minute offer to loan the team

one of his engines, they quickly buttoned up the car – finishing Saturday morning, loaded it into the trailer and hit the road for Bristol – some six hours away.

Arriving on Saturday evening they hurriedly unloaded and headed to the staging lanes with just enough time to make one qualifying pass.

On its maiden voyage down the Bristol quartermile, the new machine with its still unpainted, unlettered aluminum body panels ran 6.404 seconds to qualify 13th in the 16-car field, which would became the quickest in Bristol's tenyear history at the time.

Among those who failed to make the cut and 6.43-second bump spot was star driver "T.V." Tommy Ivo.

Atop the field, Clayton Harris was the number one qualifier with a new track record 6.09-second elapsed time followed by "Big Daddy" Don Garlits, who also needed some late Saturday heroics to run 6.22 at 225 mph and squeeze into the second spot.

Race day offered up overcast skies, the threat of rain accompanied by high humidity but a pleasant high temperature of 81 degrees. With an estimated 50,000 looking on, the tricky weather conditions combined to produce a rash of upsets including both Garlits and Harris bowing out in the opening round.

A fresh tuneup saw Funk produce a first round 6.25 that sent

opponent Sam Miller to the trailer. In round two, he used a 6.24 to down Oklahoma TV repairman Marvin "Who" Graham [who would go on to the win the NHRA U.S. Nationals later that year]. Funk's semifinal 6.13 propelled the new machine past the machine of Tim Murphy and crew chief Tim Beebe and into the finals opposite Sarge Arciero, driving the potent "Jade Gre-

nade" dragster.

## Drag Racing Made Simple

he pulse-pounding sport of drag racing is a thrilling acceleration contest between two vehicles racing from a standing start over a straight course.

Top Fuel dragsters and Funny Cars compete in a race distance of 1,000 feet; Pro Stock and Pro Stock Motorcycle compete in a race distance of 1,320 feet.

An NHRA Mission Foods
Drag Racing Series event
s made up of a series
of individual two-vehicle
races called eliminarions, with competing
machines divided into
four categories: Top Fuel,
Funny Car, Pro Stock,
and Pro Stock Motorcycle.

Class eligibility is governed by criteria that imits engine size, type of fuel, vehicle weight, allowable modifications and aerodynamics. The object is to get to the finish line first, which may not necessarily be the vehicle with the quickest time or fastest speed.

Sound confusing? It really isn't. A set of lights, called a Christmas Tree, s used at the starting ine. There is a 0.4-sectord difference between the flash of all the amber

lights and the flash of the green light in the pro start system.

Anytime a driver leaves the lines before the green, the red light illuminates to signal a foul. That offending driver is disqualified. A driver can win despite a slower elapsed time and speed than his or her opponent.

That's because the winning driver had a quicker reaction time to the green light at the starting line, and that advantage was greater than his or her opponent's performance advantage on the track. Remember, the elapsed-time clock in each lane doesn't start until the vehicle moves past the starting line.

The 11,000-horsepower, nitromethane[1]burning Top Fuel dragsters are the quickest-accelerating machines on earth, going from a still position to 100 mph in less than one second. They are powered by supercharged, custom-built, 500-cubic-inch engines mounted behind the driver. Two parachutes, which are activated by a hand control inside the cockpit, are the car's primary braking system.

Funny Cars are short-

wheelbased cars with a carbon fiber replica of a production car body. The engines are identical to those that power Top Fuel machines, with one noticeable difference - they are



Body styles allowed in competition are model year 2000 or newer two-door sports cars, coupes, or sedan bodies of a type originally mass-produced by an automobile manufacturer, foreign or

In the 1,000-foot race distance, Top Fuel dragsters and Funny Cars are capable of elapsed times in the high threesecond to low-four-second range, at speeds faster than 330 mph. Top Fuel records entering 2024 are 3.623-seconds and 338.94 mph, both set by Brittany Force. She made the fastest run dur-



While working to retain a close resemblance to their showroom counterparts, Pro Stock cars feature extensive engine modifications, sophisticated chassis and suspension development and a maximum 500-cubic-inch engine displacement.

Pro Stock cars must be 2005 or newer twodoor or four-door coupes or sedans. All cars use electronically controlled fuel injection systems and feature an NHRAcontrolled 10,500 Rev Limiter. Entering the 2024 season, six-time world champ Erica Enders owns both ends of the world record, going 6.450 in 2022 in Gainesville and 215.55 mph in 2014.

The Pro Stock Motorcy-cle category is reserved for 1998 or newer stock-appearing, carbureted or electronic fuel injected, gasoline-burning machines. Gaige Herrera made the quickest run in class history last year, going 6.627 in Dallas, while Matt Smith's 205.04 in Sonoma in 2021 is the fastest run.







#### TRACK HISTORY

Bristol Dragway opened in 1965 under NHRA sanction. NHRA left Bristol in 1967. In 1996, Bruton Smith bought Bristol Dragway and closed the facility after the 1997 season to begin work on the current \$18 million facility.

The facility reopened for the 1999 season and hosted the inaugural NHRA All-Star event that year and again in 2000.

In 2001, Bristol Dragway hosted the NHRA Thunder Valley Nationals, the first NHRA national event held at Bristol Dragway since 1967.

After hosting its annual NHRA event during the early spring months of April and May for several years, the 2010 edition of the NHRA Thunder Valley Nationals moved to Father's Day weekend. The new date proved very popular with race fans and prompted NHRA officials to keep the race on the same mid-June date.

While many drag strips have come and gone, Bristol Dragway has stood the test of time. With its unique surroundings and colorful history, it is one of the ultimate destinations in the world of drag racing.
