## Standard hours return at Crane Lake inspection station

CBP STAFF REPORT

U.S. Customs and Border Protection informs the public that the Inspection Station at Crane Lake will return to standard hours of operation with the end of the summer tourist season.

Effective Sept. 30, the hours of operation for the Inspection Stations at Crane Lake will be as follows:

Crane Lake Station — 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.; seven days a week; 218-993-2321; Sept. 30-May 9, 2015.

Scott's Seaplane Base — 10 a.m.-6 p.m.; seven days a week; 218-993-2321; Sept. 30-May 9, 2015.

The Crane Lake border station is located on Crane Lake adjacent to Voyageurs National Park.

There are no roads into

or out of Canada in this remote wilderness area. All travel into and from Canada is by small boat, canoe, kayak, snowmobile and aircraft.

Applications for the I-68 permit can be made in person at the Crane Lake border station during normal business hours or at the Grand Portage Port of Entry. The I-68 permit allows boaters to enter the United States from Canada for recreational purposes and report their arrival to CBP from a telephone at the earliest opportunity.

The Crane Lake inspection station is operational 365 days a year with reduced hours provided during the winter. Extended summer hours are scheduled to resume May 9, 2015.

## Trick, don't treat, cyber criminals

Kids and kids at heart look forward to the end of October, when we use tricks and treats in equal measure to celebrate Halloween. No doubt, you'll be passing out treats to costumed hobgoblins and hooligans in your neighborhood this Halloween night. But be careful that you're not fooled by a different kind of trickster looking for a larger hand-out — such as your identity.

October also is Crime Prevention Month and National Cyber Security Awareness Month. So it is the perfect time to remind you to safeguard your personal information — whether it's online, on paper, or given out in person.

Don't share your personal information, such as your full name, date of birth, mother's maiden name, and your Social Security number, with anyone unless you are certain

it is safe. Shred paperwork that includes personal information before throwing it out. And never reply to emails claiming to be from Social Security and asking for such information. Finally, don't carry your Social Security card or number with you. These tips should help reduce your risk of identity theft.

Identity theft is one of the fastest-growing crimes in America.
