Regional history comes to life

Regional history will be brought to life at 1 p.m. July 8 at the International Falls Public Library with Cuyler Adams, the original Iron Ranger.

The free program offered by the Arrowhead Library System, features Adams, one of the original discoverers and promoters of exploration on the Cuyuna Range. The name Cuyuna is a combination of the names of Adams and his dog, Una, who accompanied him on his prospecting trips. Thus, “Cuy-Una”.

Adams lives on at the Minnesota Discovery Center through songwriter and storyteller Richie John-

son. As he visits libraries, he will share information about the lands, the mines, the people and the work that made the iron ore ranges historic and special. In this program, audiences can expect to learn about his life, see and touch real historical logging and mining equipment.

Adams and Una will bring Iron Range history to life through stories, songs and games in this interactive journey of discovery.

Health clinic shows off new name

New signage installed Monday helped a local health care facility break in a new name this week.

Essentia Health-International Falls Clinic at 2501 Keenan Drive, formerly associated with Rainy Lake Medical Center, installed a new sign in front of the building, to emphasize the clinic’s new name.

“We want people to know that, while we will no longer be affiliated with RLMC, our patients don’t have to be concerned,” Michael Motley, Essentia Health vice president of regional operations, said in a release. “We are committed to serving the community,

offering the highest-quality, cost-effective care.”

According to the release, the clinic still offers the same procedures, with all of the same medical professionals patients are familiar with. The clinic also hired an additional nurse practitioner and physician assistant to better serve the community’s needs and continues to offer same-day access for patients.

“The International Falls community has come to know and love the staff here at the clinic,” Dr. Anthony Stone, Essentia Health physician, said in the release. “We not only work here, we are part of the community. We are your neighbors and care deeply for the community we call home.”

The International Falls Clinic provides primary and specialty care to residents of International Falls and the surrounding area, and also offers an on-site retail pharmacy. The clinic is open 8 a.m.-5 p.m. Monday-Friday, and patients can call 283-9431 to schedule an appointment.

To help celebrate the transition, the clinic is also hosting a community ice cream social July 8. The “King of Cream” ice cream truck from Duluth will be parked at the clinic from noon-1:30 p.m., and then will head out to neighborhoods to deliver ice cream treats to the community until 6:30 p.m. To track the truck’s location, visit www.thekingofcreams.com.

DISTRICT COURT

The following people have been sentenced for aggravated misdemeanor or felony crimes in Koochiching County District Court.

**Adam E. Ames**, 21, International Falls, was sentenced June 20 for felony fifth-degree possession of drugs.

He was given a stay of imposition of sentence and placed on five years supervised probation. He was ordered to serve 11 days jail and enroll in Borderland Substance Abuse Court.

**Keith Horne**, 54, International Falls, was sentenced June 16 for felony theft—take, use, transfer movable property without consent.

He was given a stay of adjudication and placed on 10 years supervised probation. He was ordered to pay \$100 court fees and may not leave Minnesota without court approval.

**Dwayne C. Mannausau**, 64, International Falls, was

sentenced June 16 for gross misdemeanor driving under the influence.

He was sentenced to one year jail; all but two days of the jail time were stayed on court conditions. He was placed on one year of supervised probation and ordered to enroll in the Borderland Substance Abuse Court and pay fees.

**Kelly M. Frank**, 39, International Falls, was sentenced June 17 for gross misdemeanor driving while intoxicated.

She was sentenced to one year jail and \$4,125 fine and fees. All but 30 days of the jail time and \$1,625 fine and fees was stayed on court conditions and she was placed on two years of supervised probation.

She may serve the jail time on home detention electronic monitoring. She may not use alcohol or enter places where it is being sold or used. She must submit to random tests and

follow the recommendations of a chemical assessment. She must serve 40 hours with the Sentence to Serve program.

**Kyle F. Burmeister**, 22, Crookston, was sentenced June 17 for gross misdemeanor driving while intoxicated.

He was sentenced to one year jail and \$4,125 fine and fees. All but 30 days jail and \$2,125 was stayed on court conditions and he was placed on three years supervised probation. He may not enter bars or liquor stores, must submit to random tests and searches, may not leave Minnesota without court approval and must serve 80 hours with the Sentence to Serve program.

**John E. Lund**, 57, Big Falls, was sentenced June 16 for gross misdemeanor driving while intoxicated — refusal to submit to chemical test.

He was sentenced to one year jail, with 115 days stayed. He was given credit for 56 days served. The sentence is to be served concurrent and consecutive to other sentences.
