In 2015, the ONU HealthWise Mobile Health Clinic was established to help support the extensive health needs of a rural community suffering from poverty and lack of access to care. Through a grant provided by HRSA (Health Resources and Services Administration), a 38-foot bus was developed to travel around Hardin County to provide medication therapy management, routine screenings and immunizations free of charge to community members. Since its establishment, ONU HealthWise has built partnerships with the Kenton Community Health Center, Kenton-Hardin Health Department, Hardin Memorial Hospital and many others.
