International Falls Public School Nurse Sue Palm maintained the importance of making sure students are fully vaccinated for preventable diseases they may be susceptible to when

they enter school. A recent study released by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention reports 96 percent of Minnesota kindergartners entered school fully vaccinated.
