Fort Frances man in custody

The Rainy River District Detachment of the Ontario Provincial Police took a man into custody Saturday after he surrendered to police.

The police responded to a disturbance at a residence located at the 1000 block of First Street in Fort Frances where Bobby Joe Wilson, 33, Fort Frances, refused to comply with police direction, returned to the residence and discharged a firearm.

Police moved to safety and contained the surrounding area. Residents within a perimeter were directed to leave their homes to ensure the safety of everyone until the incident came to a conclusion.

A number of specialty units were summonsed to assist the local detachment members with this inves-

tigation including Crisis Negotiators.

“During this incident, as a part of the emergency response, the crisis negotiators assisted in the peaceful surrender of this individual with the utmost regard for the safety of all involved,” said Constable Anne McCoy, media relations officer. “These specially trained officers have expertise to resolve conflict through verbal/non-verbal communications.”

As a result of this response, Wilson exited the residence and was arrested. He has been remanded into custody with his next court appearance set for Friday. He has been charged with use of a firearm in the commission of an offense; careless use of a firearm, and discharge of a firearm with intent to endanger life.
