This annual event will begin at 7:30 p.m. July 26 under the big tent at the Sorting Gap Marina in conjunction with the Fort Frances Canadian Bass Classic.

A statement said that after the thrilling conclusion of last year’s competition, the Fort Frances Chamber of Commerce is excited to announce this year’s competition will feature a similar format. It will be a two-round competition, with first and second places for each round. The two first place winners will then compete together in one final, exhilarating, battle song.

This year, contestants stand a chance of taking home the grand prize of

Frank Covino to return to Baudette to hold art workshops

Classical academic art professor Frank Covino will make his annual trip to Baudette Aug. 5-9 and Aug. 12-16 to instruct two, week-long seminars at the Lake of the Woods School art room.

A release says the Classical Academic Oil Painting Seminar covers traditional oil painting from the renaissance through the early 20th century. These techniques and materials were used throughout Europe, Great Britain and

North America. A variety of ethnic and cultural traditions used the same methods students will learn during the seminar, according to the release.

Some of the subjects covered are art history, subject matter selection, composition, use of the golden mean, perspective and aerial perspective, value, preparation of the gesso ground and board, use of a grid, charcoal sketching, grayscale and verdaccio underpainting, color mixing and theory, skin tone palettes, ren-

dering a likeness of the subject, lighting, application of various mediums, anatomy, glazing, framing, and preservation of finished work. The majority of students who learn these methods as taught by Covino will continue to use the skills learned to create art throughout their lifetime, the release continued.

Covino lives in Vermont and travels throughout the United States and Canada conducting seminars in the time honored traditional methods of classical academic oil painting. He

has been coming to Baudette since 1995. It is the only seminar he offers in the Midwest.

Workshops are sponsored by the Lake of the Woods Art Guild. Enrollment is open to everyone of all skill levels. Beginners are welcome.




