keep track of what you’ve done and what help you’ve received. So if your child is needing some help to catch up or move ahead this summer, take a look and provide them with some online support.

Summer is a time for relaxing, but don’t forget to set some goals, like reading at least 15 minutes every day. Reading is a great opportunity to learn new things or even just escape. And the reading can be in physical books, e-books, magazines or online.

Has your child been learning a language this past school year? So much of what they learn over the school year can disappear over the summer. Check out Mango language online learning available through our website for some summer refreshers or to pick up a new language like pirate talk or Elizabethan English.

Again, you will need a library card number to access the site and set up your own account to track your language lessons.

Our online resources can also help you with finding a job, a new career or helping you figure out what your aptitudes are. Our website resource page has a link to Career Transitions which provides hands-on guidance and immediate access to key job search activities, including multi-faceted job searching, activities for creating resumes and cover letters, applying and preparing for

interviews.

It will also help in discovering career interests; identifying new opportunities based on work or military experience; exploring growing career paths, including green and new economy jobs; and finding education and training.

Another resource available through our website is Consumer Reports online. It has all the content of the physical magazine and more. This site requires the standard library password.

The library advocates reading to children at least 15 minutes each day. While it is vital for those who can’t read to themselves to be read to for language and early literacy development, it is also a wonderful way to spend time together with our children. Please make time to read to your children at least 15 minutes each day. It is the very best preparation for learning to read.
