# Fourth annual film festival set for Thursday

A night out for the entire family is set for Thursday.

The fourth annual On the Edge Family Film Festival begins at 7 p.m. Thursday at the International Falls Public Library. Admission to the event is \$2, along with a donation to the Falls Hunger Coalition.

According to a release, this annual event seeks to stimulate the creative talent of aspiring and professional filmmakers and provide a venue to express their voice through the cinematic arts. Library officials say they also want to inspire and challenge the local community by providing films that enlighten, entertain and educate.

This year features two shorts from local filmmakers including a class project from Littlefork-Big Falls High School and another short film from Rachel Adams.

ters: All We Needed” and “One Man, One Canoe—Two Countries.” The first documents a family of runners and the value sports played in keeping them together. The second chronicles a man seeking identity and adventure as he canoes from Ely to Atikokan, the release said.

The evening will also feature five short films. Two from local residents, "Scary Movie Trailer" created by students in a high school English class, and a college class project called "The Reaper."

Two other student pro-

ductions will also be shown. "The Model Artist" is a stop-motion short film about creating a mannequin. The other, "pAges," is about the bond between brother and sister and how fast time passes.

The last short film accepted into the festival is called "Keeper" and is about a man searching for his brother following a life-changing accident.

The audience will vote for their favorite documentary of the evening and their favorite short film, the release continued. Audience choice films will each be awarded a \$75 prize. Officials encourage the community's support of local filmmakers, and hope the films will inspire people to create their own films.

All films are acceptable for anyone ages 13 and up, although they are not rated. If parents or guardians have questions about whether or not the films would be suitable for their child, contact Diane Adams at 283-8051 for further information.
