DISTRICT COURT

The following people have been sentenced for aggravated misdemeanor or felony crimes in Koochiching County District Court.

Michael L. Keep, 45, Littlefork, was sentenced June 2 for felony theft — take, use, transfer movable property without consent.

He was given a stay of imposition of sentence and placed on five years probation. He was ordered to serve 30 days jail, and given credit for seven days served, and fined \$10,000. All but \$50 of the fine was stayed on court conditions. He was ordered to pay \$2,525 in court fees and restitution, must submit to random searches and serve 40 hours with the Sentence to Serve program.

Alex R. Smith, 33, Devlin, Ontario, was sentenced May 25 for felony terrorist threats — reckless disregard of risk.

He was given a stay of imposition of sentence and placed on five years supervised probation. He was ordered to serve 30 days jail and pay \$500 fine and fees. He was ordered to complete a chemical assessment, submit to random testing and searches, and must serve 40 hours with the Sentence to Serve program.

Aaron E. Davis, 19, International Falls, was sentenced June 2 for felony bring, send, introduce, possess contraband in a prison.

He was given a stay of imposition of sentence and placed on five years probation. He was ordered to pay fine and fees of \$10,275 and serve 50 days jail. All but \$375 of the fine and fees were stayed on court conditions and he was ordered to serve 64 hours with the Sentence to Serve program. He was ordered not to use alcohol or drugs or enter places where it is being used or sold. He

must submit to random testing and searches and may not use or possess firearms or dangerous weapons.

Chas A. Averill, 22, International Falls, was sentenced June 2 for felony third-degree possession of drugs.

He was given a stay of imposition of sentence and placed on five years probation. He was ordered to serve 30 days jail, must follow the recommendation of a chemical assessment, may not use or possess firearms or dangerous weapons and may have no contact with people associated with drugs.

Robert Urban, 53, International Falls, was sentenced June 2 for gross misdemeanor driving while intoxicated and gross misdemeanor driving after cancellation of license — posing a risk to public safety.

On the DWI, he was sentenced to one year jail and \$4,100. All but 60 days jail and \$2,100 of the fine and fees was stayed on court conditions. He was placed on supervised probation for five years and ordered to serve 80 hours with the Sentence to Serve program. He may not use or possess alcohol or drugs and must submit to random testing and searches. He may not enter places where alcohol is being used or sold and must follow the recommendations of a chemical assessment.

On the driving after cancellation, he was sentenced to one year jail and \$500 court fees. All but 30 days of the jail time was stayed on court conditions and he was placed on three years supervised probation. He must serve 40 hours with the Sentence to Serve program. The sentence is to run consecutive to the previous sentence.

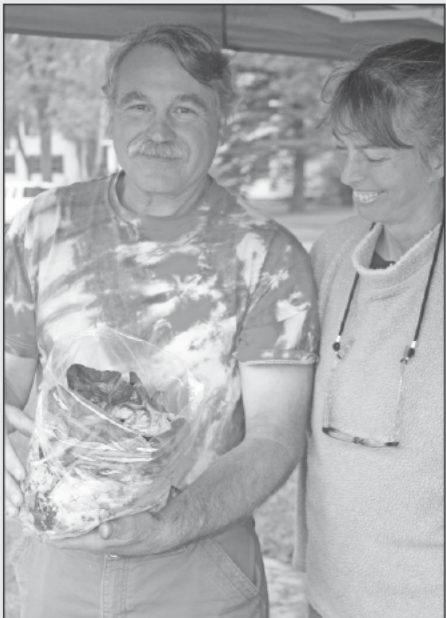


Elizabeth Miller, at left, has brought her breads to the Community Market since it began 8 years ago. Hoa Sobczynski stands to the right.
