Notice of relocation of sex offender

JOURNAL STAFF REPORT

The International Falls Police Department is notifying the public of a sex offender who is moving to a new address within the city of International Falls. Tony Ray Arguello Jr., 26, has been designated by the state as a level three — high risk — offender. He has moved from previous residence in Hibbing to the 100 block area of Riverview Boulevard. Arguello has a history of sexual contact with victims, male and female, ages 4 and 15. Contact included penetration. Arguello was known to victims. Arguello has completed a term in prison. He has an offense history that includes, at a minimum, an

offense that requires registration as a predatory offender according to Minnesota Statutes 243.166. According to all of the information known to the Minnesota Department of Corrections, Arguello is not wanted by law enforcement. This information is provided to the public to enhance public safety through knowledge of the offender's general area of residence.
