*Explorer: The Mystery Boxes* is a graphic

collection of seven short tales of mysterious boxes with marvels or maybe mayhem inside. The collection is edited by Kazu Kibuishi and is delightful.

The newer reader may want to take a look at our easy dinosaur readers, including several new titles about *Tyrannosaurus Rex*, *Oviraptor*, *Stegosaurus* and more all by Wil Mara. Tiny Titans is an easy reader graphic novel series about Sidekick City Elementary where the teachers are super-villians and the field trips are out of this world.

We’ve had a couple of requests for Freddie Fernortner Fearless First Grader books so we picked up a few including *Mr. Chewy’s Big Adventure*, all by Johnathan Rand.


