Canada geese concerns voiced

Does International Falls have a Canada geese problem? Councilor Cynthia Jaksa reported to the International Falls City Council she is hearing concerns

and complaints about the number of geese in residential areas.

City Attorney Steve Shermoen said the problem may stem from a desire by some residents to feed the geese passing through the area in spring and fall as

they migrate.

Jaksa said she'd like more discussion on a solution that could involve netting and butchering the geese to provide to a local food shelf. Another remedy, she said she's heard about involves feeding geese a

certain kind of food that makes them constipated, prompting flight to alleviate their discomfort.

"This is no laughing matter," she said smiling, when some councilors and audience members stifled laughter.

Lane sentenced in Koerters Amoco robbery

A former International Falls man was sentenced this week to more than seven years in prison for the armed robbery of Koerters Amoco in January.

Jeffrey A. Lane, 26, East Grand Forks, was arrested about a week after the robbery Jan. 28, when he entered Koerters Amoco, 1601 Second Ave. W., produced a knife and demanded money from the cash register.

Lane was sentenced in Koochiching County District Court Oct. 20 to 93 months at the Minnesota Correctional Facility, St. Cloud, for felony first-degree aggravated robbery by District Judge Charles LeDuc.

The 93 months prison was stayed on court conditions. Koochiching County At-

torney Jeff Naglosky said Lane was ordered to serve 160 days jail and was given credit for 107 days served in the Koochiching County Jail.

Lane was ordered to pay \$1,204 fine and fees, was placed on 10 years supervised probation and ordered to pay restitution.

He may have no contact with Koerters Amoco, but was ordered to write a letter of apology.

He was ordered to work 120 hours with the Sentence to Serve program and may not use alcohol or drugs and may not enter bars or liquor stores. He must submit to random tests and searches.

Meanwhile, the following people have been sentenced for aggravated misdemeanor or felony crimes in Koochiching County

District Court. The information is provided to The Journal by court staff.

Derek L. Black, 31, International Falls, was sentenced Oct. 20 for felony violate no contact order — within 10 years of the first of two or more convictions.

He was sentenced to 21 months at the Minnesota Correctional Facility, St. Cloud, which was stayed on court conditions. He was ordered to one year jail and placed on supervised probation for five years.

Misty V. Slatinski, 37, Littlefork, was sentenced Oct. 20 for gross misdemeanor obstruct legal process.

She was sentenced to one year jail and \$3,100 fine and fees. The jail time and all but \$300 were stayed on court conditions and she

was placed on three years supervised probation. She was ordered to follow the recommendations of an assessment and evaluation and may not use alcohol or drugs or enter bars or liquor stores. She must submit to random tests and searches.

Amanda R. Novotny, 35, International Falls, was sentenced Oct. 20 for gross misdemeanor driving after cancellation of license — posing a threat to public safety.

She was sentenced to one year jail and \$3,100 fine and fees. All but 20 days jail and \$150 were stayed on court conditions and she was placed on two years supervised probation. She was ordered to work 40 hours with the Sentence to Serve program.
