The Nutrition Assistance Program for Seniors has openings in International Falls and surrounding area. The NAPS program is a free food program for low income seniors, 60 or older. The United States Department of Agriculture program distributes canned fruits and vegetables, juice, milk, cheese, cereal, rice, pasta, meat and peanut butter. Must be residents of

Minnesota and meet Federal Income Guidelines in order to qualify. NAPS distribution is from 1:30 to 3 p.m. the first Thursday after the first Tuesday at Falls Hunger Coalition, 1000 Fifth St. Registration is available on-site during the distribution, or pre-register by calling Second Harvest North Central Food Bank at 218-326-4420, ext. 22. Have gross monthly household income information available when applying. Applicants must provide proof of name, date of birth and address at first appointment.
