Don moved his family to Janesville, Wis., in 1965 to start an exciting career in aviation.

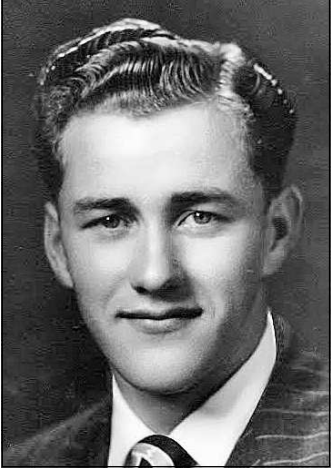
He retired as a president of Omniflight Aviation in 1991.

International until he ultimately fully-retired to Flagstaff in 2009.

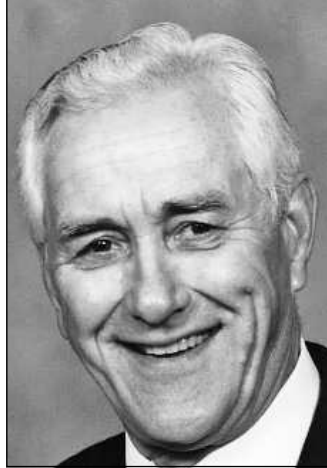
