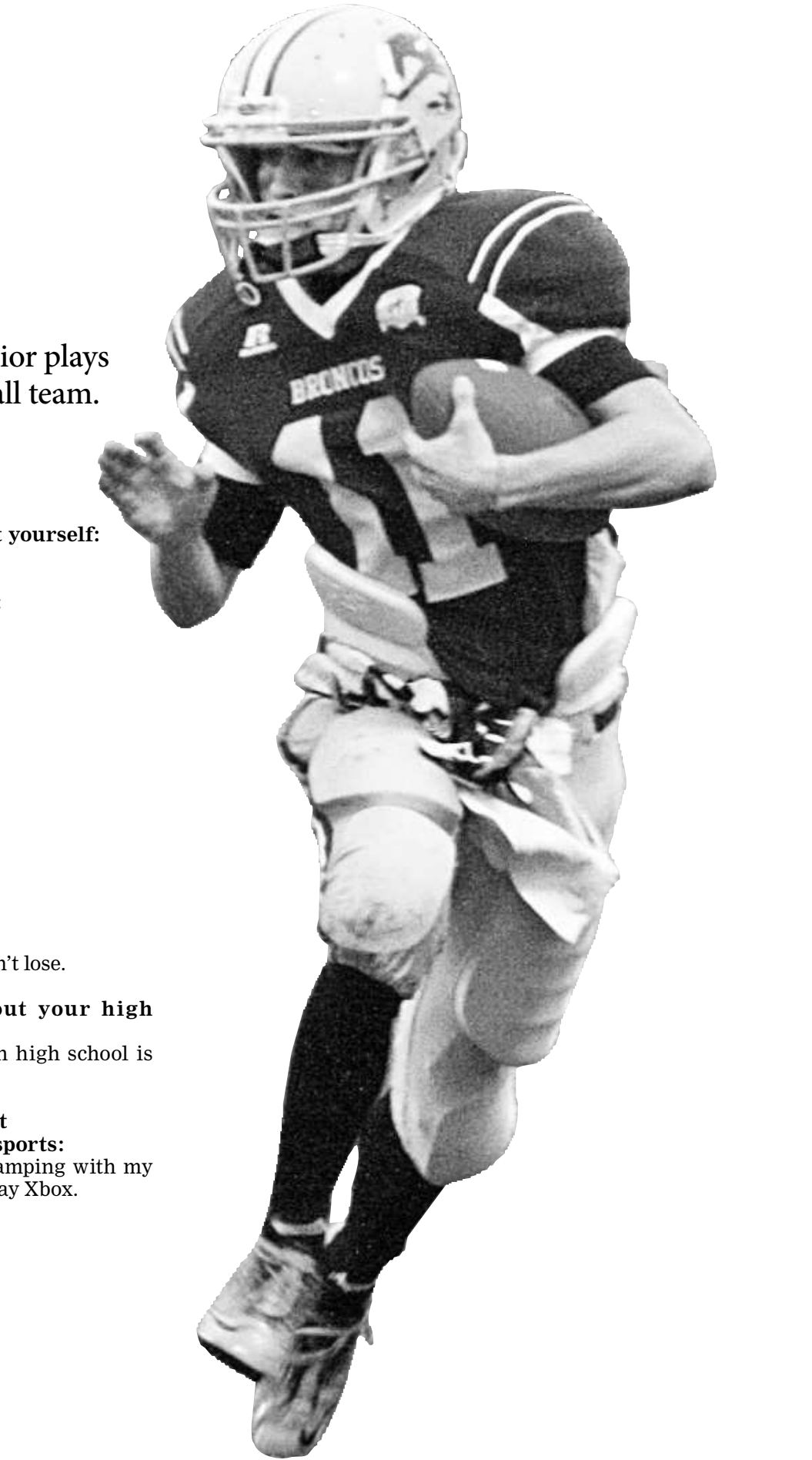

Broncos fall in four to Bluestreaks  
FHS loses final regular-season home match

The International Falls volleyball team closed out its regular season home schedule on a losing note Tuesday night when the Broncos fell in four games to Chisholm, 19-25, 16-25, 25-13, 14-25.

“We came out and just (committed) too many errors,” said Falls head coach Erin Shikowsky. “That seems to be one of our biggest battles we’re fighting this year is our own errors and making too many in a row.”

The Falls trailed by as much as nine points in

game one before taking the lead at 19-18, only to see the Bluestreaks go on a 7-0 run to win.

The Broncos also momentarily led in game two, but then saw a 14-13 advantage turn into a loss after being outscored 12-2.

After breaking a 3-3 tie in game three, the Falls took control en route to winning by 12.

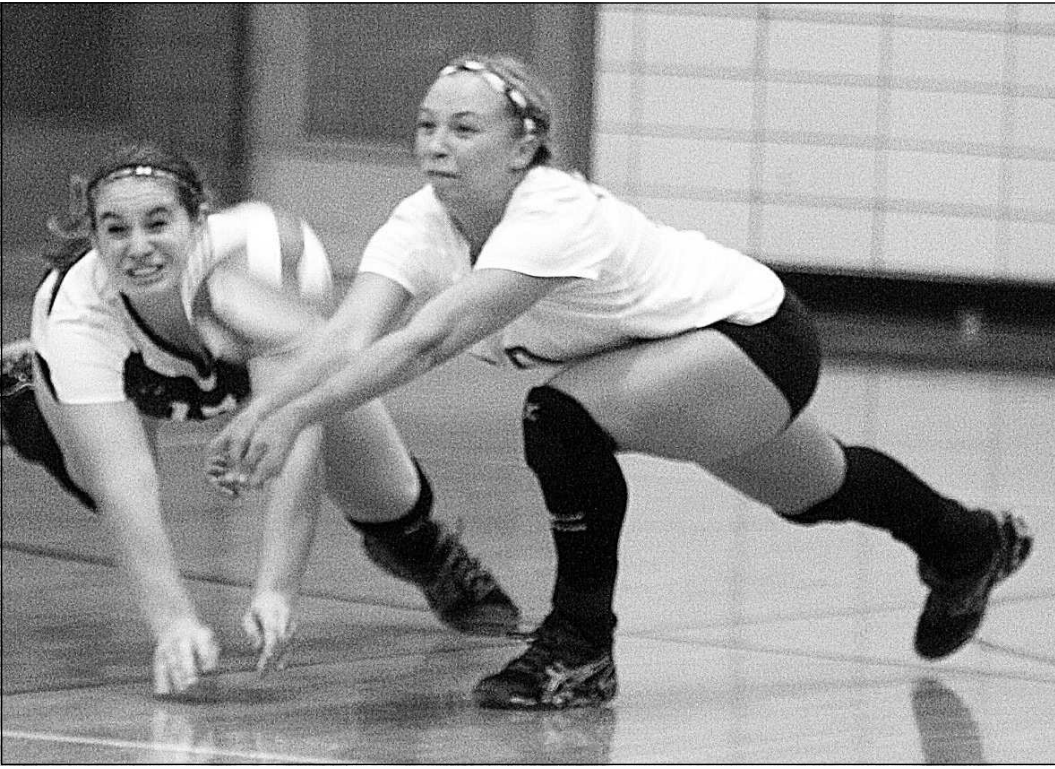
“The biggest difference in that game was we were running our quick offense that we work on in practice daily,” said Shikowsky. “The girls were getting after it and that’s what we needed to do, and it needed to carry over to game four.”

However, Chisholm took the early lead in game four on the way to winning by 11 to clinch the match victory.

Falls’ statistical leaders included: Maddie Filipiak, 11 kills; Tessa Walls, nine kills, four ace blocks, eight digs; Teagan Anderson, 28 set assists, eight digs; and Lauren Rautio, 22 digs.

The Bluestreaks’ statistical leaders included: Cheyenne Dormanen, 19 kills, 14 digs; Holly Starkovich, nine kills, six blocks; Taylor Gregg, 21 set assists, 11 digs; and Toria Marturano, 21 assists, 15 digs.

The Broncos close out the regular season today at a tournament in Esko.
