## **Ohio State Highway Patrol Vehicle Struck on US 33 in Mercer County**

Wapakoneta – At approximately 7:30 p.m. on Monday, October 26, 2020, Trooper R. LaMarr from the Wapakoneta Post was sitting on the side of US 33 with the emergency lights activated completing a prior traffic stop. A westbound 2001 Dodge Neon drifted off the right side of the roadway and struck the rear of the patrol car. Both vehicles came to rest, off the right side of the road.

Both drivers were transported to Joint Township District Memorial Hospital in St. Mary's, Ohio by squad for treatment.

Trooper LaMarr was treated and released from the hospital and the driver of the Dodge Neon remained hospitalized at the time of the media release.

Drug impairment is suspected in the crash.

Trooper LaMarr was wearing a seatbelt at the time of the crash. It is unknown at this time if the driver of the Dodge Neon was using a seatbelt.

The crash remains under investigation. Updates will be provided once they are obtained.

The Highway Patrol was assisted at the scene by the Mercer County Sheriff's Office, Celina Fire Department and EMS, Mercer County EMS, Mendon Fire Department, MCERV, Miller Towing and Lakeshore Towing.

***Update 10/29/2020: The driver of the Dodge Neon has been identified as Scott B. Revolt, age 57, of Celina, Ohio. Mr. Revolt was transported from Joint Township District Memorial Hospital in St. Marys, Ohio to the Ohio State University Medical Center in Columbus, Ohio for treatment of his injuries.***
