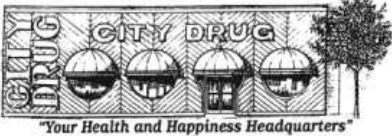

## ADVERTISEMENT FOR BIDS CITY OF INTERNATIONAL FALLS AUTOMATIC METER READING SYSTEM INTERNATIONAL FALLS, MINNESOTA

Separate sealed BIDS for the furnishing of all labor, materials and equipment for the **City of International Falls Automatic Meter Reading System** will be received by the City of International Falls, Minnesota until the hour of 1:15pm on Wednesday, September 10, 2014, in the office of the Deputy City Administrator, 600 4<sup>th</sup> Street, International Falls, MN. At such time they will be publicly opened in the City Council Chambers and read aloud.

The proposed work includes, but is not limited to the following major items;

- Completely operational two-way migrateable radio frequency advanced meter reading (AMR)/ advanced metering infrastructure (AMI) system which is compatible with & capable of migrating to the City's fixed based Caselle/Sensus metering program.
- A migrateable meter reading vehicle based AMR system with laptop and software compatible with the City's Sensus metering system.
- One (1) handheld meter reading and end point installation device capable of capturing the GPS locations for all of the City's water meter locations. Unit shall be capable to be used as an installation and testing tool and compatible with City's metering system.
- Mapping module/software system capable of handling the City's water meter distribution area.
- System shall be compatible with the City's existing water records accounting system, capable of producing the operation and accounting reports as required by the City. A minimum of two (2) days, with a maximum of four (4) days on-site start-up services and training shall be provided.
- Furnishing of 2800 radio transceivers which provide inbound and outbound access to water measurement and are compatible with the City's Sensus metering system.

The CONTRACT DOCUMENTS may be examined and are available at the office of Betty Bergstrom, Deputy City Administrator, located at 600 4th Street, in the International Falls Municipal Building.

Pre-bid approval by the City of all materials, equipment and software proposed to be bid shall be a prerequisite to bidding.

The City reserves the right to waive any informalities, to reject any or all bids and to accept the bid considered to be most advantageous to the City.

No bidder may withdraw his bid within (60) sixty days after the actual date of opening thereof.

Each bid shall be accompanied by a bid bond or certified check in an amount equal to five percent (5%) of the total amount of the bid, made payable without condition to the City of International Falls, as a guarantee that the bidder, if awarded the contract, will promptly execute the agreement in accordance with the bid and other contract documents.

## Littlefork Council discusses projects

The Littlefork City Council Thursday decided to seek new bids for a roofing project in the spring in order to save money.

After opening bids to renovate the roof at the municipally-owned Littlefork Medical Center, city Administrator Sonja Pelland said the low bidder couldn't complete the project until spring. Instead of awarding the project now, she said the council decided to wait

until spring, which could save the city about \$90,000 on the project.

The new roof at the LMC has been the top priority of the three new capital improvement projects, Pelland said. The other projects involve a new heating system and new information technology system. Bidding in the spring would also bring more bidders, she said.

"It will save some money, and the engineers and project managers said they can get by with some patching this fall," Pelland said.

In other business, the council discussed expanding the scope of a water/sewer project to give the project a better chance of receiving grant funding.

John Mattonen of JPJ Engineering is working with the city on a water/sewer project city officials hope to undertake in 2015. The more than \$1 million project would replace water and sewer mains on Fourth Avenue, Sixth Avenue, and Central Road, as well as some interior piping and valves at the water treatment plant.

Pelland said the initial plan didn't qualify for funding from the U.S. Department of Agriculture Rural Development Water and Environmental program, so the council discussed expanding the scope of the project and reapplying in an effort to improve the chances of approval.

"The chances of qualifying would be better, and the costs could be spread out longer over more years," Pelland said. "It would also have a smaller impact on people, as well."

## DISTRICT COURT

The following people have been sentenced for aggravated misdemeanor or felony crimes in Koochiching County District Court.

**Cody S. Hanson**, 37, International Falls, was sentenced Aug. 11 for felony fifth-degree possession of drugs.

He was given a stay of imposition of sentence and placed on five years supervised probation. He was ordered to serve 30 days jail and pay \$200 fine and fees. He was ordered not to use alcohol or drugs and may not enter places where it is being sold or served. He may not use or possess firearms or dangerous weapons and must serve 40 hours with the Sentence to Serve program.

**Natalie Gauthier**, 35, Pointe-Aux, Quebec, Canada, was sentenced Aug. 6 for felony fifth-degree possession of drugs.

She was give a stay of adjudication of sentence and placed on three years probation to the court. She was ordered to pay \$1,000 in court fees.

**Keith Horne**, 54, International Falls, was sentenced Aug. 11 for felony theft — take, use, transfer movable property without consent.

He was given a stay of adjudication of sentence and placed on 10 years supervised probation. He was ordered to pay a \$100 fine and \$7,937 restitution. He may not leave the state without written court approval.

**Tracy L. Nuthak**, 49, Ray, was sentenced Aug. 11 for felony second-degree assault.

She was ordered to pay \$3,275 fine and fees, of which all but \$375 was stayed on court conditions. She was placed on two years supervised probation. She was ordered not to consume alcohol and drugs and may not enter bars or liquor stores except

for work purposes. She must submit to random searches and tests and must complete aftercare.

**Acacia A. Dault**, 26, International Falls, was sentenced Aug. 11 for gross misdemeanor third-degree damage to property and gross misdemeanor driving while intoxicated — refusal to submit to a chemical test.

On the property damage, she was sentenced to one year jail and \$3,150 fine and fees and \$500 restitution. All but 30 days and \$200 of the fine and fees was stayed on court conditions. She was placed on three years supervised probation and ordered to serve 80 hours with the Sentence to Serve program. The sentence is to be served concurrent with the following sentence.

On the DWI, she was sentenced to one yer jail and \$4,125 fine and fees. All but 30 days and \$2,125 was stayed and she was placed on three years supervised probation.

She was ordered not to leave the state without court approval and may not use drugs and alcohol and may not enter placed where alcohol is served. She must submit to random tests and searches and serve 80 hours with the Sentence to Serve program. She must follow the recommendations of a chemical assessment.

**Blake A. Museta**, 22, International Falls, was sentenced Aug. 11 for felony bring, send, introduce, possess contraband in a jail and gross misdemeanor fifth-degree assault.

On the contraband charge, he was sentenced to 60 days jail and \$475 fine and fees. He was placed on five years supervised probation and ordered to follow the recommendations of a chemical evaluation and may not use alcohol or drugs or enter places where it is being sold.

He must submit to random tests and searches.

On the assault, he was sentenced to 20 days jail and \$200 fine and fees. He was ordered to follow the recommendations of a domestic abuse evaluation. The sentence is to be served concurrent with a previous sentence.

**Douglas Ramsey**, 34, International Falls, was sentenced Aug. 11 for gross misdemeanor driving while intoxicated.

He was sentenced to one year jail and \$4,200. All but \$2,200 and 30 days was stayed on court conditions and he was placed on two years supervised probation. He was ordered not to enter places where alcohol is consumed and must submit to random searches. He must follow the recommendations of a chemical assessment and serve 76 hours with the Sentence to Serve program.

**David M. Johnson**, 23, International Falls, was sentenced Aug. 11 for gross misdemeanor domestic assault — subsequent violation.

He was sentenced to 90 days jail and \$1,150 fine and fees. The jail time and all but \$200 was stayed on court conditions and he was placed on two years supervised probation. He must serve 40 hours with the Sentence to Serve program.

**Mark F. Sperry**, 30, International Falls, was sentenced Aug. 11 for gross misdemeanor driving while intoxicated.

He was sentenced to one year jail and \$4,325 fine and fees. All but 45 days and \$2,025 was stayed on court conditions and he was placed on three years supervised probation. He was ordered to follow the recommendations of a chemical assessments and may not use drugs or alcohol or enter places where it is used or sold. He must

submit to random tests and and serve 80 hours with the Sentence to Serve program.

**Andrew S. Eldien**, 33, International Falls, was sentenced Aug. 11 for gross misdemeanor driving while intoxicated.

He was sentenced to one year jail and \$4,125 fine and fees. All but 30 days and \$2,125 was stayed on court conditions and he was placed on two years supervised probation. He was ordered not to use alcohol or enter places where it is sold. He must follow the recommendations of a chemical assessment and submit to random tests. He was ordered to serve 80 hours with the Sentence to Serve program.

**Cody M. Helderman**, 23, International Falls, was sentenced Aug. 11 for gross misdemeanor driving while intoxicated.

He was sentenced to one year jail and \$4,125 fine and fees. All but 30 days jail and \$2,125 was stayed on court conditions and he was placed on three years supervised probation. He was ordered not to consume alcohol and drugs and may not enter places where it is sold. He must submit to random tests and complete a chemical assessment. He was ordered to serve 80 hours with the Sentence to Serve program.

**Jeremiah L. McCormick**, 33, was sentenced Aug. 11 for gross misdemeanor driving while intoxicated.

He as sentenced to one year jail and \$4,125 fine and fees. All but 30 days and \$2,125 was stayed on court conditions and he was placed on three years supervised probation. He was ordered not to use alcohol or enter places where it is sold and must submit to random tests. He must follow after care recommendations and serve 80 hours with the Sentence to Serve program.
