Workshops aim to promote highland dance

There aren't many opportunities in Borderland to learn to dance the Scottish Lilt, Highland Fling and Flora MacDonald's Fancy.

People of all skill levels can learn these dances and more Saturday and Sunday during free workshops presented by the Fort Frances Highlanders Pipes and Drums to help promote highland dance.

"Part of the Fort Frances Highlanders' mandate is we are a teaching organization," Pipe Major Bruce Lidkea said. "Certainly over the last several years we've been teaching lots of pipes and drums and now it's time to give a little bit more to our dance team."

Workshops will be held at the Masonic Hall, 302 Scott Street in Fort Frances, and taught by George Hamilton, a member of the Scottish Dance Teachers Alliance.

According to Lidkea, the Highlanders are hoping the workshops will give people the opportunity to learn and appreciate highland dance.

"It's a great way for our current highland dancers to improve, but it's also a great way to bring new members into our highland dance group," he said.

The program highlights photography of exotic birds, flowers and scenes from around the world plus hints on turning your photos into artistic masterpieces. Questions are encouraged during a program exploring the capture of nature with a camera, presented by writer/photographer, Blanch.

Blanch will take attendees through his exotic pho-

tographs from Ecuadorian sword-billed hummingbirds to colorful Puerto Rican Palms, to the tranquil setting of a Japanese reflecting garden. His collection represents many years of travel, through gardens, prairies, jungles, cloud forests and mountain regions throughout the world, according to a release.

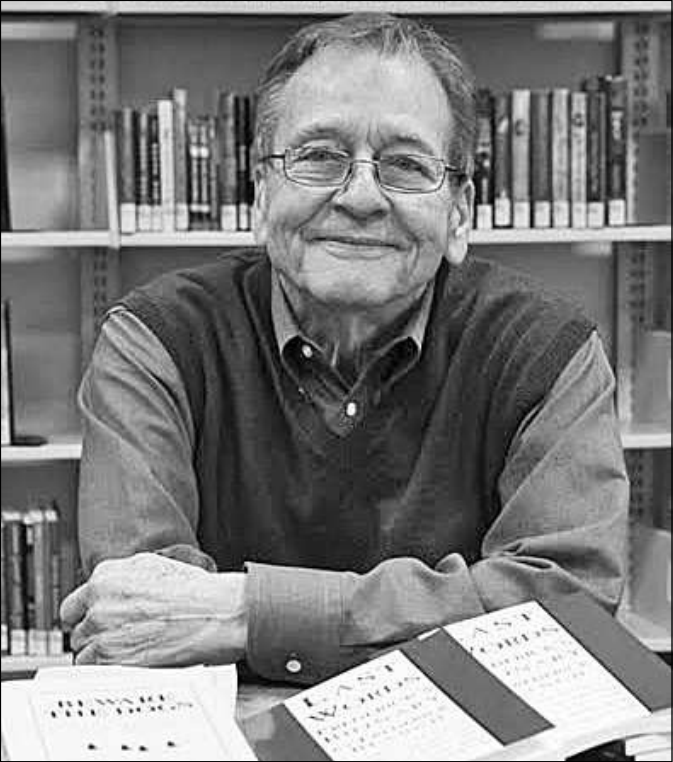


