Library has more than just books

Use the library and all its resources. The library has more than books these days. And even our books come in many formats, we have hardcover books, paperback books, large print books. We also offer audio books on compact disc and a few cassette tapes are still available.

And that is just the physical items, we also provide access to a large collection of downloadable e-books and audiobooks compatible with most electronic devices. And books are for all ages, from young babies (hope everyone saw that the American Academy of Pediatrics recommends that doctors all tell parents to read to children beginning at birth) to senior citizens and everyone in between.

The library subscribes to almost 100 physical magazines and over 80 digital magazines including "Taste of Home," "The Artist's Magazine" and "Popular Mechanics." We have

over 3,000 DVDs ranging from educational titles like "Bill Nye the Science Guy: Atoms" and "Art Classic Stories: classic tales in the art style of famous artists" to thought provoking documentaries like "Paper Clips" or "Food Inc." to classic movies like "A Summer Place" or "Lilies of the Field" to blockbusters like "Wolf of Wall Street" or "Free Birds."

The library has a self-service copy machine with copies available for 15 cents a copy. During tax season we carry tax forms as available. A variety of regional and

national newspapers are carried by the library including back issues of the International Falls Journal.

We offer four desktop computers that may be utilized for up to one hour a day to create documents or search the Internet. We also have four laptops that can be used in the building for those with a driver's license. The building is equipped with free wireless Internet access, available anytime with no password.

And for those who are reliant on the information provided by their smart phone or other electronic device, be sure and check out the library resources available online. The library website can be found at <http://internationalfallslibrary.us>. From here you can access the digital magazines, digital audiobooks and e-books as well as all our online resources found on the "Resources" page.

You can search for magazine and newspaper

articles when working on a research paper, many of the articles are included digitally and can be accessed directly from your computer or smart phone. The library subscribes to "Home Improvement and Repair," "Legal Forms," "Powerspeak," "Career Transitions," "Valueline Investment Survey," "Consumer Reports" and "Price-It."

These resources may be accessed all day, every day as long as you know our password and userid, which can be obtained by calling the library or coming to the main desk.

Join us Tuesday, July 8, at 1 p.m. for History Player Cuyler Adams. He will re-enact the story of his discovery of the Iron Range, specifically Cuyuna Range. This will be a great afternoon of history and drama.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the period for filing affidavits of candidacy for the office of school board member of Independent School District No. 361 shall begin on July 29, 2014 and shall close at 5:00 o'clock p.m. on August 12, 2014.
