## Omelet fundraiser

as well as Australia, Japan and Hong Kong.

DeSare, the release continued, is a Sinatra follower in his mid-30's who sings the music of Prince as well as the music of Johnny Mercer. He belongs to a group of neo-traditional upstarts stretching from Harry Connick, Jr. to Michael Buble.

The musician covers old and newer pop and jazz stan-

dards, singing the songs of Billy Joel, Elton John, Bruce Springsteen and the Doobie Brothers, as well as the songs of Rodgers and Hart, and Duke Ellington.

Season passes for the Border Concert series are available at City Drug, County Market and the Backus office in the Falls; Betty's, Fort Frances Museum and Northwoods Gallery and Gifts in Fort Frances; Cloverleaf Store and Emo Drug Store in Emo. The cost is \$50 for adults; \$10 for students; and \$100 for families. Season ticket holders can bring a guest who lives more than 50 miles away for \$10 per show. Single-show tickets will be available at the door.
